Tax Board **Compromises** On Bovina

The Parmer County Tax Appraisal Board, meeting in Farwell this past Monday, voted after considerable discussion to locate the newly-created county office in Bovina.

A motion was passed to locate the office in Bovina, provided a location can be found which will be acceptable to the board.

The action followed a lengthy discussion as to where the new office could best serve the majority of the residents of Parmer County.

Previously, an offer had been made through County Commissioner Archie Tarter from an anonymous donor, who would have paid \$50,000 to build the appraisal office, if it were located in Farwell.

But there were some objections to this offer, one of which being the anonymity of the donor.

"This left some of the board members a little cold. We felt that before we could accept such a donation we would need to know who was putting up the money," said board chairman David Grimsley.

Two of the members of the board campaigned to get the new office built in Friona, and two favored Farwell. The lone board member from the Bovina area, Lawrence Jamerson, held out for his home town, and in the end was successful as the Bovina site became a compromise.

Judge Porter Roberts stated that Commissioner Tarter had called him stating that the mysterious donor had "officially withdrawn" the offer to build the tax office.



Area Gets Nice Rain

The Friona area received more good rain during the past week, during which time the temperatures have also been well below the average for this season of the year.


A total of 1.55 was logged Wednesday afternoon and night and most of this fell in the form of slowfalling rain. When the moisture first began to fall shortly after noon Wednesday, there was a smattering of small hail, but not enough to cause any damage.

Another .20 inch was logged in Friona late Thursday afternoon and evening, for a total for the week of 1.75, and brought the total for the month of May to 3.36 inches, with the

month just past the half-way mark. The rains of the past week were considerably more general in nature than those of the preceding week, with virtually every nook and cranny of the area getting a good soaking rain. Lakes in the area were showing the results of the moisture, which will benefit the young crops, and provide planting moisture for cotton, sunflowers, etc.


10 YEARS AGO -- APRIL 30, 1970

Democrats Name Four To State Convention without raising taxes; (2) Urged Four delegates and four alternates

were elected to the state Democratic convention by the Parmer County Democratic Convention meeting in Bovina on Saturday, May 10.

H.H. Horton, Jr. was elected permanent chairman of the convention, and Donna Roming was elected secretary.

Those named as delegates to the state convention were James P. Fortenberry, Richard Collard, Movelda Fortenberry and Janette Collard. They will go to the convention as "uncommitted"

Named as alternates were B.K. Buske, Ken Horn, Gay Horn and Lucinda Burnam, who also will be uncommitted.

The state Democratic convention will be held June 20-21 in San Antonio.

The convention also adopted six resolutions, which will be placed before the state convention. The resolutions:

(1) Urged the government to work toward a zero balanced budget support of an all-male draft for the country's adequate defense.

(3) Support for a one per cent additional sales tax for education to offset the majority of ad valorem taxes; (4) Urged the state and national Democratic party to adhere to the Democratic platform as it concerns parity, noting that farm prices have fallen and the president has not lived up to his campaign promises of 1976.

(5) Urged the Texas legislature to pass legislation to permit silent prayer in the public schools, and (6) Urged that the Democratic primaries elect official presidential delegates, rather than having a non-binding presidential vote.

A good crowd attended the convention, amounting to 72 per cent of the officially elected delegates. This compared to the rather small figure of 43 per cent of the voter turnout on June 3, chairman Horton pointed out.

Friona and Bovina had 100 per cent of their elected delegates present.

Mrs. Truitt Ending Teaching Career

The final day of the 1979-80 school term, which will be Friday, May 23, will mark the end of the teaching career of one of Friona High School's long time English teachers.

Carmaleet Tims began her teaching career in Friona High School in the fall of 1938. At that time W.L. (Preach) Edelmon was the Superintendent of Schools.

Miss Tims had graduated from Goodnight High School in Armstrong County in 1935 and then completed requirements for a Bachelor of Arts degree with majors in History and English from West Texas State Teachers College, Canyon, in the spring of 1938.

In the fall of the following year, Miss Tims returned to Friona to teach and was married December 26, 1939. to Frank Truitt, who had grown up

She remembers that as she was preparing for her wedding, one of the things she had to do was to secure permission from the board of trustees. She and Superintendent Edelmon attended the board meeting and when he stated the purpose for their presence, the only reply she remembers was that of Lonnie McFarland, who now lives in Burnet, Texas.

Mrs. Truitt has always been active in extra-curricular activities. She has served as sponsor for a number of classes, Future Teachers of America, Student-Faculty Congress, National Honor Society and the ready writing portion of University Interscholastic

Some of her students always stayed in the competition until they reached regional finals, but her son, Larry, was the only student she ever took to the state contest. He brought home a second place medal from Austin in

Regarding the time she spent sponsoring various activities, she reported, "For many years I was very busy with sponsorship duties, from which I derived a lot of pleasure. I realize now that without the encouragement, support, assistance and cooperation of my family, I never could have done all these things.'

Mrs. Truitt remembers that during her first year of teaching she had three girls physical education classes and two freshman English classes and that her salary was \$71.25 per month.

Since that time she has taught high school English on all levels and for several years taught only junior and senior English classes. The only time she ever taught history was during World War II. This year she has four junior classes and one freshman class.

When asked about contrasts between the "then" and "now", she replied:

"Making comparisions in changes I have seen is real difficult. There has been so much change in every area of living during the time I've been teaching that I hardly know where to begin.

Then, she added, "The four things which bring me the most satisfaction as I look back are (1) being able to see that I have been able to instruct many students; (2) being fortunate enough to sponsor organizations in which I was interested and enjoyed; (3) the letters, phone calls and words of appreciation I receive from exstudents; and (4) having the friendship and cooperation of administrators, fellow-teachers and

co-workers during the years." Closing the interview in this area, Mrs. Truitt said, "I still think classroom teaching is the very best profession a working mother could have. Apparently it must have been 'my thing' as the students would say. I decided very early in life that it was the profession for me and have never regretted that decision.

Carmaleet and Frank do not have any elaborate plans for retirement. Frank has had some health problems which caused him to retire earlier than he had planned. He was a long time employee of Bi-Wize Drug.

Their son, Larry, and his wife, the former Shirley White, who also grew up in Friona, live near Houston. They are both teaching on the high school level. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ray White.

He teaches government and economics at the Northbrook High School, which is a part of the Spring Branch School System and she teaches Biology at Klein High School.

When asked about the origin of her unusual given name, Mrs. Truitt replied, "I'm the third one in my Daddy's family. Both the others were Mary Carmaleet, but I didn't get the first name.'


Her mother, Mrs. Maggie Tims, a long time resident of Claude, Texas, now lives in Friona. She has one brother, Henry C. Tims, who lives in Calgary, Alberta, Canada; and one sister, Mrs. Richard Larsen, who lives in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

"This year has been both good and bad." she said. The bad part of it has been Frank's illness, which resulted in complications and my absence from school. The good part has been the support of fellow teachers and administrators.'

Her parting remark was: "Regarding my retirement at this time, the decision was made because of time, Frank's health and retirement and my feeling of lack of accomplishment."
