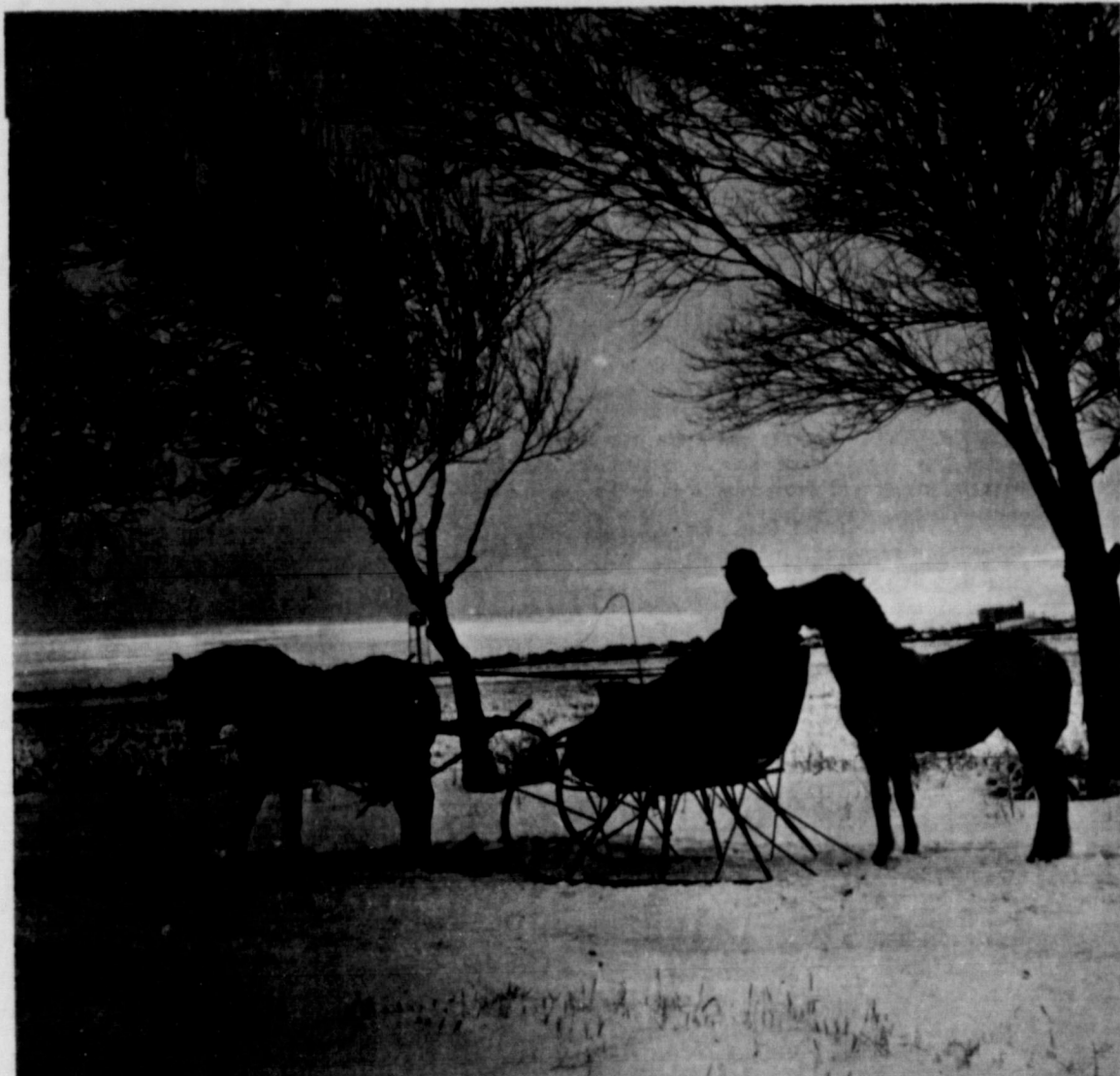

ONE-YEAR APPOINTMENT

Archie Tarter Named Parmer Co. Judge

Archie Tarter, retired farmer from the Lazbuddie area, was appointed Monday by the County Commissioners Court to serve as Parmer County Judge until

the general election next November, at which time a special race for the office will be held.

The office became vacant last week upon the death of Loyde A. Brewer, who had held the position since January of 1959.

Four candidates were interviewed for the position. Others who appeared before the commissioners were W.L. (Preach) Edelman and Wesley Hardesty of Friona and Eddie Bryan Smith of Farwell.

In the final voting, Tarter received three votes and Edelman one.

The commissioners called Attorney General Crawford Martin's office for a ruling on the term of the appointed judge, and were told that the appointment would be for the period until the next general election, which is November, 1968.

In the meantime, candidates will have until February of 1968 to file for the judge's office, and

following the general election in November, the one elected will take office for a special two-year term. After that, the office will go back to a four-year situation following the election of 1970.

A member of the court said the appointment might be considered by some to have been too soon following Judge Brewer's death, but added that the Judge's office handles a lot of county business, and the commissioners wanted to get an appointee before the business stacked up on the new judge.

Tarter, the newly appointed judge, has been a resident of the county since 1943. He farmed in the Lazbuddie area until about four years ago, and has been connected with the Lazbuddie elevator since.

