But something else of a somewhat disconcerting nature has arisen with the fact that in last week's effusion, the part or portion that was directed or devoted to politics was entirely omitted in the printed form. When the end of the part devoted to religion was reached,

A copy of the effusion was kept at home; it has been carefully read and re-read in an effort to find something that might have been construed as spiteful or otherwise disrespectful to Mr. Truman, and the effusion was also read to at least three other men, all of whom were good and fair-minded men and each of them stated that there was nothing that might have been

harmful to Mr. Truman or any other person, even though he may have disagreed with the

It was understood that Mr. fruman was wholly within his constitutional rights when he vetoed the OPA measure that was passed by the body of men. whose constitutional duty is the enactment of laws for the governing of our people, and that his veto constituted no breach of the constitution or of any law of the land, and that the effusion acknowledged the fact that it was willing to follow and to submit to whatever may be the will of a majority of the members of that lawmaking body. The OPA measure was a hotly contested matter in both the Senate and the House, and the fact must be admitted that each member of the body as a whole had the undisputed and constitutional right to his honest opinion on the matter, and the measure was purely and wholly a compromise measure, and voted for or adopted by a majority of the members of the law-making body as a whole. and under our form of government, the majority is supposed to rule. Then when Mr. Truman vetoed the measure, what else did he do but invoke the policy of a MINORITY rule?

The above three paragraphs constitute the sum and substance of last week's effusion, and wherein has anything been said that is derogatory or unjust to any man? Mr. Truman has his prerogatives, the same as any other citizen, and he acted wholly within and in accord with those prerogatives. And the same can be said of each and every member of the law-making body, and it is supposed that he or they exercised the rights of his or their prerogatives. Therefore, why was that portion of the effusion edited away from the linotype?

True, the sentiments may not have been wholly in accord to the opinions of the editor, and, true, the editor is also entitled to his prerogatives and opinions, and he is wholly within his rights as an editor in not permitting anything he dislikes to appear in his paper, but, so long as there was no libel or other slanderous expressions contained in the said effusion, or, if such an interpretation could be placed upon it, there is no apparent evidence that such an



### Veterans Advised to Go Slow When **Converting Life Insurance Policies**

The Veterans Administration has advised not to be too hasty has advised Veterans not to be too hasty about converting Service Life Insurance term policies to permanent insurance. But after the veteran has "reconverted" to civilian life, and settled down in a steady job, it's time for him to determine how much money he can afford convert his policy accordingly. But he has ample time in which to make the conversion. If his policy was issued before

icy was issued on or after that date, he has five years from the issue date in which to convert to permanent insurance. At present, term policies can be converted to one of three types of permanent insurance. Each has certain advantages. and the Veteran should exercise great care in selecting the type of permanent policy he wants.
