AT THIS STAGE in the presidential campaign, the average voter seems to be disenchanted with not only President Carter, but with all of the candidates for the nation's number one office.

It may be a sign of our times, and no cure for the problem is readily evident.

"We just don't have any candidates. They're all about the same," says Lula White, who no doubt speaks for a large cross-section of voters this election year.

Even though the supporters of Ronald Reagan promise at least a change from the status quo, there are many who doubt that anyone can change things up to any great degree.

"A president's just a showpiece. They could put you and me up there in Washington and there won't be any difference. The ones who control the country are Congress, the Supreme Court and Labor unions," a retired North Carolina farmer was quoted as saying this week.

We have felt for some time that the labor unions are the ones who are responsible for the majority of the problems in our country--for runaway inflation; for strikes which cripple every type of industry and even the teaching profession; and in particular the automotive industry.

Unions had a useful purpose when they were first created, and there may be a few cases where they still are doing the job for which they were created. But in most instances, these labor organizations have turned out to be a major problem, and not a solution to a problem.

President Carter is in trouble with the farmers, for the most part. "I voted for him in 1976 because he was a farmer, and I thought he would be sympathetic to the farm situation. Then, the first thing you know, he slapped an embargo on our grain. Our expenses are 'way up, and profits are down," says a typical farmer.

"Reagan is too old; Carter is too inept, and Anderson probably doesn't have a chance. All of them are promising us the moon, and if they get in they won't give us the time of day," one voter was heard to say.

None of the candidates have captured the imagination of the voters this year.

Many voters feel that the choice this fall will mainly be "choosing the lesser of three evils," and as a result, may not vote at all.

This is especially true among the young (student) voters, who are even more disinterested in the 1980 presidential election than the older blocks of voters.

There are only about five weeks remaining until the general election will be upon us. Unless something happens in the very near future, to excite the voters, a new "low" may be established in terms of percentage of qualified voters casting their ballots.

FROM THIS VIEWPOINT, it appears that the proposed school bond issue is a very necessary thing.

The Friona school board has labored with the problem of improving the facilities in the lower grades for some time. You finally reach a stage when something has to be done.

It's just like any property or similar investment: if you don't make improvements as they are needed, sooner or later your property is next to worthless, and you'll have to start over from scratch.

Our school officials have never been extravagant. Besides, our youngsters deserve the best possible facilities for their education.

We urge you to vote "yes" on Tuesday's proposition.

IF YOU WONDER if you are officially registered to vote, better check up and make sure. Deadline for registering to vote in the Nov. 3 general election is this next week--October 3.

School Bond Vote Tuesday, Sept. 30

The \$1.4 million bond issue for school improvements will be held for voters in the Friona Independent School District next Tuesday, September 30.

The election will be held from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Friona Fire Station. It will be helpful if voters will bring their voter registration certificates, according to election officials. It is not necessary to have your certificate to vote, but would speed things along.

OPEN HOUSE SCHEDULED

An open house at the Friona Elementary and Junior High campus will be held from 2-4:30 p.m. Sunday, September 28 so that voters may inspect the facilities in which improvements have been proposed.

"We would urge all residents to come and inspect the buildings, see for themselves, and make up their own minds as to whether or not the improvements are needed," says Superintendent of Schools Tom Jarboe.

Jarboe says the proposed remodeling project has been discussed by various school boards for the past seven years, but due to

rising costs, etc., the needed improvements have been put off.

"Now, it has come to the point where the board feels this work MUST be done," Jarboe says.

Some of the proposals are termed vital, such as the new wiring in the junior high building, which was constructed in 1931.

"When this building was built, there were no such things as overhead projectors, and other equipment which draw off electricity," Jarboe points out.

In addition to re-wiring, it is planned to drop the ceilings in the junior high building, install improved and more energy-efficient lights, and completely re-insulate the building.

The windows at the junior high also will be changed out. "We cannot get windows or replacement parts for the old type windows, so we plan to change out the windows entirely," Jarboe said.

The building's steam heating system will be improved, although the boiler, installed when the building was first built, will continue to be used.

"They tell us that this boiler is still superior to any we could buy, and have recommended that we continue to use the boiler as long as possible. It is completely safe. It has been

City Gains From Census Re-Count

Friona's revised census totals have been received by Friona's city officials, and although the total still is lower than some expected, the re-count procedure was able to add some to the city's tally.

The new figure is 3,813; a gain of 132 from the total which was released in preliminary figures this summer. At that time, the census figure was 3,681. Mayor B.K. Buske protested at that time, asking for a re-check of some areas of the city.

Many feel that the city has 4,000 residents, and it well could have if all were counted, such as illegal aliens. Also, a few residences are located outside the city limits, which robs the city of numbers it rightfully should have.

