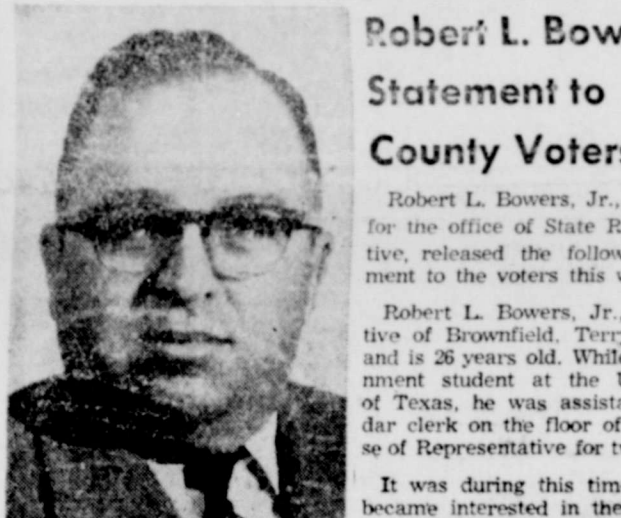

OUR SOIL ★ OUR STRENGTH

The time is approaching to give cotton its first watering since it was planted. This watering is very important for several reasons. It must be applied in such a way as not to damage the young plant. It must be applied as fast as possible in order to get over as much acreage as possible before the plants go into stress for water. The proper amount should be applied to bring the soil up to field capacity throughout the water extraction zone.

To bring the soil up to field capacity without wasting water the irrigator must be able to determine with accuracy the amount of water that is in the soil. This determination can be made by the ball method in which the moisture content of the soil is estimated by forming a small ball of earth and noting how it breaks when tossed into the air and caught in the hand.

With a little practice the irrigator will be able to determine the soil moisture quite accurately. There are also several instruments on the market that can be used to determine when and how much to irrigate.

SOIL BANK PROGRAM FOR FARMERS IN COUNTY

EXPLAINED AT MEETING

Friday June 22, about 100 farmers and interested businessmen attended the morning meeting to hear the Soil Bank program explained.

The County and Community Committee met Tuesday, June 26, in the ASC office to review the status of each farm by communities. There are five communities in Cochran County. Each community has three regular committeemen and two alternates besides the three county committeemen. The program was explained by the County Agent, ASC Committeemen, and Mrs. Ruth McGee, manager of the ASC Office.

The work was cut out for the Community Committee in that each community was given a list of the farms by communities showing acreage by years for base period, 1951 through 1955. These farms were grouped by communities with these data. The committees were confronted with the problem of grouping these farms by yield groups. The big problem among the committeemen was getting those farms grouped by yields not to exceed the county average of 152 lbs. per acre. Of course sandy land farms, dry land farms, irrigated farms and young irrigated farms had all these factors considered in finding a weighted average by respective groupings to come within the normal 5 year average allocated to the county. All the committeemen expressed dissatisfaction about the poor 5 year normal yield average given Cochran County by the State ASC Committee. Cochran County did not get what the actual yield made in in the 5 year average, because of the formula applied at the State office. The formula states that for any year in the 5 year base period that the lint yield per acre of cotton is less than 75 percent of the 5 year average, that year will be thrown out and the yield shall be raised up to 75 percent of the 5 year average. It further states that for any year that the yield per acre is over 125 percent of the 5 year normal average that the yield will be reduced to 125 percent of the 5-year normal average. This last gadget is the one that hurt Cochran County the most. Due to the fact that the formula factor was applied, has left Cochran County in worse shape as far as the yield was concerned.

The State Statistician had our five year normal average figured at 180 lbs per acre; so the formula supplied reduced the yield per acre average 28 pounds or to 152 pounds and the yield established by the State ASC Committee for Cochran County.

Cochran County sent a delegation to V. C. Child's, State Statistician office, Austin on June 11. At the meeting with him it was discovered that the Bureau of Census listed only 12 gins operating in the 1954-55 season, when, as a matter of fact there were 13 gins operating. The Bureau of Census listed one particular gin as inactive during the 1954-55 season.

