Eighth Grade Event Slated On Thursday

THE TEXAS OFFICE of Traffic Safety shares the following, which provides thought-provoking ideas concerning driving and its history:

What's the worst polluter--the horse or the automobile?

Well, cars certainly use far more of our energy resources, and our eyes water every time we drive into some of that Houston or L.A. smog...but things weren't so hot in the good old days, either. Get a load of this:

Before the auto and truck, horses provided the main means of street transport. In the 1880's booming New York City had an estimated one million nags on its streets. All of this horsepower produced 30,000 tons a day of what a modern bureaucrat would call "negative environmental impact." It took a small army of street cleaners just to stay even; and often they didn't. There were even multi-story stables back then, just like parking garages...

CONSUMER TIP? A used car can often be a better buy than a new one, says a major U.S. transportation company. Hertz Corp. reports that it compared new and used cars driven 10,000 miles a year for three years and found that the used cars cost drivers just half as much to keep on the road. The used car expenses averaged 17.3 cents a mile; the new cars averaged 30.1 cents. The survey included all relevant costs--depreciation, fuel, insurance, maintenance and repairs.

HERE'S SOME grim clockwork: Last year motorists drove over a hundred billion miles in Texas...and there was a traffic accident every 63 seconds. Someone is injured in a Texas highway accident every three minutes and fifteen seconds. And every two hours and twenty minutes someone is killed.

L.M. Boyd reported this one: Just 84 years ago there were only two cars in the whole state of Ohio. They ran into each other.

LOUIS B. STRONG, president of the Kentucky Association of Electric Cooperatives, has some interesting comments concerning gasoline rationing:

"Those of us who lived and drove cars during World War II remember gasoline rationing very well. According to polls I have seen, the majority of Americans think gasoline rationing might be a good way to help relieve our oil supply problem. I personally cannot work up much enthusiasm for gasoline rationing for the following reasons:

1. During World War II we had about 24 million automobiles. Today we have over 100 million. Also, by the end of the War, with only 24 million cars, the black markets were beginning to destroy the system.

2. During World War II, we had great popular support for everything related to the War effort. Today the majority of Americans don't believe we have an oil problem and blame either the oil companies or the government for what is happening to gasoline prices. So when the inequities, unfairness, and the bureaucracy required to run the system became evident, I think the great majority of Americans would soon become disillusioned with the process.

3. I can't quite envision the size and cost of the bureaucracy required to run it, nor can I envision how all the differing circumstances affecting the need for gasoline can be made to fit fairly into any system.

Life is what happens to us while we are making other plans.

50 YEARS AGO—MAY 23, 1929

The roofers and metal workers were here the greater part of this week putting the roof and metal ceiling on the new Turner-Parr building on Main Street. At the present rate, the building will soon be ready for occupancy. So far, it is only conjecture as to what line of business will occupy the building.

40 YEARS AGO—MAY 26, 1939
 E.W. Boedecker, principal of Friona High School, announces that the coveted Reader's Digest Award for scholastic achievement has been won by the valedictorian of the class of 1939, Martin Todd.

Leaders Seek Aid For Facility

Mayor B.K. Buske and City Manager A.L. Outland attended a five hour briefing in Lubbock, Tuesday, May 15, in relation to the possibilities of seeking federal funds to build a new wastewater plant for the City of Friona.

The intent is to comply with federal wastewater disposal standards and provide a facility that will service the growth of Friona in years to come. Should the plan be approved, the federal funds will be provided in the amount of seventy-five per cent of the cost with the city providing the

remaining twenty-five per cent of the cost.

Parkhill, Smith & Cooper, Inc., Consulting Engineers, Lubbock, the Engineer Representative, Clayton Yeager, was also in attendance at the briefing. The cost of the project is envisioned in the approximate amount of \$300,000.00. The type facility planned is an oval shaped aeration-clarification unit, similar to

those presently in use at Dimmitt and Muleshoe.

The application for federal funds consideration has been in process since December, 1975, and it is expected to take at least two years before construction will begin after the step 1 application is approved. The city's present wastewater facility was constructed in 1959 and has served the community well for the past twenty years.

C.H. Murphy Receives His Doctoral Degree

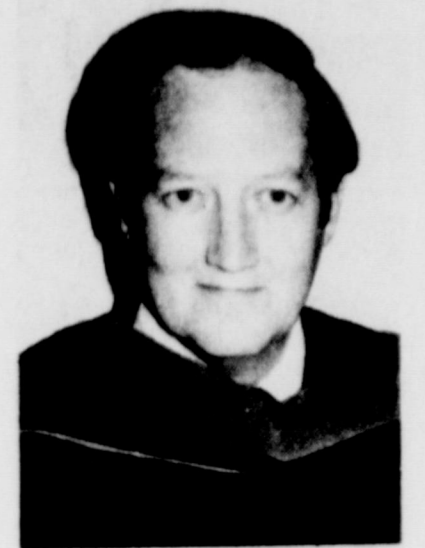
