Eighth Grade Honors Are Told

THE ATTEMPT to assassinate Pope John Paul is another indication of the terrorism which is threatening the future of our very civilization.

Terrorism has always been with us, at least on a small scale, but the events of the past week would indicate that it is an international problem, and is global in scope.

The turmoil in Northern Ireland in recent years is but another example of what can happen to a country when terrorists are able to gain a foothold.

By a strange twist of fate, the cover article in the current issue of the **Reader's Digest** deals with international terrorism. Now, police officials in Rome, and observers a half a world away try to decide if the attack last week on Pope John Paul was an individual act, or another part of the international terrorism.

Foreign correspondent Claire Sterling, in her **Digest** article, claims that such groups as the Irish Republican Army (IRA) and the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO) get their support from Communist Russia, and that their activities are sponsored to "devise a global revolutionary strategy to counter the global strategy of American imperialism."

In the early 1970s, most of the world's terrorism was occurring in the Middle East. First, the terrorists' goal was to destroy peace; later it was to resist attempts to restore peace.

The official U.S. reaction to the idea that international terrorists are backed and financed by Russia has been to soft-pedal that idea, or to deny it completely, as late as the Carter administration.

Recently, however, Secretary of State Alexander Haig was quoted as acknowledging the existence of the network, charging the Soviet Union with "seeking to foster, support and expand international terrorism through training, funding and equipping those who kill for political purposes."

In the Mid-East, the main terrorist activity has been hijacking of airplanes, several of which were exploded before a worldwide television audience. The taking of diplomatic hostages was the next step for the terrorists.

Mrs. Sterling claims that training camps for terrorists have been operated in Cuba, Africa, North Korea and in several Arab states.

Among those who trained in the terrorist camps were Iranians, who came by the thousands, she says, gaining experience for the Islamic Revolution.

Individuals who are trained by the terrorists become hired killers, with absolutely no regard for human life, it is pointed out.

They carry out their duties with religious zeal. They all become neo-Nazi, or communist in their thinking. Their "ends" justifies their "means." And if they are killed in their particular assignment, then so be it.

It is hard for the average American to conceive of this type of terrorism, but it's there. We have experienced it to some extent in our country, but nothing like the unsettled areas have.

Something must be done to curb the growth of this international terrorism. But it would be tough to fight. It is not the usual type of enemy, and not bound by geography nor region.

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

....from the files of The Friona Star

50 YEARS AGO--MAY 29, 1931

In a reply to the city's request for additional crossing, the Santa Fe Railway stated that it was their option that the city did not need the additional crossing, and that the state law forbids crossings where there were three lines of track. Santa Fe was written in an effort to relieve some of the congestion that develops at harvest time, with lines of trucks.

45 YEARS AGO--MAY 19, 1936

During the past nine days, beginning on Monday, May 18, it has rained at Friona and some part of the surrounding territory each day with the exception of Tuesday, when it rained sometime during the night. At this writing, an estimated ten and one-half inches have fallen at Friona during this period, most of which has fallen in gentle showers, allowing practically all of it to be absorbed by the soil.

40 YEARS AGO--MAY 23, 1941

The Friona High School annual, "The Totem Pole," arrived Friday of last week. It was a very attractive volume, and meets the approval of the student body. It was sponsored by Superintendent W.L. Edelman and Mrs. Toone. The book was dedicated to the late Prof. Woodrow Toone, who was for several terms a member of the high school faculty.

35 YEARS AGO--MAY 31, 1946

In connection with our proposed sewer system, the City Commission has approved a plan whereby we will be able to finance the cost of this system without having to raise the tax rate more than 30 cents on the \$100 valuation, Mayor Glenn E. Reeve said this week. A bond issue of \$82,000 will be voted on; this being the engineer's estimate of the cost of the system.

30 YEARS AGO--MAY 24, 1951

Is there any truth to the claims made by those who say they can increase rainfall, temper hail and electrical storms, and even withhold precipitation and still keep skies cloudy?

The Amarillo Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring a talk by a representative of "Water Resources Development Corporation" on Saturday, to discuss the possibilities of controlling the weather. All farmers and ranchers are invited.

