on this crop. W. T. Owens, entomologist from the Texas Experiment station, says "False cinch bug infestations on grain sorghums have caused the use of a number of insecticidal mixtures which include materials not cleared for use on the crop.

The last communication from the state experiment station has listed toxaphene and malathion as mater ials which may be used on the grain crop, Parathion has been added to this list. The three materials may be used with the following restric-

Malathion may be used to within 10 days of harvest, parathien to within 21 days of hervest and toraphene to within 30 days of harvest.

DDT alone or in combination with other materials should not be used on the grain crop.

The County Agent also advices that you be sure not to use insecticides that will cause the grain sorghum to be condemned.



NUMBER ONE ON THE BALLOT (HJR 1) -Provides charge of racing with a motor vehicle. NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT (HJR 31) -Provides that any District, County, or Precinct official serving a fouryear term must resign before announcing for a different office there remains unserved more than one (1) year of the term for which he was elected.

NUMBER FIVE ON THE BALLOT (HJR 48) -Provides that a Home Rule City may provide by Charter Provision, and a City operating under the general laws may provide by majority vote, for a longer term of office than two (2) years for its officers, either elective or appointive, or both not to exceed four

NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT (HJR 17) -Provides for pension to retired Texas Rangers who are ineligible to partitipate in the Employes Retirement System of Texas, and their

NUMBER SEVEN ON THE BALLOT (SJR 4) -Authorizes the Legislature to make appropriations and establish procedure for advertising the historical .natural, agricultural, industrial, educational, recreational nd other resources of Texas.

NUMBER EIGHT ON THE BALLOT (HJR 36) -Gives the Legislature the power to authorize vendor payments for medical care in addition to the amount paid in the form of direct public assistance to and on behalf of needy recipients of Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent Children, or Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled; providing for the acceptance of funds from the Federal Government for the

NUMBER NINE ON THE BALLOT (SJR 3) -Authorizes the Legislature to create a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits to the City of Amarillo, Texas, and a county wide Hospita! District in Wichita County, Texas, and 5 Hospital Districts in Jefferson County, Texas.