The Cotton classing records of L. O. Buchanan, Cotton Classing Office, Lubbock, showed that this particular gin did have a definite number of bales classed that year in the office. This can be corrected on the county average, because it was a mistake, as soon as the operator of that particular gin files an affidavit stating the number of bales ginned and gross weight of those bales to the Bureau of Census and thereby giving Cochran County credit for cotton it did raise and gin in the county. The gin was preparing this affidavit early this week. It may not get into the Bureau of Census office in time to help this year on lint yield per acre average, but it can be adjusted for future years, when the facts are established.

ate. Those instruments can be bought at a reasonable cost and with care will last several years. Record books are supplied with most such instruments that can be used to keep a record over a period of years of the soil moisture at different periods after irrigation. The records will be very valuable in predicting the irrigation water requirements of a crop for the year in advance.

Besides being able to determine the moisture content of soil the irrigator must know the water holding capacity of the soil. By subtracting the moisture in the soil from the soil capacity he will determine how much water needs to be applied to bring soil up to the field capacity. SCS technicians assisting the Cochran Soil Conservation District will be glad to help farmers determine when and how much to irrigate and show him how to make soil moisture estimates in order that they will know how much water to apply at any time and thus prevent waste and reduce operating costs.

We need to get grain sorghum planted for that dead cover (spring grass planting). If we have efficient cover, grass may be planted around April 1st. Cover will permit early planting, control wind erosion and will help to control water erosion.

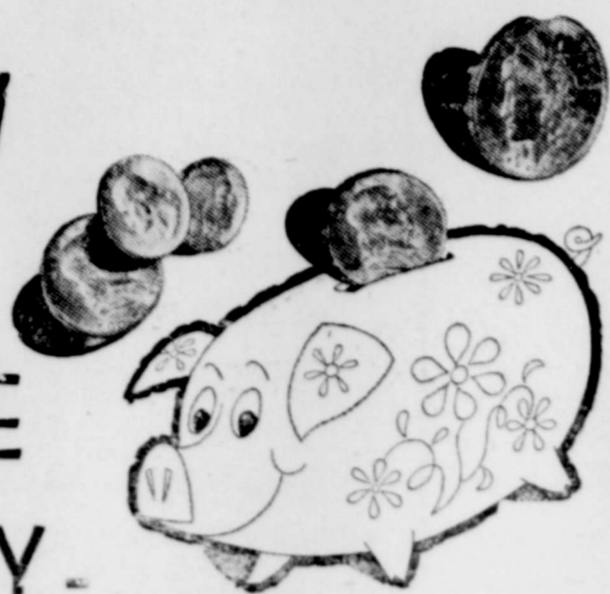

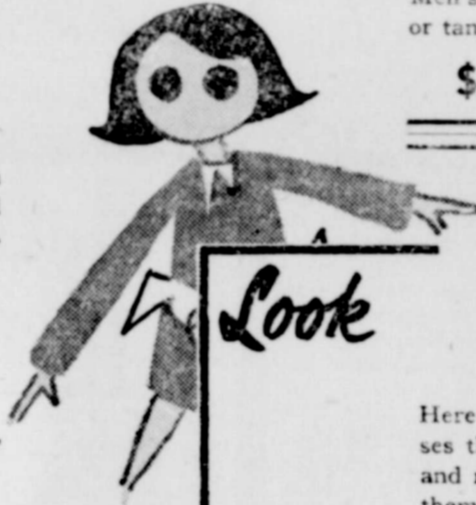

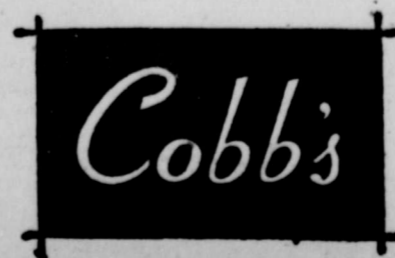