The new judge has been a member of the ASCS board of directors for 14 years. He is 60 years of age.

5-Inch Snow Leaves Slick, Slosy Scene

Two separate snow storms pelted the Friona area with four to six inches of snow during the past week, bringing the area its first measurable moisture in about two months.

Wheat farmers hailed the snow, although last Thursday's snowfall was somewhat dry in nature.

Officially, the City of Friona measured the water content of all the snow and sleet at .29 inches — maybe not as much as it appeared on Friona streets and parking lots, but still the first moisture for the month.

A four-inch snowfall was recorded late in the day on Thursday, resulting in .21 moisture. On Saturday afternoon, another half-inch snow was logged in the city, which added .05 inches of moisture. Then on Sunday, snow and sleet amounted to an additional .03 inches.

By late Tuesday, the snow was gradually melting, although the city's official measurement showed an average of three inches still on the ground on Tuesday morning.

It was the most snow for this time of the year in recent years — raising expectations of a wetter winter than the area has had lately.

Patrol Investigates Nine Parmer Accidents

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated nine accidents on rural highways in Parmer County during the month of November, according to Sergeant W.E. Wells, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in ten persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$5,845.00.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first eleven months of 1967 shows a total of 112 accidents resulting in five persons killed, 66 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$76,476.00

What does the traffic picture look like for this Christmas--New Year holiday season? Past records have proven December to be the most deadly month of the year. December, 1966 recorded 351 fatalities.

The Sergeant stated, "It is estimated that 100 persons will be killed in traffic accidents during the Christmas and New Year holidays." The Sergeant also added, "If we are going to be satisfied for a repeat performance of past records set during the month of December, then this holiday season is going to be a very sad one for many people."

SCS To Inaugurate New Report Service

Farmers will benefit from a new reporting service which has been inaugurated by ASCS. A report of payments made to each farmer under the ACP, cotton, feed grain, wheat and other direct payment programs during 1967 will be mailed to the farmer during the latter part of January. This report is expected to be helpful in preparing individual income tax returns.

The same information is furnished the Internal Revenue Service as required by law. It is estimated that over three million farmers will receive this report. This information is being gathered from ASCS county offices and summarized by computers located in New Orleans and Kansas City. The reports are being printed by the computers and mailed direct to farmers. A job of this size could not be completed without an automated system.

Since this is the first year for a service of this magnitude, there are bound to be a few problems. It is suggested that farmers carefully read the explanation on the report and check the accuracy of the total report by comparing it with farm records. If an error is discovered, the nearest ASCS county office should be contacted to have the mistake corrected. ASCS county office employees will give the necessary assistance to anyone regardless of where their farm is located.

\$50,000 EARMARKED

Hwy Dept. Allocates Funds For 214 ROW

Allocation of \$50,000 for the purchase of right-of-way for a highway extension in Friona was included in a two-year \$362 million Consolidated Highway Program for Texas, announced by District Engineer O. L. Crain of Lubbock this week.

The strip in question lies from Fourth Street in Friona south to State Highway 214, a distance of some 3 miles where the state proposes to bring the highway straight across the Santa Fe railway and Frio Draw. No allocation of construction funds for the project was included in the program, indicating it might be another two years before any construction on the project could be scheduled.

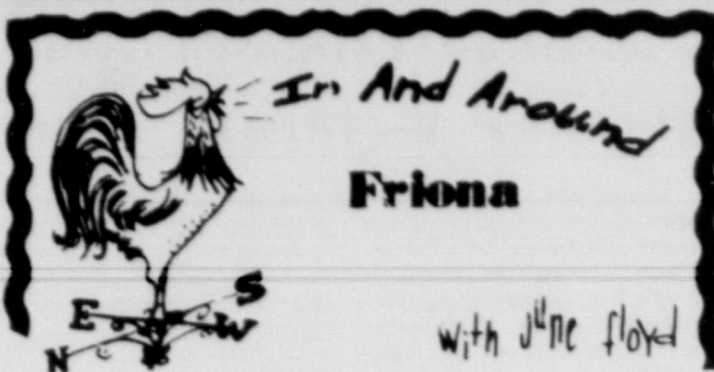
Biggest end of the \$15,494,000 approved for Texas' dis-

trict five is for Lubbock County, and other counties with heavily-travelled highways.

Work authorized for the county and district is a part of the 1,667.6 miles of road authorized for the state during 1969 and 1970.

