## hostile desert millions of miles Opposition Voiced To Hospital Dist.

A group which is opposed to the creation of a hospital district for Parmer County Community Hospital this week pointed out some reasons to give the idea a good airing out before the vote is taken.

Some of the reasons cited included:

\*The overall fragile condition of the agricultural economy, which is the number one source of income locally.

\*The fact that with a hospital district, the county will be liable for all indigent care for its residents.

\*The fact that a hospital district creates a new tax, that will be a permanent tax obligation for the property owners within the district to be created.

\*The tremendous need for capital outlay items for equipment for the hospital, versus the small patient load that the hospital has had for the past several months.

There should be some alternatives to the hospital district, that would assure health care for local residents, the spokesmen said, that would not be nearly as expensive on the local taxpayers.

It was suggested that a public forum might be called, where pros and cons of the issue could be discussed.



A Market Of Stocks, Not A Stock Market Some years ago, Dr. Douglas Bellimore, then professor of at New York

economics University, warned his students that "it's a market of stocks, not a stock market." This was not a play on words but Professor Bellimore's philosophy of prudent stock selection. Buy stocks, not the market, he advocated.

Consider one of the major market barometers, the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA). This popular index represents a limited number of big stocks rather than the entire "market of stocks."

1928, the Dow had grown to 30. in a market of nearly 3,000. stocks, the size at which it remains today. In the past 62 years, however, the stocks composing the Dow have changed 20 times to better represent the market as a whole.

stocks, as well as stock splits, a complicated and changing formula Friday. has become necessary to maintain continuity in the statistics. The stocks comprising the Dow are weighted based on the dollar price of each, thereby giving greater weight to higher valued stocks.

This weighting of the individual Dow stocks can have distorted effects on the market. For example, during the period Chad Hamilton two for three. between July 1, 1989, and July 30, 1990, the ten top-weighted Dow stocks increased an average of 30 percent; the ten middle-weighted Dow stocks advanced 13 percent; Simmons pitched 41/3 innings.

and the ten bottom-weighted Dow stocks advanced only one percent. Using the present weighting system, the Dow advanced 19 percent. However, if all 30 stocks had been equally weighted, the average would have risen 15 percent rather than 19 percent.

Do not misconstrue this as critical of an economic barometer that is watched by the entire world. Actually, Dow Jones & Co. is continually looking for ways to improve this market measure. Prior to 1979, for example, the cyclical stocks were over-represented in the Dow.