None-the-less, the adjusted figure, which will probably be the final one

for 1980, represents an increase of 22.9 per cent over the 1970 total of 3,111, and is a gain of 87.3 per cent in 20 years from the 1960 total of 2,035.

The city's population in 1950 was 1,202, which indicates a steady growth pattern during the past 30 years.

In fact, Friona has never shown a decline in population, since it was listed in 1930 with 731 persons. The total in 1940 was 803. The city has grown 374.8 per cent since 1940.

The county's revised population figure has not been announced, but the City of Bovina's new figure came to 1,521, which was a gain of 77 from the preliminary figure. Bovina City Manager Tommy Bonds said he still believed Bovina had 1,700 people. "But I don't know how you get them all counted," Bonds said.

New Car Show September 29-30

The showing of the 1981 model automobiles by Friona's two auto dealers will be held on Monday and Tuesday, September 29 and 30 at the Community Center-Showbarn.

The special show will be held from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on each of the two days.

This year's showdates came about as a compromise between the national showing time for Chevrolets and Oldsmobiles, which was September 25, and the Fords, which is October 4.

Some changes in styles on the new models are promised by local dealers for Fords, Chevrolets and Oldsmobiles.

According to Roger Wilcox of Friona Ford Sales, Inc., the newest car from Ford will be the Escort, which the Ford company has built to compete with foreign-made compact cars.

"Escort will have higher mileage ratings than many of the less-roomy sub-compacts. If you are thinking about a small car, it would pay you to investigate the Escort," Wilcox says.

The Ford Granada also has been designed as a more trim size.

"We have a lot of changes for 1981, and we invite everyone to come out Monday and Tuesday and see for themselves," Wilcox adds.

The 1981 Chevrolets and Oldsmobiles also have some economy

features, and Glenn Reeve thinks they both offer some of the best automobiles yet to come out of Detroit.

"Today, more than ever, America is looking for quality in the cars it buys. That's why we think you're going to like the 1981 Oldsmobiles," Reeve says.

On the Chevrolet side, the company is boasting Citation, first introduced in 1980, and already the best-selling new model Chevrolet has ever introduced. "It works as a mid-size car and has room for five," Reeve says.

Area Gets Cool Front

The Friona area experienced a "touch" of fall weather this week, as a cold front held the temperatures, which had been up to 94 earlier in the week, to a high of only 65 degrees on Thursday.

Friona also was getting a "mountain shower" type of rain Friday, which had measured .45 inch by 1 p.m.

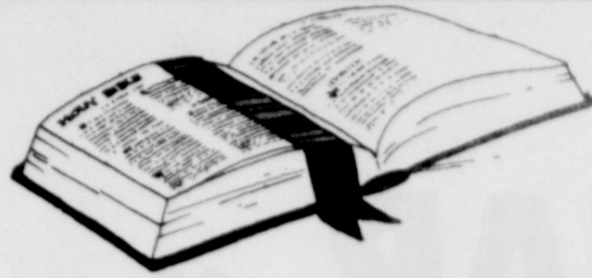
This latest measurement brought the month's total to 2.37 inches. A slow drizzle was still falling at noon on Friday.

Ministerially Speaking....

3 Principles To Live By

- "Know thyself"--Socrates
- "Control thyself"--Marcus Aurelius
- "Give thyself"--Jesus

The above three statements have been called the three greatest maxims in the world. One came from Greece, one from Rome, one from Palestine. Because they are brief we should not be deceived into thinking they are easy. On the contrary, some of life's greatest demands and most significant achievements are condensed into these three statements.

No one ever mastered them completely, no one ever achieved them in a hurry. These six words summarize a life time of goals.

1. "Know thyself." Socrates is recognized as one of the wisest men who ever lived. His thought laid the foundation of western culture. According to Encyclopedia Britannica he is best known for the two words that expressed his admonition to all mankind. Socrates said, "The unexamined life is not worth living." It's good advice, but difficult to follow.

Some of the world's greatest classics of literature and religion were

created by people who were making an honest effort to know themselves. Augustine's "Confessions," Pascal's "Thoughts," John Wesley's "Journal." All of these were honest and sincere attempts by wise and sincere men to understand and know themselves.

It takes real courage to know oneself. There are some parts of ourselves we'd rather not know. There are some parts we would like to pretend are not there. But to know oneself means we must face our weaknesses as well as our strengths, our sins as well as our virtues. Jesus asked, "Why do you see the speck in your brother's eye and not the log in your own eye?"

2. "Control thyself." Marcus Aurelius believed in a resolute determination to control one's thoughts and actions as the key to a meaningful life. The Biblical counsel is found in the book of Proverbs. "He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city." (Proverbs 16:32)

We are specially conscious of the value of self control when we see its absence. A failure to control one's appetites, or emotions, or one's temper, may result in some most unfortunate situations.

