Council Passes Final Ordinance To Sell Bonds

The Morton City Council occupied itself with examining final papers on the contract between Columbian Securities Corporation and the City of Morton, on the sale of \$80,000 in revenue bonds, as it met Monday night.

In the first regular meeting with J. C. Reynolds as mayor, the Council adopted the necessary ordinance and signed the papers pertinent to the bond issue.

Bonds will arrive in about 10 days for final signature. Ralph Douglas, engineer, was

not on hand to display the proposed water and sewer construction. City Clerk Van Greene was absent still suffering from an attack of the mumps.

In the only other business attended to, the Council heard a committee of three Jaycees ask them to look into the need for a local zoning ordinance. Council members said they would refer the idea to Mr. Greene and have him check into it.

In 1953 Miss Hearn was on leave from her present position to serve as Home Economics Advisor to the USDA Foreign Agricultural Service assigned in La Paz, Bolivia.

A graduate of Mary Hardin Baylor, she attended a regional Extension school at Cornell in 1946, and was the first woman to be awarded a Carnegie Fellowship for extension workers to do graduate work at Harvard University in 1949.

Miss Hearn is a member of the American Home Economics Association and Epsilon Sigma Phi, national honorary Extension Service fraternity.

Elected Home Economist of the Year by the Texas Home Economics Association in 1954, she was named Woman of the Year by the Progressive Farmer Magazine in 1952.

In 1940, Miss Hearn served as Home Economics Consultant to the Advisory Commission of the Council of National Defense in Washington.

Prior to entering the Extension Service, she taught in public schools of Matador, Merkel, and Roscoe. She served as county home demonstration agent for three years, was specialist in Home Industries from 1934 to 1935, and district agent from 1935 to 1944.
