the National Safety Council, because ice conditions are always changing For example, four inches of new ice can support more weight than four subjected to the effects of the sun refreezing after thewing, wind, an changing water levels under the ice
Realizing how hard it is to curb the Realizing how hard it is to curb the
natural curiosity in children, Mack suggested that children be mad aware of the dangers of thin ice. He has warning posters available ire

ring or other flotation devic attached to a long rope handy at the pond. A long poole can also be used to
rescue victims of broken ice." Mack rescue victims of broken ice," Mack
said. "If you must go onto the ice to help a drowning person, be sure to use a large board, ladder, pole, or
sheet of plywood to distribute your weight. If none is available, lie prone
on the ice and slide gently.