HOGMANAY

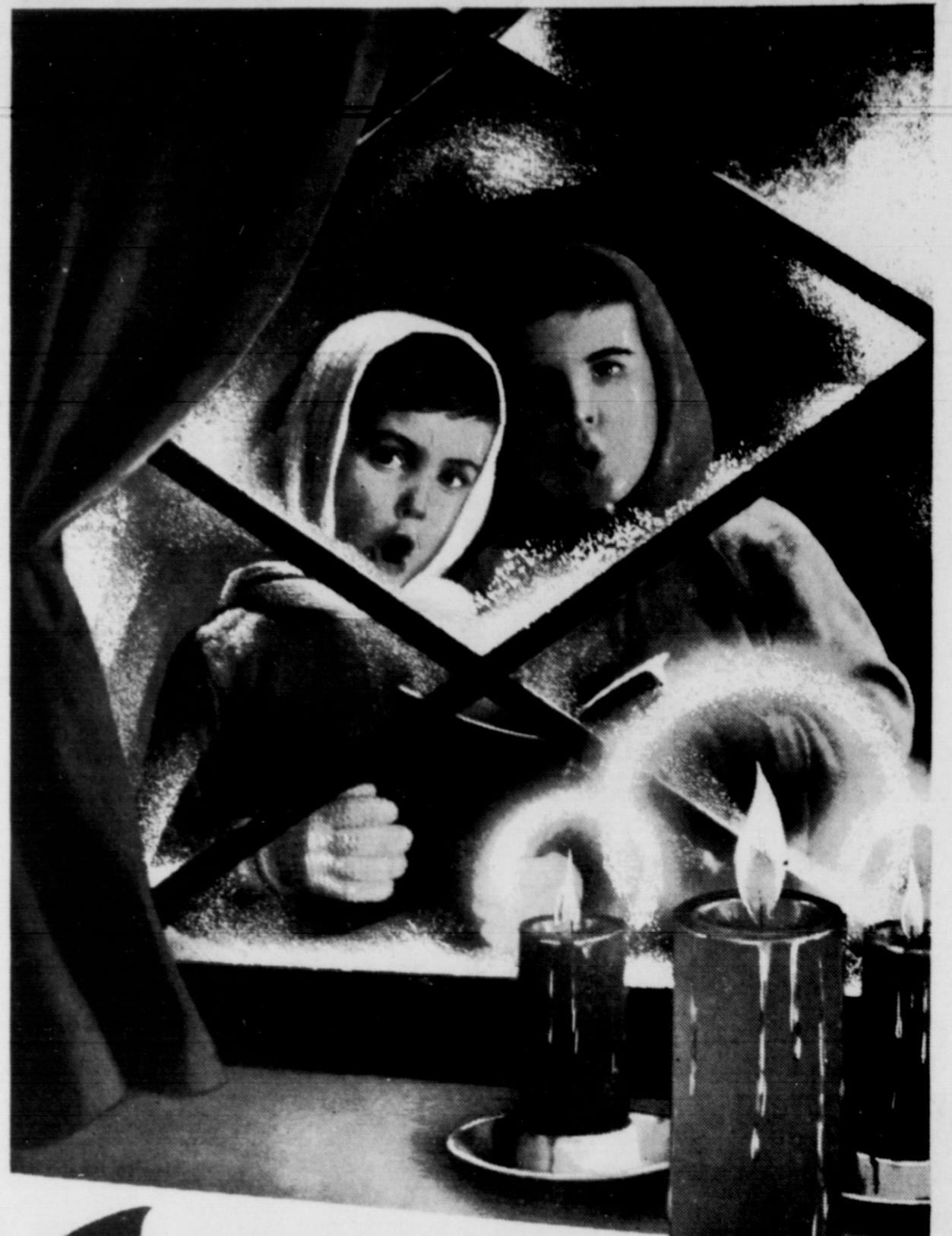
Brian Fennel, the 32 year old father, commented, "It's complicated enough becoming the father of twins without having problems like this, too. Let the law handle it."

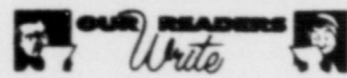
SCS Again To Sponsor Essay Award Contest

Potatoes on Half Shell
8 large potatoes
Garlic and salt to taste
1/4 lb. butter
1-8 oz. pkg. Philadelphia cream cheese
1/4 pt. sour cream
Bake potato. Mix other ingredients until fluffy. Refill potato shell and bake at 350 degrees until warm (or until slice of American Cheese on top is melted)

Date-Nut Pie
2 cups sugar
3 tablespoons flour
5 eggs
1 pkg. dates
1 cup sour cream
1 cup nuts
1 tsp. vanilla
3 tsp. butter
Cook sugar, flour, eggs and sour cream in double boiler. Add nuts, dates and vanilla. Pour in bake pie shells. Yields 2 pies.

Rum Balls
1/4 lb. butter
1/2 lb. Chocolate (grated)
1 cup chopped nuts
2 Tablespoons rum or brandy (extract will do)

Mrs. Hicks Gives Recipes For Favorite Holiday Foods

Mr. and Mrs. Ed Hicks, former residents of Muleshoe, have lived in our city several years and are associated with Mr. and Mrs. Joe B. Douglas in the operation of Douglas Land Company.

They are both active in First Baptist Church and she has taught a class of young women several years. Any time this group gets together for a meal you are likely to hear an expression like, "Effie made the most wonderful cake," or "Wasn't that salad Effie brought out of this world?"

Naturally, when we began to consider asking for recipes for holiday or everyday fare, she was one of the first persons we thought of.

Mrs. Hicks was kind enough to share the following recipes with us:

Broccoli Casserole
1 package frozen broccoli, cooked
1 1/2 cup cooked rice
1 1/2 cup shredded cheese
1 can undeluted mushroom soup
1/2 cup oleo
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped celery
Saute celery and onion in oleo till tender, mix all other ingredients with celery and onion except 1/2 cup cheese, place in casserole and bake till it bubbles, add 1/2 cup cheese and return to oven till cheese melts.

