## Chiefs Feel Sting; But Shine In Spots

| The Friona Chieftains were disappointed in their season opening football game at Tulia last Friday, when the Hornets stung the Chiefs to the tune of $26-6$. <br> The Hornets, making the most of every opportunity, scored three quick touchdowns in the second quarter, to stun the Chiefs, who finally put together a scoring drive in the final quarter. <br> Mistakes were custly to the rebuilding Chieftains, as they yards. One of the penalties was especially damaging, early in the game, erasing a 16 -yard pass gain that would have given Friona the ball on the Tulia 23 for a first down, when the game was still scoreless. <br> Instead, the 15 -yard stepoff shoved the ball back across midfleld in Friona territory, and three plays later the Chieftains had to punt. <br> On Friona's first possession, Rod Owen had given the Chiefs a first down with a 22 -yard run, and then Chris Barnett passed 34 yards to Kevin Kothmann for a first down at the Tulia 22. But on third down, <br> Nichols 5-43-5.8; Jeff Peak 5-29-5.8: <br> Rod Owen 11-21-1.9: Robert Jackson 215-7.5; Chris Barnett Malouf $2-2-1.0$. Net yards passing: 36 <br> INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING Leslie White, $1-35$ yds: Kevin Jackson, 1-5 yards. | Barnett's pass was picked off by Tulia at their 20, and the Hornets had squelched that early Friona bid. On Tulia's third possession, the Hornets were pushed back to their own nine-yard line following a Friona punt. But the team set out on a 91 -yard scoring drive, that climaxed with a four-yard slash over right tackle. Tulia kicked the PAT, and the score was 7.0 , with 1:07 gone in the second quarter. <br> Three plays gained only eight yards for the Chieftains, who had to again punt the ball. <br> This time the Hornets drove 57 yards, with the big play being a situation, gaining to the Friona 17. <br> Three plays later Tulia had another touchdown, with Kevin Lair going six yards for the score. The kdick was wide, but the Hornets had a $13-0$ lead with eight minutes to go in the half. <br> The next few minutes spelled disaster for the Chiefs. Three plays following the kickoff resulted in a net loss of a yard, and Tulia got the ball at their own 42. <br> Lair took the handoff, burst up the middle, and then outraced the defenders the rest of the way for a 58 -yard scoring strike. After a penalty erased the first PAT kick, Friona blocked the second one, but Tulia had increased their lead to 19-0, and that was the halftime core <br> The third quarter was a standoff, with neither team able to muster a scoring drive. <br> Then the Chiefs took over early in the fourth quarter, and had their moment of glory. <br> Leslie White, who was the team's offensive star, gained 11 yards on an end-around run, his third successful run of the night, to the Tulia 44. <br> It looked like the chance would ance again fizzle, as the team faced fourth and ten from that spot after three straight incomplete passes. <br> But on fourth down, Barnett gave the ball to Kothmann coming around, and he hurled a pass that White snatched although covered by two Tulla defensive men at the Hornet nine-yard line. The team tried a pass for extra points, but it failed.
