HATS OFF TO the Friona High School band on a job well done at the band festival at Six Flags Over Texas last weekend.

Friona's band was named "Outstanding Band" in its class during the 13th annual festival, and was one of only two bands in class AA given a First Division rating by the judges.

That's quite a record for the Friona band in contests where it has competed against musical groups from not only across the state but out of state.

In case you have forgotten, on the band's last competition in such an event, the FHS musicians won a similar "Outstanding Band" accolade at the Six Flags Over Mid America festival at St. Louis two years ago.

So, we salute bandmaster Charles Faulkner, assistant Gordon Hart, and all of the talented musicians who make up the Chieftain Band.

We also understand from some of the adult sponsors who accompanied the bandsmen on the trip that the young men and women also rated "Superior" in their conduct while on the trip.

# **Band Sweeps Honors** At Six Flags Fete

The Friona High School band was given a royal welcome home last Sunday evening by over 100 parents, friends and well-wishers, after the band scored an overwhelming success in its participation in the Six Flags Over Texas Band Festival May 14.

The Friona band was named "Outstanding Band" in the class AA division of the festival, with nine bands competing. Only one other band, from Ozark, Arkansas, scored the "Division I" rating that

the FHS band earned. Friona's rating was superior in that it was by unanimous vote of the three judges, Charles Minelli of Ohio University, Frederick Ebbs of Indiana University and Forrest McAlister of "School Musician"

magazine. The performance marked the third consecutive year for the Friona band to score a superior rating in its end-of-school festival appearance.

Last year, the Chieftain Band was named the "Outstanding Sight-Reading Band" at the Greater Southwest Music Festival

In 1974, Friona's band received Outstanding Band honors from the Six Flags Over Mid-America Festival in St. Louis, Missouri.

Band director Charles Faulkner and assistant Gordon Hart were elated over the showing. "I was very pleased with the performance. The band members were extremely well-behaved on the trip, and this made it a more pleasing experience," said Faulkner.



# REMEMBERING... Decoration Day

Most every community had one, though some went out more for it than others. and some called it by other names. Usually held in the month of May, it was a big affair where my grandmother lived and we went almost every year.

The purpose of the special day was to honor the dead. In the small communities there was usually only one church building and most likely the cemetery was located somewhere nearby. Decoration days were on Sundays, but out-of-town folks started arriving late Friday. Saturday would be a work day - hoeing weeds around the graves, mounding up the dirt to the correct shape and resetting the tombstones if they were leaning any. Wooden grave marker got a fresh coat of white paint and flower urns a

good cleaning

The activities started the next morning with a song service for folks who liked to sing or a leisurely stroll through the graveyard for those who wanted to visit with family and friends. "Store-bought" wreaths or cut flowers from home were graves and people would

placed on the fresh-worked stand near their family plot awhile thinking and talking about those who had departed this life. Then they would stroll through the rest of the graveyard to recall others whose names were recorded there. An important thing, particularly for the older people, was to look for new graves, graves put there since last decoration day, to find out if acquaintances were among

Later that morning a sermon was preached, usually by a previous

minister of the church, in vited back for this special event. Just about everyone went up to the church house for the preaching and there were usually so many people that some had to stay outside, listening to the speaker through the open windows.

After the sermon there was dinner on the ground. A table would be set up under a shade tree and each family would bring a dish of something. Everything was spread out and the people would go by the table, filling paper plates to overflowing with things like red beans. fried chicken, mashed potatoes, potato salad, garden vegetables of every kind and fresh cobbler. They would eat wherever they could find a spot. Many brought quilts to spread out on the ground for the youngsters and womenfolk

but most of the men stood



under trees and on the porch of the church to do their

With the meal finished and the spread put away there was a time of more visiting, then the singers assembled once again inside the church. Before the assembly broke up most of the songs in the old hymnals would have been sung or at least at-

a chance to request their favorite hymn and willing, but tired, vocal cords would peal forth the harmony. People would leave late in the afternoon to go to the homes for more conversation and to reflect on the day's happenings. Decoration day was to

### Sales Tax Check Received By City

Comptroller Bob Bullock said Friday his department has collected nearly \$1 million in sales tax judgments in the 16 months since he took office, more than was collected during the previous eight

Bullock said his sales tax division has collected \$993,000 in judgments since January 1, 1975, compared to only \$763,000 collected in the previous eight years since the sales tax was implemented.

"These judgments were against hard-core delinquents who refused to pay until we went into court against them," he said. "They used to be considered uncollectable. Now we're starting to cash them

Also Friday, Bullock mailed checks totaling \$9.1 million to 599 Texas cities and towns, representing their May city sales tax rebates.

Bullock said he has remitted

\$96.5 million so far this year to the 845 cities collecting the one-cent city sales tax.

For the period ending April 30, Bovina received a check for \$1,059.38, which included a prior balance of \$460.73; Friona received a check in the amount of \$3,377.85; and Farwell was credited with \$444.25. Payments totaling less than \$500 are not sent a city until the following payment period.