Cranberry Salad
1 lb. cranberries
3 oranges
1 envelope plain gelatin
1 lb. marshmallows
2 1/2 cups sugar
1 cup nuts (if desired)
1 cup whipping cream, whipped

Cook cranberries till all pop, just barely cover in water, then add sugar, marshmallows, nuts and oranges (peeled and chopped), chill in refrigerator until well chilled then add whipped cream.

'Green Christmas' Traces Heritage To Ancient Times

A sprig of mistletoe, a holly wreath, an evergreen tree — these and other decorations of greenery come into homes at holiday time — and tradition blooms.

The "green Christmas" is an ancient custom, more universally observed than a "white Christmas."

In earliest times, at the pagan winter festivals, evergreens and winter-blooming plants

were prized for their promise of spring and the sun's return. For the first Christians, the same greenery symbolized life eternal.

"The Holly and the Ivy." As the old Christmas carol indicates, both holly and ivy share an ancient heritage as holiday greenery. Early characterization of holly as masculine and ivy as feminine goes back to pagan games, with "the holly and the ivy" in friendly competition.

A later tradition says that spiny-leaved hollies are "he" hollies, while the smooth-leaved plants are "she" hollies. The kind of holly brought into the home at Christmas determines whether "he" or "she" will be head of the house for the coming year.

1 egg white

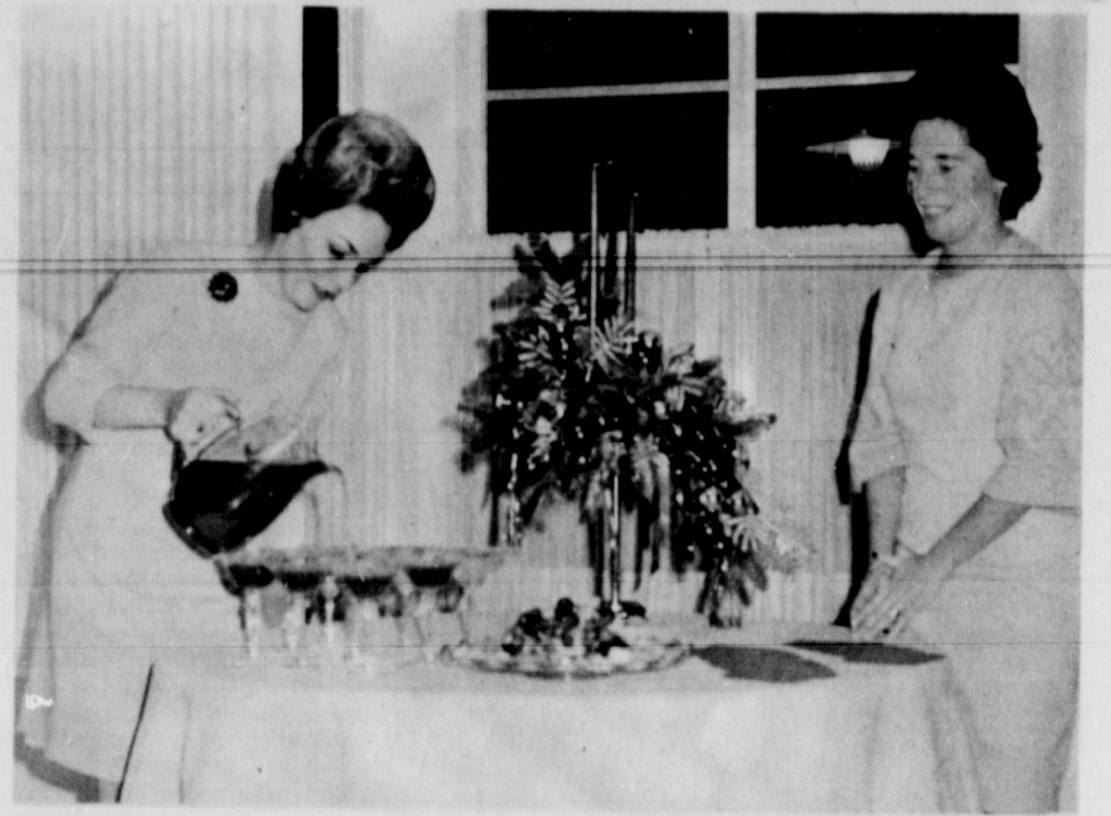

ALL ABOUT SNOW



Next time you admire a delicate snowflake, give a thought to how it was formed. Snow results when water vapor in the atmosphere freezes and forms crystals around a central core, such as a particle of dust. A snowflake can be composed of one or a cluster of hundreds of crystals. The designs are branched and usually six-sided, although some with three sides have been recorded.

"White as snow," is a misstatement, explain researchers at Allied Chemical Company, for snow is never really white. It's usually colorless or off-white; the reflection of light makes the crystals seem white.

Red, green and even black snow has been known to fall—a phenomenon caused by fungi or dust particles around which the snowflakes have formed.

