Each year, we at the Tribune office, along with newspapermen all over the country, find ourselves searching for new ways to define and capture what really is "the Christmas Spirit."

Not that the story of the birth of the

Christ child gets any less beautiful. Nor are we looking for a new way to commercialize an already grossly over - commercialized theme.

In a world where stark facts more often than not crowd the human interest completely off the pages of newspapers, this is the time of year when a simple story of a simple act of kindness, seems to us, to carry far more significance than the heroic, the sensational, or the bizarre.

We ran across a letter, some time ago, that we have been saving for this occasion. My Dear little friend, I think you are a wonderful little girl, and you, like many other girls and boys, are a source of sunshine and happiness to every mail carrier in America

we look forward to meeting you with your cheery smiles, I think, even more, than you look forward each day, to receiving the papers, letters, and packages, we bring to you and your family.

We carriers kinda' hate to see you grow up, because you forget us then, as you become interested in other things and other people. You no longer meet us with a cheery "hi" and watch us drive away with a wave of the hand, and "bye."

May God bless your life with much success and happiness, is the wish expressed in the first personal letter your carrier has ever written one of his little patrons.



In taking over from County Agnt Homer Thompson, who opened meeting, Chairman Cox showed art of five years of cotton plto receive an increase in cot-
