

I want once again to mention what a wonderful little community we live in with such caring and generous people to do things such as I have just mentioned. Thanks again!



Brian Herring and Chad Hamilton each had five-point efforts as the Chiefs took a 35-31 lead at intermission.


Muleshoe came back to outscore the Chiefs, 15-12 and 16-14 to snare the win by one point.