25 YEARS AGO--MAY 24, 1956

The Black Community of northeastern Parmer County, in its first attempt to win the annual community improvement contest sponsored by Farmer-Stockman Magazine in cooperation with the Extension Service, this week placed second in the state. McMahan in Caldwell County, was named state winner. There were 185 rural communities in Texas which competed for the prizes given by the farm magazine.

20 YEARS AGO--MAY 24, 1961

A burglar broke into the office of Friona Consumers sometime during the night Saturday and made off with \$200 in cash. Entrance to the building was made by breaking the glass to a south door and unlocking the night latch.

15 YEARS AGO--MAY 19, 1966

Continuation of the service of the High Plains bookmobile was assured in recent weeks, when the four counties involved gave their official okay to the program. Commissioners and judges from Parmer, Bailey, Lamb and Cochran counties met at Muleshoe and agreed to underwrite the \$14,000 annual budget for the mobile library. The cost is to be prorated according to population in each county.

10 YEARS AGO--MAY 27, 1971

Arriving in Farwell on August 1 to begin duties as Parmer County Home Demonstration Agent will be Miss

Jana Pronger who was in Farwell Monday of this week to meet with the Commissioners Court concerning the position. Miss Pronger was accompanied to Farwell by Sue Farris, District Home Demonstration Agent from Amarillo.

5 YEARS AGO--MAY 23, 1976

The Friona High School band was named "Outstanding Band" in the class AA division of the Six Flags Over Texas Band Festival on May 14. The band competed against nine other bands in their class and scored a "Division I" rating along with the outstanding band honors.

Seventy-five high school seniors received their diplomas this week in graduation exercises held Friday, May 28, at 8:30 p.m.

One hundred twenty members of the eighth grade graduating class received their diplomas on Thursday, May 27.

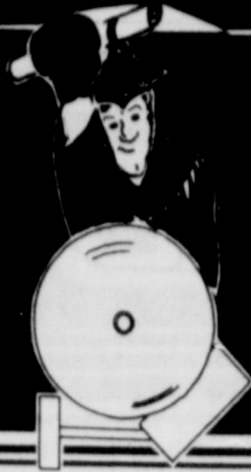

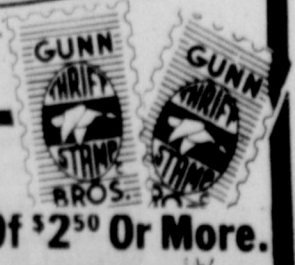

Research Begins On Grain Dust Explosions

The elusive causes and specific conditions that may inevitably cause grain dust explosions in grain elevators and feed mills are virtually impossible to "nail down" in every case, but not from the lack of financial and manpower support of the grain elevator industry.

Currently, more than \$1.6 million has been pledged by firms in the grain industry to conduct research for the purpose of identifying these causes and conditions. All of this money has been made available by private industry, including many grain firms that have facilities in Texas. Texas Grain and Feed Association has provided a \$10,000 donation. Texas A&M University is among the twenty universities, private firms, and research organizations currently engaged in specific research projects.

"The National Grain and Feed Association, through its 52 member Fire and Explosion Research Council, is guiding the efforts for this unprecedented grain industry financed research program. Today, 20 research projects totaling more than \$500,000 in industry donated funds have been awarded," according to National Grain and Feed

Association spokesmen. "The Council is sponsoring practical research that has the best chance of yielding workable results that can be put to use immediately by grain and feed firms to maximize safety," they emphasize.

From recent attention-getting headlines and irresponsible statements made by various "headline grabbers" it would appear that there are more fatalities in the grain elevator industry due to dust explosions than in any other industry. According to USDA there have been 12 fatalities during 1979 and 1980 in grain elevator explosions, while the National Safety Council during 1979 reported a total of 13,200 fatalities in all industries with the construction industry responsible for 2,600; agriculture 1,900; manufacturing 1,800; and government related jobs 1,700.

It would appear that with government related jobs accounting for 1,700 fatalities, more inspectors is not the answer. Until the conditions which prompt these explosions and the causes are definitely identified, inspectors may be at a loss as to what to look for.
