

Star Lites

AREA FARMERS, who have had a major battle on their hands with the weather during the past month or more will definitely agree that this year's violent weather season was much worse than average, if not definitely the worst one ever for the local area.

If a deciding vote were needed, we should be able to easily get it from the folks at Bovina Feeders, where cleanup operations are still underway from the violent hailstorm and flood which hit the facility back on June 10. Water from the feedlot's lake area is still being pumped out, down barrow ditches and to another playa lake in the area.

Usually by early June the hail and threatening weather has begun to die out, but this year it seems destined to continue into July.

What has caused the siege of worse than usual weather this year?

Some scientists and weather observers are blaming the unusual weather on volcanic ash, from active volcanoes in Mexico and Japan, which have carried tons of ash, as well as smoke, into the earth's atmosphere.

One observer predicted that this single phenomenon was detracting as much as ten per cent of the sun's rays, which was more than enough to affect the weather.

The immediate area isn't the only one which has experienced extreme conditions. Our entire state and nation have been sent reeling by rains which have hit flood-type situations in places.

It has been predicted that the band of volcanic ash, which encircles the globe much like a ring on the planet Saturn, might even affect the growing season, making it shorter due to the lack of sun.

If this should happen, it could prove to be a further calamity to agriculture. In many parts of the country, crops are geared for a growing season of a certain length of time, and any disruption of this cycle could prove disastrous.

In this area, for instance, where such crops as cotton were replanted, the crop needs every break from the weather, including a good hot summer and a late fall, in order to reach its maximum maturity. The same can be said for other "short season" or fill-in crops.

Farmers definitely do not need a growing season shortened by ten per cent, to go along with the calamities they have already suffered.

REP. KENT HANCE, after touring parts of the area this past Monday, said he was optimistic that farmers who have suffered crop losses due to hail can be helped by disaster relief payments, but the program must have the approval of Secretary of Agriculture John Block.

The agriculture secretary, or at least his special task force, was also to tour the area and see the damage. It has been estimated that two million acres of cotton have been adversely affected by violent weather on the South Plains this fall.

"Until a person has seen a Texas hailstorm, he just can't comprehend what it can do," Hance said Monday.

Fireworks Law Cited By Denney

Friena Chief of Police Bill Denney reminded residents that it is against the law to use fireworks within the city limits.

Ordinance number 411 prohibits the use of fireworks in the city, and a citation and conviction can carry a fine of up to \$200, Denney warned.

"The community fireworks display is the best thing for city residents. The police department urges everyone to attend the display, and refrain from using fireworks in the city," Denney said.

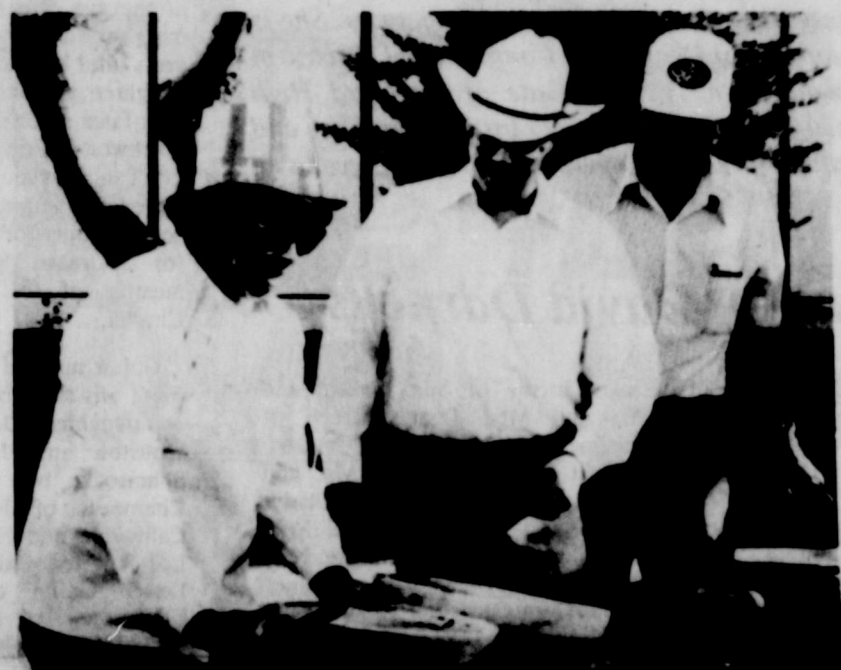
Also announced as a new event, the Friena High School Cheerleaders are sponsoring a "dunk tank" Monday at the Community Center, starting at 11:30 a.m.