If you have trouble with self-control, take heart, you are in good company. Dwight L. Moody, a great American religious leader, said, "I have had more trouble with myself than any man I know." Even the apostle Paul wrote "I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do." (Romans 7:18, 19)

Discipline is not a popular word in our day--we stress such words as freedom. But it is through discipline we gain freedom.

3. "Give thyself." Self knowledge and self control as good as they are, are not enough if we are thinking in terms of Biblical religion. Here we must move to the third maxim--"Give thyself."

There is no mistaking this emphasis in the teaching of Jesus. "He that would save his life must lose it, but he that would lose his life for My sake and the gospels will save it."

A person can have all sorts of self insight and a high degree of self control and still be self centered and selfish. It is when we move from self-knowledge, to self-control, to self-giving that we begin to deal with the demands of the gospel.

We live in a culture that puts a major emphasis on receiving, securing, getting. When we move to the Biblical faith the major emphasis is not on getting but on giving. While this makes great demands, it also offers great rewards. Just as self-control leads to freedom, so self-giving leads to fulfillment.

From the pages of history, from the thoughts of great minds come these simple statements. They survive the generations because they contain an eternal truth.

"Know thyself"
"Control thyself"
"Give thyself"

No one has ever attained them perfectly or completely. But every one has realized them, at least in part. We all are capable of realizing them more and more each year.

We have this assurance: in knowing ourselves we become wiser. In controlling ourselves we become both stronger and freer. In giving ourselves we are following One who is the Way and the Truth and the Life.

50 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 29, 1930

It is reported on good authority that the Friona Motor Co., which is the local Ford agency, has relinquished its lease on the Parr building and will retire from business in Friona. W.F. Hays, proprietor of the company, also owns the Farwell Motor Co., and says that the volume of business does not justify the expense of operating two houses. His Farwell plant was the first established, and he will continue the business there.

From the time I read of this proposed long and romantic vacation trip I had felt a kind of misgiving regarding it and inwardly hoped they would not undertake it. 40 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 30, 1940

Friona lost to the Amarillo Blues in a game there last Sunday, 15-10. Big Price Brookfield was badly off form, due to playing in a tournament at Amarillo for Canyon last week. 35 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 24, 1945

30 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 24, 1950

Mrs. Steve Struve is recuperating in Parmer County Community Hospital from a rattlesnake bite inflicted Tuesday afternoon at the Struve home northeast of Friona. Mrs. Struve, Mrs. F.N. Welch and Mrs. Nelson Welch had been gathering cucumbers from the field when the

snake bite occurred. She was bitten on the little finger, and had the presence of mind to apply a tourniquet at once.

25 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 26, 1955

Construction of the new Parmer County Community Hospital building is at last an actuality, with foundations for the 50 feet by 248 feet brick and tile structure being staked out Monday morning, on the plot of ground north of the present hospital. Official ground breaking is scheduled to be held sometime during the upcoming Parmer County Fair.

20 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 25, 1960

Team tri-captains were elected this week by the Friona Chieftain footballers, who began their second week of two practice sessions per day. Captains for the 1960 team will be Tommy Massey, Butch Barker and Jerry Rankin. So far, a total of 26 boys have been retained on the A squad, and according to Coach Earl Smith, the boys are coming along fine for this early in the season.

15 YEARS AGO--AUGUST 26, 1965

Law enforcement officers were searching for suspects this week after the Pak-A-Sak 7-11 grocery store was robbed late Sunday night of around \$1800 in cash. A bandit armed with a pistol accosted owner Jack Roubinek as he was sacking up his weekend receipts and preparing to leave the store, making off with the money, which was all bills.

Announcement was made this week of the opening of Friona Veterinary Clinic this coming Monday, August 31. Dr. E.E. Kraus, Clovis veterinarian, is owner of the new clinic.

In fact, making 185 total yards against the Eagles was no small potatoes, since that team has the top defensive record on the South Plains for class AA teams, and is yielding only 149 yards per game in three outings.

Hubbard also praised the work of Trent Johnson on defense.

Hubbard said the team's attitude had remained good, despite the loss. "You would expect them to be 'down' after getting beat 55-6, but after we showed them the film, and pointed out our mistakes, we went out and had one of the best workouts we have had all season," Hubbard said.

Hubbard also praised the work and attitude of the "scout team," which spends the week running the plays expected of that week's opponents.

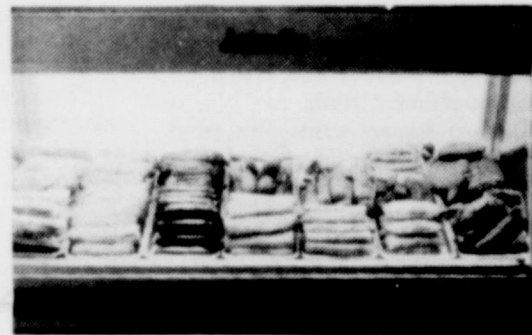