Snowflakes may seem light as they float in the air, but a tightly packed pile of snow can weigh as much as 50 pounds. And while you may agree that snow can be a poetic, inspiring sight, it often creates a nuisance in choking driveway and

walks and ties up traffic on busy city streets.

An unusual early apparatus meant to solve this problem was patented by a New York City man in 1869. It separated a mass of snow into flakes and then melted them. Today, however, there's a quick, easy way to melt snow and ice. Solvay calcium chloride melts snow and ice even at temperatures of 40° below zero, and does the job seven times faster than rock salt! The chemical, locally available in 25-pound bags, dissolves snow and ice on store front, driveway, path or doorstep. Many communities also make their streets and highways safer in winter by using calcium chloride in bulk form, often mixed with rock salt, at a cost of only pennies per pound.

The town that probably could have put calcium chloride to best use was Silver Lake, Colorado, which holds the record for the most snow in one day—76 inches, back in 1921! The heaviest annual snowfall in history was 1,000 inches at Paradise Ranger Station at Mt. Ranier, in Washington.

- Few drops peppermint flavoring (optional)
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup cookie coconut
- Red and green maraschino cherries, cut in pieces

Combine corn syrup, sugar, salt, and water in saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until sugar is dissolved. Continue cooking, without stirring, until a small amount of syrup forms a hard ball in cold water (or to a temperature of 262°).

While syrup is cooking, beat egg whites until stiff but not dry. Then, when temperature is reached, pour syrup slowly over egg whites, beating constantly. Beat until mixture begins to appear dull and holds its shape. Add vanilla, peppermint flavoring, and nuts. Drop from tip of teaspoon into coconut on wax paper to shape candy into a ball and to coat with coconut. Decorate with cherries. Makes about 7 dozen.

HOLIDAY FRUITCAKE

For generations, families have celebrated the holidays with fruitcake. Make it well in advance so it will ripen and mellow.

| 1 cup Wesson Oil | 1 teaspoon cloves |
| 1 1/2 cups brown sugar firmly packed | 1 cup Florida orange juice |
| 4 eggs | 1 cup thinly sliced citron |
| 3 cups Gold Medal Flour (regular or Wondra) | 1 cup chopped candied pineapple |
| 1 teaspoon baking powder | 1 1/2 cups whole candied cherries |
| 2 teaspoons salt | 1 cup seeded raisins |
| 2 teaspoons cinnamon | 1 cup chopped figs |
| 2 teaspoons allspice | 3 cups chopped nuts |

Heat oven to 275°F. Combine Wesson, sugar and eggs; beat vigorously with spoon or electric mixer for 2 minutes. Sift 2 cups of flour with baking powder, salt and spices. Stir into oil mixture alternately with orange juice.

Mix remaining flour with fruits and nuts. Pour batter over fruit, mix well. Turn into two 9 x 5 x 3-inch loaf pans greased and lined with brown paper.

Place a pan of water on lower oven rack. Bake cakes 2 1/2 to 3 hours or until done. After baking, let cakes stand 15 minutes before removing from pans. Cool thoroughly on racks without removing paper.

When cool remove paper. Wrap in Aluminum Foil and store to ripen. If desired, cakes can be wrapped in cloth dampened with brandy or wine. 48 slices.

If you were to travel through the rural areas of Austria, you would no doubt wonder about an unusual inscription written in chalk above the doorway of many homes. It goes like this: C + M + B = 1967.

These letters are renewed every year at Epiphany, the only change being replacement of the date of the new year. On January 6, 1968, the letters will be renewed, with the sole addition of the new year's numeral.

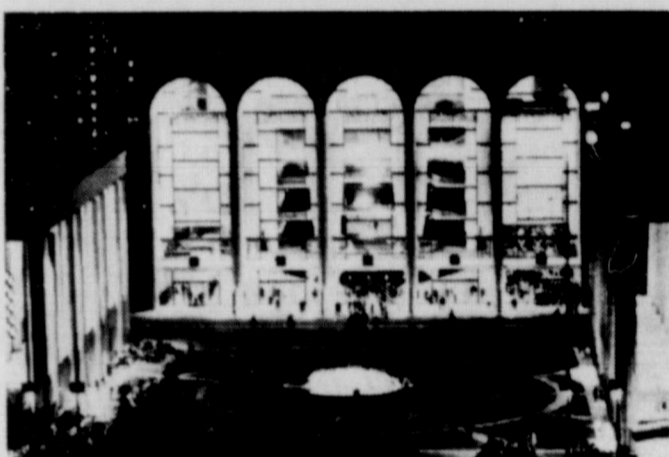
The letters stand for the names of the Three Kings, or the Three Wise Men, or Magi. In case you have forgotten, they are Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The Three Wise Men are the focal point of the celebration of Epiphany in the Western church, as they are considered the first called upon to worship Christ as God and King.

Tradition holds that January 6 was the date upon which the Wise Men completed their journey to Bethlehem. Yet Epiphany, from the Greek "revelation

of the Lord" actually celebrates three manifestations of Christ: to the Wise Men, at his baptism 30 years later, and in the wedding feast at Cana.

The Austrian custom of painting the initials of the Wise Men and the year above doorways replaced the pagan "Drudenfuss" or pentagram and other hex symbols inscribed thereon to guard the house from evil spirits.

