Sanderson Girls Honored.

Austin, Texas, July 28.—Students of the University of Texas who achieved special distinction in their scholastic work for the spring term of the long session have been listed on the honor roll, which has just been issued by Dean H. Y. Benedict, of the College of Arts and Sciences. The object of this honor list is to command officially one-tenth of the student body, that tenth whose grades during the term rank scholastically above the remaining nine-tenths. This "top" tenth is subdivided in five groups, giving rank to the highest averages. In constructing the honor list, account is taken both of the grades made and the number of courses passed, giving credit both to quality and quantity of work done. Freshmen grades run lower than those of the upper classes, and to attain equal rank on the honor roll, freshmen do not have to make quite such high averages as do the upper classes.

In 1919 the honor roll was published in this manner for the first time, and since then it has been compiled in the same manner every term. Out of 3,117 students, there were 72 in group 1; 148 in group 2; 222 in group 3; 319 in group 4; and 412 in group 5. Among the students from Sanderson in the University, the following were mentioned as deserving special distinction: Misses Sybil and Merle McKee.

COTTON ADVANCES ACCOUNT HOT WINDS

Unfavorable News From Abroad Causes Moderate Declines.

New Orleans.—Unfavorable foreign news caused moderate declines in the cotton market in the early part of this last week, after which complaints that the hot winds in portions of Texas resulted in strong recoveries and small net advances.

Labor conditions in this country were against prices for awhile, as was also the weakness in foreign exchange, but later in the week such features were balanced by reduction in Bank of England rate to 3 per cent.

After the middle of the week temperatures were somewhat lower in the western belt and reports of much cotton being ginned attracted much attention, especially as it was claimed the ginning would increase in the near future.

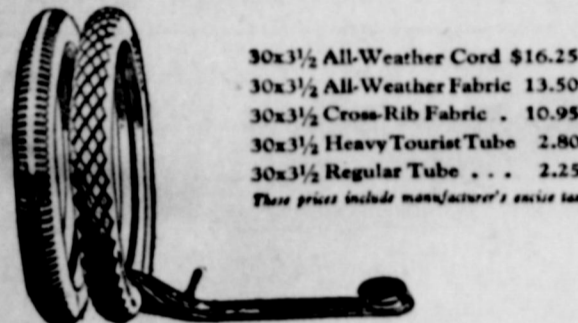

FLOOD LABORATORY PROPOSED IN SENATE

Widespread Commendation From Affected Areas Is Given Bill.

Washington.—The proposal of Senator Ransdell of Louisiana in a senate joint resolution to establish a hydraulic laboratory under one of the government departments in Washington, is receiving widespread endorsement in sections of the country periodically visited by river floods. The outcome of the legislation upon which hearings are to begin soon before a subcommittee of the senate, will be of interest to Texas and Louisiana, which suffered so greatly during the year from floods and overflows of the river bottoms. The laboratory would be established under a department to be designated by the president for the conduct of research, experiments and scientific studies in connection with the problem of river hydraulics, and an appropriation of \$200,000 authorized for this purpose.
There is no scientific study being made in the United States, Senator Ransdell says, of river hydraulics or of methods most effective in meeting floods, but the question has been left for the communities affected with little apparent result. In the years of no floods no thought is given the menace, and it is only at the time of great damage that the communities are stirred to action.
Senator Ransdell pointed out that the German government many years ago established such a laboratory on the Rhine to study the action of the river with reference to its flows of water and to develop effective methods of meeting floods that are calculated to occur at certain seasons most any year.
"We think it advisable for the government to undertake this research and to bring into force the government's best minds dealing with the subject," said Senator Ransdell. "A survey after a flood has occurred is too late to be minimized but that only tells what might have been done to reduce the damage and loss. What ought to be done is complete a study of the problem from a scientific standpoint, so that we can find some rational means for meeting the flood menace when it does come."

CANADA HAS STEADY GROWTH
Recent Census Shows Healthy Increase in Population, Despite Losses Caused by War.
Canada's census for 1921 indicated a total population of 8,769,489, distributed as follows: New Brunswick, 387,880; Nova Scotia, 523,837; Prince Edward Island, 88,615; Quebec, 2,346,097; Ontario, 2,925,064; Manitoba, 613,008; British Columbia, 523,363; Yukon, 4,162; Northwest territories, 6,984, and Canadian navy, 485. The gain for the whole Dominion during 1910-1920, was 1,600,000 or 21.5 per cent. The war cost the lives of 56,680 Canadians killed in action, while 40,000 more died from indirect causes. The percentage increase in population is the same as that for Australia, while the increase for New Zealand 20 per cent was very little behind. In the Union of South Africa the increase was 19.2 per cent. The Prairie provinces made the most pronounced gain in Canada, Alberta showing a 55 per cent increase; Saskatchewan over 33 per cent, and Manitoba, 23 per cent. For the next ten years the unit of distribution for determining the membership of parliament will be 36,250. This total is arrived at by dividing by 65 the population of each province.

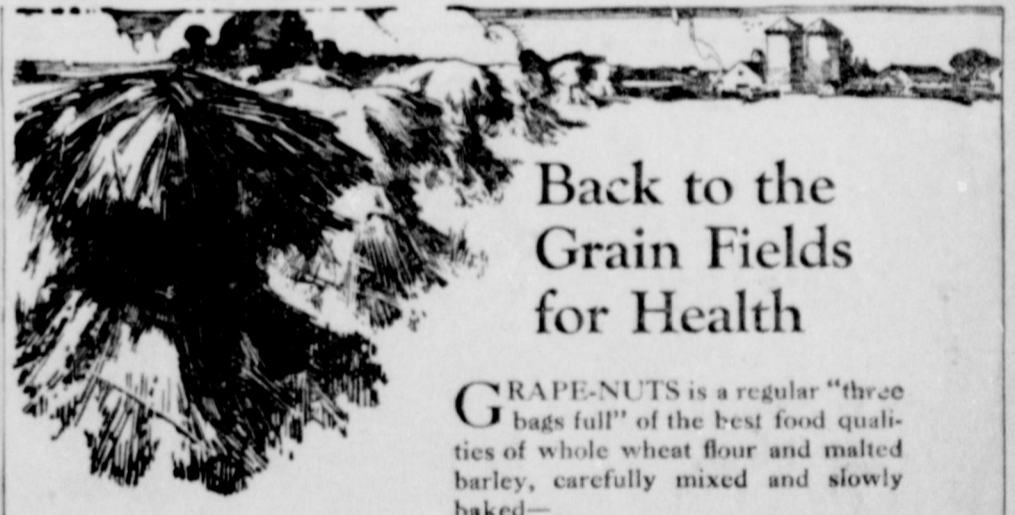
