





SYRUP PLANT AT LUFKIN

IS FACTOR IN INDUSTRY

Washington.-With the opening last week of a modern co-operative cane syrup blending and standardizing plant at Lufkin, Tex., officials of the department of agriculture, under whose auspices the plant was built and whose methods it will use, feel the industry has made an important step toward extending the market for cane syrup, which will permit cane growers to greatly increase their acreage of sugar cane and be of considerable value to the South.

The plant at Lufkin, erected by the Texas Farm Bureau Ribbon Cane Growers' Association, has a capacity of 5,000 gallons of syrup a day and will blend and standardize the syrup production by the cane growers ir several counties of Texas. Through the work of the department of agriculture bureau of chemistry, a highgrade cane syrup, of uniform color and flavor, that will not crystalize or ferment, is now being made in various parts of the South.

Coreless Apples Found.

Montreal.—Much enthusiasm was woked at the fall meeting of the Pomological and Fruit Growing Society of the province of Quebec by the announcement of the discovery at Abbotsford of a seedless and coreless variety of the Fameuse apple. Professor F. Sears of the Amherst (Mass.) Horticultural college, who was present, examined the fruit and pronounced it Fameuse in every essential detail. He said if it could be reproduced it would prove of great value. The seedless apple was discovered by accident, and the exhibitor had no idea of how it was developed. He believes, however, that the variety could be perpetuated by grafts.

MEXICO HALTS GAME HUNTERS ON BORDER

Game Hunting of Every Description Is Forbidden in Northern Tamaulipas.

Brownsville, Tex.—The no-hunting lid is clamped down tight throughout Northern Tamaulipas and hunting of game of every description is strictly forbidden, according to a statement made by Lauro Villareal Garza, fish and game commissioner for Northern Tamaulipas. Mr. Garza's district extends from Salta La Marina, on the gulf coast east of Matamoras, to Nuevo Laredo, and extends into the interior as far south as Victoria.

Mr. Garza recently received orders from the secretary of agriculture at Mexico City to prohibit all hunting within his district, and has not been informed as to whether this prohibition extends to all districts in the southern republic. Notices have been printed in the Mexican papers of the new decree and heavy fines are assessed against those caught violating the law. A few special permits have been issued from Mexico City for hunting within this district, and several American army officers were recently granted such permits, but Americans contemplating a hunting expedition into Mexico are warned to either secure permits from Mexico City or postpone their trips until the hunting ban has been lifted.

"We do not wish to have trouble with anyone," the game warden of the district stated, "but we must enforce the law. I do not know when the government will again permit hunting in the district, and I doubt very much if they will ever again permit game to be slaughtered as it has been in the past. If hunting is again permitted, it will be with more stringent restrictions than ever be-

Mr. Garza also stated that soldiers throughout the district had been instructed to arrest any person hunting wild game and to confiscate the arms of such persons. They will also be given a heavy fine.

Although hunting has been prohibited only a few weeks, the wild fowl seem to realize that they are safe in Granulated Eyelids, Sties, Inflamed Eyes the swamps and lagoons of Northern elleved overnight by Roman Eye Balsam.