During the Austrian Epiphany season, three boys dressed as the Three Wise Men, and called Sternsinger, or "Star Singers", carry the message of the Magi from house to house. They are rewarded with cakes, candy and fruit; in recent years have taken up collections for charitable groups around the world.

Turkey Talk

This year plot your turkey strategy. Buy a bigger bird than you need for a holiday dinner and freeze the extra meat. Then you're all set for quick and easy meals. Or what I call turkey "planned overs" for the busy holiday season.

Lots of interesting possibilities. White turkey meat with slices of jellied cranberry for sandwich time. Creamed turkey on gridle cakes for Sunday brunch. Casseroles, hash or turkey loaves for family suppers. Turkey soup. And if you're looking for some new turkey recipes, try these. They're very good, I promise you.

QUICK-BROILED SANDWICHES

- 2 cups Bisquick
- 2/3 cup milk
- 2 tablespoon soft butter
- 1 large tomato
- 8 slices cooked turkey
- 8 slices process American cheese

Heat oven to 450°. Lightly grease a baking sheet. With fork mix Bisquick and milk to stiff dough. Beat vigorously 20 strokes. On lightly floured cloth-covered board, knead 8 times. Roll dough into rectangle, 12x8 inches. Place dough on prepared baking sheet. Spread with butter. Bake 10 minutes. Slice tomato into 8 slices. Cut hot biscuit bread into 8 rectangles. Top each rectangle with slice of tomato, turkey and cheese. Set oven control at broil and/or 550°. Broil sandwiches 6 inches from heat about 3 minutes or until

cheese is bubbly. Serve immediately. 8 servings.

EASY TURKEY DIVAN

- 2 packages (10 ounces each) frozen broccoli
- 6 slices cooked turkey or 1 1/2 to 2 cups cut-up cooked turkey
- 6 slices process American cheese
- 1 can (14 1/2 ounces) evaporated milk
- 1 can (10 1/2 ounces) cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can (3 1/2 ounces) French-fried onion rings

Heat oven to 350°. Cook broccoli as directed on package. Place turkey in oblong baking dish, 11 1/2 x 7 1/2 x 1 1/2 inches. Cover with broccoli; top with cheese and cover with mixture of milk and soup. Bake 25 minutes. Cover with onion rings and bake 5 minutes longer. 4 to 6 servings.

A group of seven Friona residents were among the 75 West Texas and Eastern New Mexico residents who took part in a four-day tour of California's water projects, sponsored by "Water, Inc."

Friona was the best-represented city in the entire Panhandle-South Plains region, as only Lubbock had more delegates on the tour, 12. Most delegates from any other city was five, from both Lockney and Spur. Most places had a single delegate, if any.

Attending from Friona were Mr. and Mrs. A. L. Black, Bruce Parr, A. W. Anthony, Steve Struve, W. D. Buske and Charles Allen.

A member of the Friona delegation said that the tour group was quite impressed with Friona's turnout, and remarked it "was no wonder Friona is going places."

While in California, the group visited state water officials in Sacramento, and then to the giant Oroville Dam, starting point of the \$1,750,000,000 California Water Project.

California, like the Water, Inc. region, is running out of underground water and has inaugurated a water transportation system to move over four million acre feet of water annually by open canal from northern areas of the state to the southern areas of need, a distance of some 440 miles. The system is fully coordinated with other water developments constructed by the Federal Government and local agencies. Also on the tour, the group

