

## Red Devils Take Two More Wins; Girls Get A Second

The Red Devils of Rankin High School continued to amaze sports fans in West Texas as they rolled along with victories in the Iraan Track Meet and the Brady Golf Tournament; and at the same time, the RHS Girls Track Team took their second 2nd-place finish in a row-also a possible upset.

In Iraan, it was something of a replay of the previous week that saw Rankin win the Wink meet with their closes challenger being the Stanton Buffaloes. In Wink, Rankin won 152-118 over the 2nd-place Buffs. In Iraan, the Red Devils turned it on and blew past Stanton 163-93. Other team finishes in the division saw Balmorhea with 66 points, host Iraan with 61, Sanderson with 45, Wink with 43. Marfa at 17. Iron County with 6 and Eldorado, 1.

Rankin had 1st in the 880 with McAnaugh clocking a 2:09.5; in the Long Jump with Plagens going out 30.31/2; in the Discus as Speed flung a 148.3 and again it was Speed in the Shot Put, and Black in the 440 at 52,7.

The mile relay team was 2nd, .05 seconds behind Stanton while other point-getters included Johnson in the 120 high hurdles, 2nd; Johnson 2nd and Vick 3rd in the 330 hurdles; Plagens 3rd in the 220, Loftin and Johnson tied for 3rd in the pole valut and Copeland notched a 2nd in the high jump.



## Commissioners In Monday Session

Upton County Commissioners' Court met Monday, March 10 in a regular session with all members present. County Judge Peggy Garner announced that she would set the terms of County Court for the months of January, April, July and October during 1975.

In other matters handled, all mostly of a routine nature, the Court approved reports by officials, approved bills for payment and authorized the County Judge to advertise an amendment to the Revenue Sharing Budget, Approval was also given for the County to pay, from budgeted items for child welfare, for the physical examinations required for prospective foster parents.

In addition, they approved an order by District Judges Charles Sherrill and Bill Earney that put the salary of County Auditor Hollis Huffaker at \$14,868 annually, to be paid in twelve monthly installments; and the salary of Assistant County Auditor Frankie Pringle at \$8,663.20, to be paid in twenty-six biweekly installments. Salaries of these two employees are fixed by District Judges in the 112th and 83rd Judicial Districts.

Effective date of the salary scales was put at March 1, 1975.
