TESTING AUTOMOBILE HEALTH

Maryland is conducting a roundup of all its automobiles for clinical inspection. During the first week some 3,000 cars were inspected and fully a third of them found defective in one of the essential attributes of a healthy machine Blakes in many instances, were found out of adjustment or in need of relining. Lights hors or steering gear in other instances were found far from per-

Maryland's experience follows closely that of New York, which was able to entice only approximately one half of its automobile owners into service stations and garages in which the inspection service was rendered free. Of motor cars examined. 39 per cent were found to be defective in one particular or another. Nearly 30 per cent of the defective cars required brake adjustment, and on 3 per cent the brakes had to be relined. Nearly 50 per cent of the defective vehicles stood in need of headlight adjustment, 6 per cent had defective warning devices and 10 per cent had faulty steering equipment. Officials in charge of the campaign, subsequently issued a statement to the effect that in many cases repairs were made just in time to avoid aceldents and that in practically every case owners were unaware of the need of adjustment.