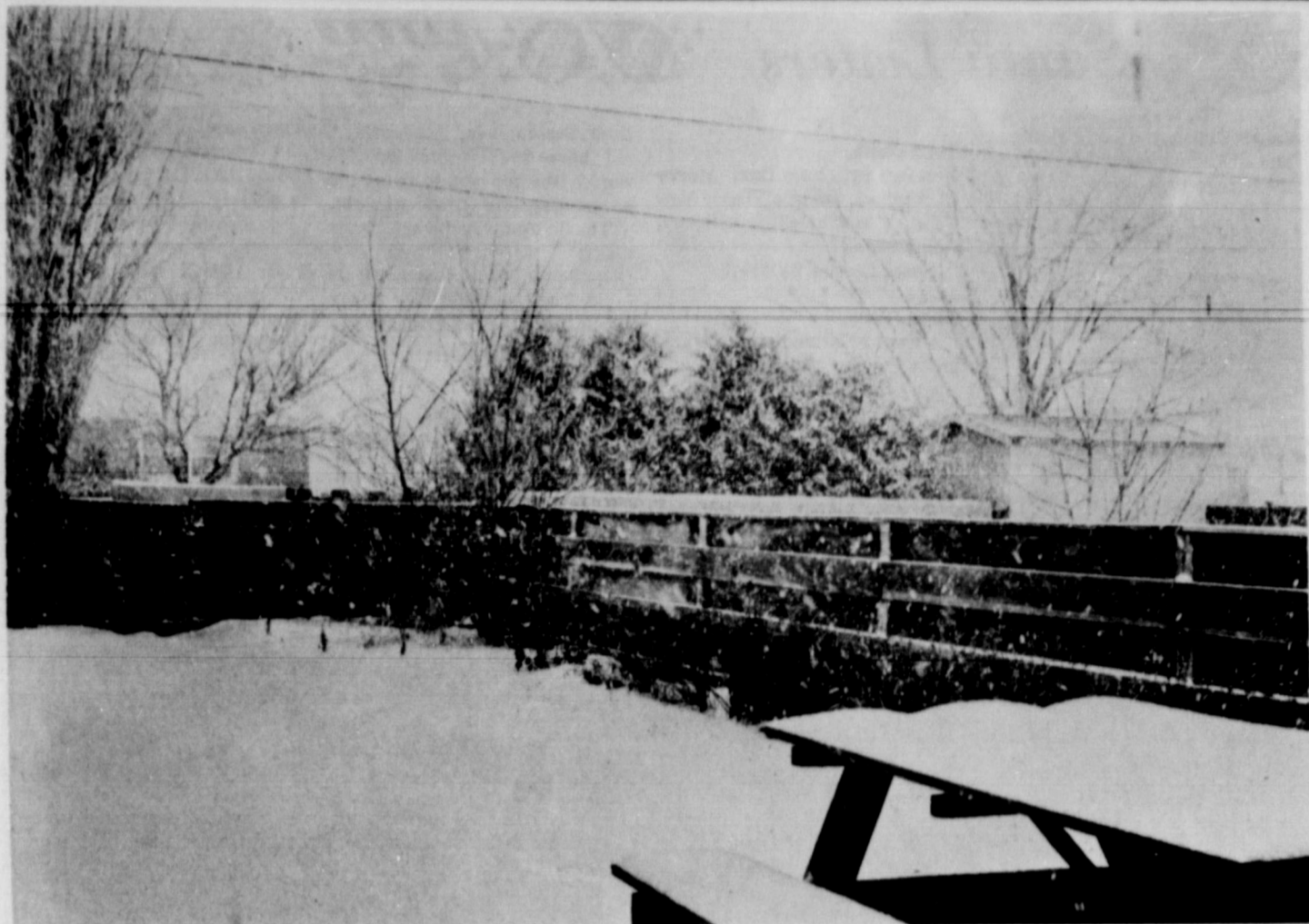

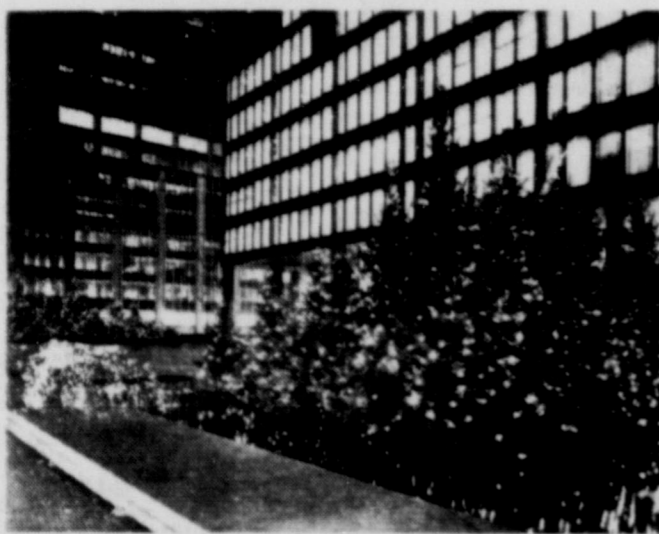

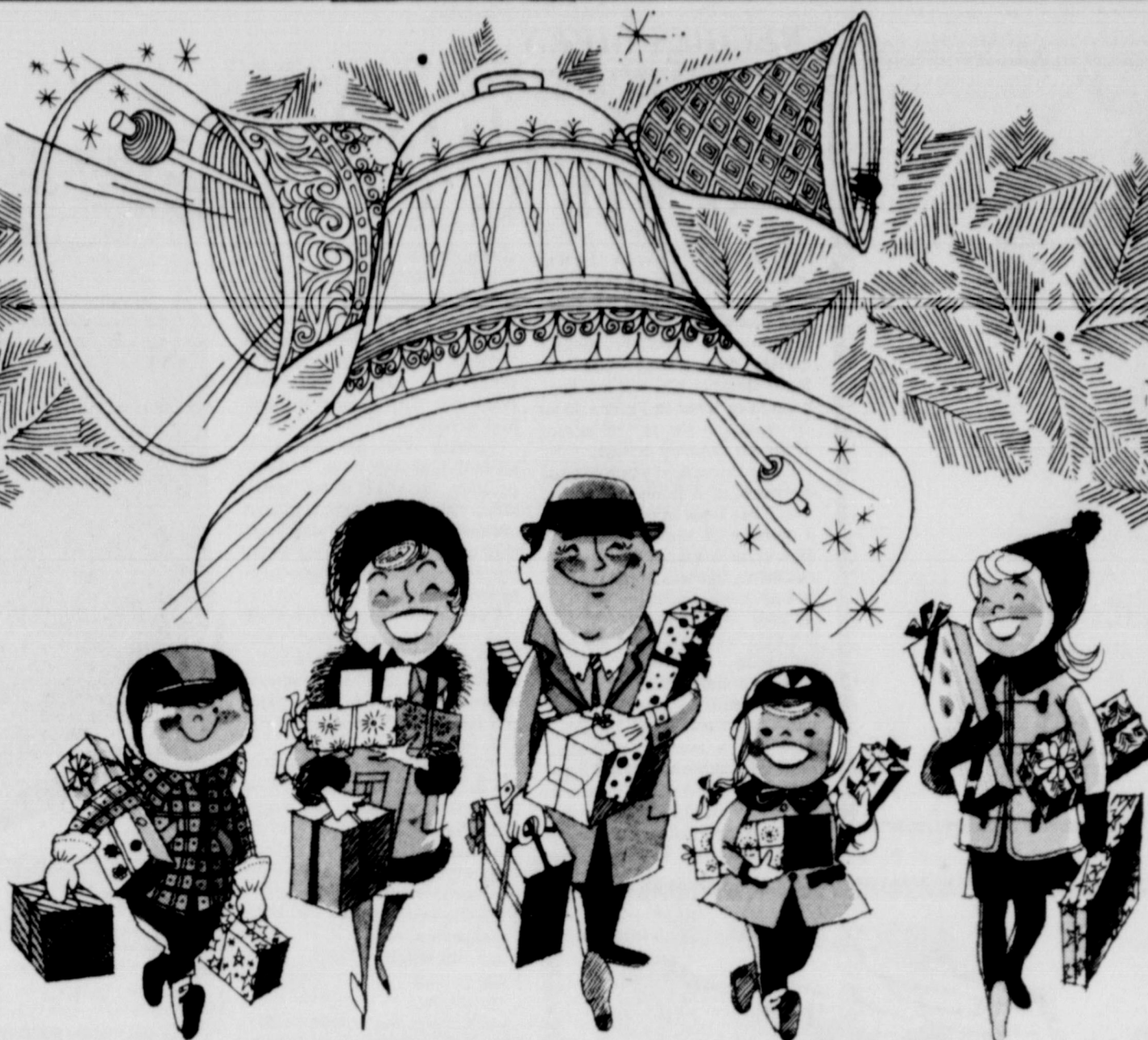

White Chocolate Cake

- 1/4 lb. White Chocolate
1/2 cup hot water
1 cup butter
1 cup sugar
4 eggs (separated)
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 1/2 cups cake flour
1 teaspoon soda
1 cup buttermilk
1 cup pecans
1 cup coconut

Melt chocolate in hot water. Let cool. Cream sugar and butter; beat until fluffy. Add 1 egg yolk at a time beating well after each addition. Sift 2 1/2 cups cake flour and soda. Add to mixture alternately with buttermilk.

Add melted chocolate and vanilla. Beat egg whites until stiff; but not dry. Fold into mixture. Gently stir in nuts and coconut. Bake in 3 or 4 layers at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes.

Frosting
1 cup evaporated milk

- 1 cup sugar
3 egg yolks
1/4 lb. oleo
1 1/3 cup coconut
1 cup pecans
1 teaspoon vanilla

Combine in saucepan the milk, sugar, egg yolks, oleo and vanilla. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture thickens... about 12 minutes. Add coconut and chopped nuts. Beat until frosting is cool and thick enough to spread.

If white chocolate isn't available at local grocery stores, it may be purchased at the candy shop in Sugarland Mall in Hereford.

Divinity

- 4 cups sugar
1 cup Karo
3/4 cup water
3 egg whites, beaten stiffly
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup broken nuts
Cook sugar, Karo and water

over low heat until it spins a thread. Pour about 1/4 cup mixture over beaten egg whites, beating constantly. Let remainder of syrup cook longer adding in three parts. (The last part will be at the hard ball stage) Add nuts and vanilla. Continue beating until gloss is gone. When ready to pour up, drop from tip of spoon onto wax paper in individual pieces.