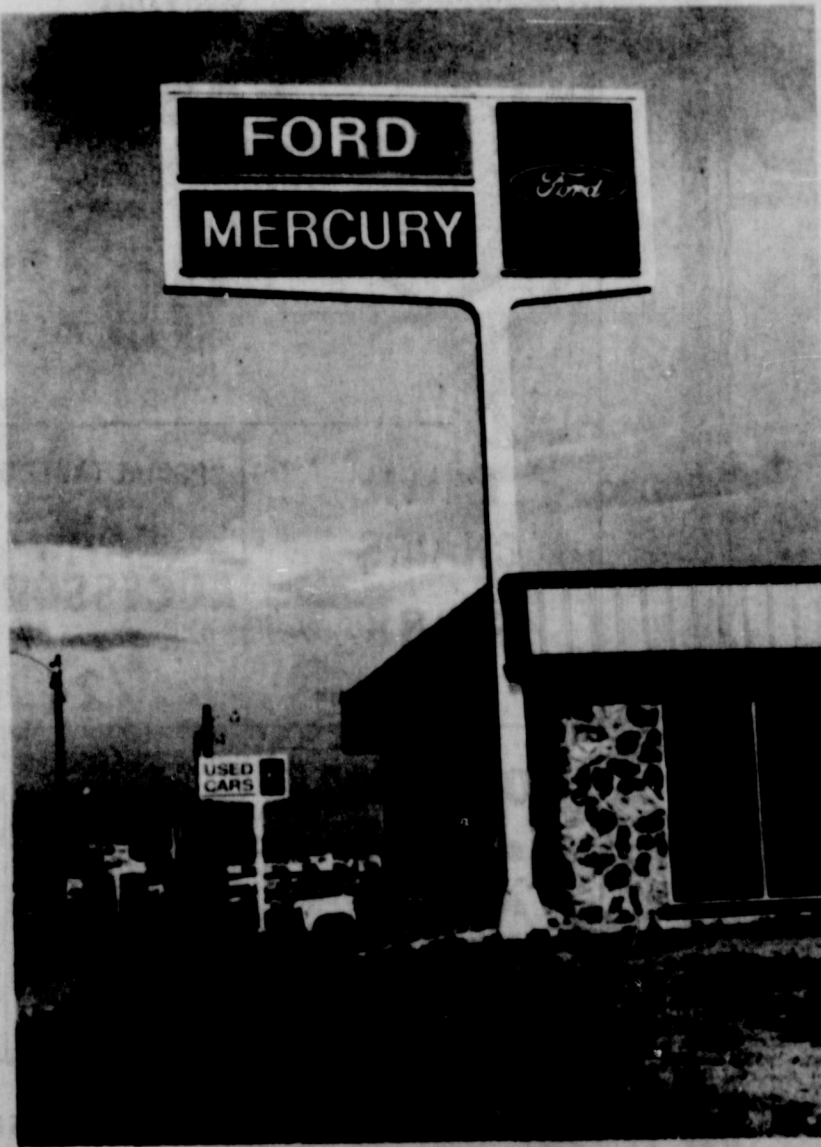
Hance Sets Meeting At Friena Mon.

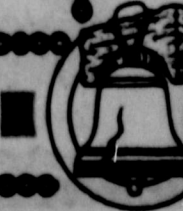

Rites Held For Longtime Area Man

AMENDED NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR WASTE DISPOSAL PERMIT AMENDMENT

CITY OF FRIONA, P.O. Box 595, Friona, Texas 79035 has applied to the Texas Department of Water Resources for an amendment to Permit No. 10089-01 to authorize an increase in the disposal by irrigation of treated domestic sewage effluent from a volume not to exceed an average flow of 210,000 gallons per day to 484,000 gallons per day. The applicant proposes to expand the treatment facilities to meet its projected needs.

The plant site is located approximately 4000 feet east of the city limits of Friona in a northeasterly direction on U.S. Highway 60 and on the south side of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad in Parmer County, Texas. The plant site and irrigated land are located in the drainage area of Frio Draw which flows to Tierra Blanca Creek; thence to the Prairie Dog Town Fork of the Red River in Segment No. 0207 of the Red River Basin. Application rates for the irrigated land shall not exceed 4.7 acre-feet/acre/year. No discharge of pollutants to water in the State is authorized.

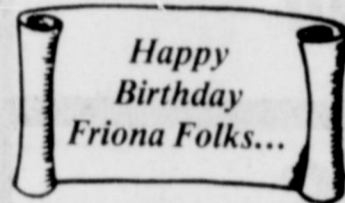
