


ENERGY HAS BEEN much in the news. during the past couple of
weeks. First, there was the accident. described as the worst commercial
nuclear accident nuclear accident in U.S. history, a
the Three Mile Island power plant near Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. After several days when the
residents residents of that area felt as though
they might be sitting on a time bomb, the critical period passed with a minimum of trouble, and no casualties were recorded.
Energy leaders fear that th accident at the Pennsylvania plant may cause a growth of public
objection to nuclear objection to nuclear power, and
damage the growth of this potential source of energy.
It was pointed out that during the
past five years, utility past five years, utility companies
have cancelled more than 30 contracts for nuclear plants, have postponed plans to build dozens more and brought new orders
reactors nearly to a standstill. And, although the Three Mile Island episode definitely provided
nuclear energy with a bad publicity blast, the safety record for nuclear
energy has been extraordinarily good. In the 20 years since the first
commercial plant was started, not commercial plant was started, not
single death has been recorded as
the result of a nuclear acciden which is an outstanding industria
record. Few other industries match this record.

THE OTHER ITEM which has sparked comment recently was the president's announcement of de-
regulation of crude oil prices, which regulation of crude oil prices, which
is seen by many as the impetus for higher gas prices, which now may approach the $\$ 1.00$ per gallon range which has been the prediction for the last several months.
The trouble with Car is that it did not leave an incentive for the major oil companies to
produce more oil. The companies produce more oil. The companies
could have been forced to plow their excess profits back into a fund for
exploration and production of oil exploration and production of oil.
Instead, it appears that the Instead, it appears that the
Federal Government plans to "skim Federal Government plans to skim
off" the excess profits for their
treasury. In this light, it would appear that our leaders have little
regard for what the price of gas and oil will be to the average consumer.
Most consumers have had a wary Most consumers have had a wary
opinion of the "gas shortage" of recent vintage, expecting that as soon as the price ceiling was lifted,
we would see an end of the shortage we would see an end of the shortage,
such as happened in 1973.74. Well, the major companies have been given "popen season" on the
consumers, so we will know very consumers, so we will kn
shortly what they will do.