She has a large collection of recipes, but for Christmas generally uses favorites of her mothers, which she has been enjoying for many years. The three she chose to share with us are:

Sugar Cookies

2 cups sugar
1 cup butter
Dash of salt
1 cup sour cream
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon vanilla
Cream sugar and butter. Add salt and sour cream and soda, which have been mixed together. Blend together with vanilla. Then add enough flour to make dough a stiff dough. Chill. Roll out and cut into desired

shapes before baking. These may be decorated or served plain.

Applesauce Cake

1 cup butter
2 cups sugar
2 cups unsweetened applesauce
1 cup nuts
1 cup raisins
3 1/2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 teaspoons soda

Cream sugar and butter. Add applesauce. Mix well. Add 1/4 cup flour to nuts and raisins. Mix spices, salt, and soda in remaining flour. Then add to sugar, butter and applesauce mixture. Add the nuts and raisins, which have been floured, and pour into greased and floured pan.

Bake at 275 degrees for 2 hours.

White Cake

1 1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup butter
2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 cup lukewarm water
1 teaspoon vanilla
4 egg whites

Cream sugar and butter together thoroughly. Combine cake flour and baking powder. Add this mixture alternately with water to creamed mixture. Then add vanilla and dash of salt.

Beat egg whites until stiff and fold into above mixture. Bake at 350 degrees in layers. Use powdered sugar or coconut icing.
