


Bill, assisted by wife Carol of course, has been the official Friona NWS weather reporter for over 15 years. That means each day they record the high and low temperature, wind direction, and

the amount of moisture received.
The latter, moisture measurement,
doesn't keep a weather reporter
very busy in Parmer County but
Bill doesn't mind. He has a keen
interest in all things weather-related, including cloud formations
and tornado watching.







FCCLA Seeking Recipes For Heifer International

During the 2002-2003 school year FCCLA coordinated two multicultural fairs to benefit Heifer International. Heifer International is a charity that takes the saying, "give a man a fish and he eats for a day, but, teach him to fish and he eats for a lifetime", and puts it into practice. The charity provides animals to impoverished areas around the world.

Last year Friona schools raised enough money to purchase one heifer, two goats and three flocks of geese. These animals allow families to sell excess animals, milk, eggs, etc. For many families this help allows them to improve their diet, build or improve their home, and for many children it means they can go to school for the first time.

This year the FCCLA and Family and Consumer Science classes have partnered with the primary school, Mrs. Harris, Mrs. Larner,

Mrs. Brown, Mrs. Johnston, Mrs. Allen, and Ms. Wright's classes, along with the students in all the buildings for a new project.

Family and Consumer Science classes are asking all students in the Friona Schools to submit a recipe. The recipe can be for a food the students like to make, one they like to eat, or a family favorite.

The recipes will be put together in a cookbook tentatively named, "Friona Schools Feed Hungry Children". The cookbooks will then be sold and the profits will go to Heifer International. If you have not submitted a recipe for your children it is not too late.

The Friona JV Squaws, following in the footsteps of their varsity counterparts, are rolling along with a string of victories.


Tulia JV 52-Chiefs JV 43

High score in the loss was Patton with 13 points, Monreal had 10, Hutson 7, Sanchez 6, Monroe 5, Jameson 2.



TCP/TSSC Meetings Cover Key Cotton Issues; Address Cotton Research Priorities

Friday, December 12, 2003

College Station provided the backdrop for an informative set of meetings that brought Plains Cotton Growers representatives together with cotton growers from across Texas.

The PCG group participated in the meetings to discuss important cotton issues and hear updates on cotton research programs being directed by cotton producers through the Cotton Incorporated State Support Program.

The week started with a meeting of the Texas Cotton Producers organization. TCP is the statewide organization comprised of the nine regional cotton

organizations representing producers in Texas. TCP agenda items included: adoption of a 2004 operating budget, discussion of U.S. trade policy and its effects on cotton marketing and prices, boll weevil eradication, crop insurance, and reports on activities of the National

Cotton Council and the Cotton Board. A special guest at the TCP meeting was Dr. Ed Hiler, Dean of Agriculture and Life Sciences and Head of the Agriculture Program at Texas A&M University. Dr. Hiler discussed issues involving cotton and the Agriculture

Program at TAMU. The TCP group concluded their meeting with a luncheon with members of

the Texas Farm Service Agency and the Texas State FSA Committee. TEXAS STATE SUPPORT PROGRAM

One of the unique ways that cotton producers benefit from their Cotton Research and Promotion Program is the Cotton Incorporated State Support Program.

The State Support Program provides cotton growers across the nation the ability to direct the expenditure of CI research dollars in order to develop solutions for the key production and profitability challenges that they face.

The majority of this research addresses issues such as cotton marketing and economics, cotton breeding, genetic improvement, insect management, irrigation and fertilization management, weed control, production systems, as well as harvesting and ginning issues effecting harvest efficiency and crop

Members of the Texas State Support Committee met on December 10 and 11 to hear updates on the progress of research projects funded for the 2003 crop year. A total of 43 projects were reviewed during the two-day meeting.

Each year the Texas State Support Committee receives projects in six broad research categories: genetic improvement, pest control, fertilization/irrigation, production systems, harvesting/ginning, and marketing/economics.

For 2004 the Texas State Support Program has approved approximately \$790,000 to fund projects covering the full range of research areas. The biggest adjustment for 2004 was a renewed emphasis on getting individual researchers working on similar issues to work together. The goal is to build closer working relationships between both research organizations and the individual scientists involved.

The Texas State Support Committee also finalized the timeline for soliciting proposals and approving projects for funding in 2005.

THE CHIEF'S CORNER

By ROYCE L. GOODSON Chief of Police Friona Police Department

Most people have experienced the "oh no" feeling after seeing a police car in the rear view mirror. Most people hit their brakes, even if they are not speeding.

Personal reactions and experiences can influence perceptions of traffic enforcement efforts, and often prevent people from realizing its true benefits. Traffic enforcement is the most recognizable and universal police function. Marked police cars are easy to see and most Americans have been stopped for a traffic violation. Because of the punitive consequences attached to traffic enforcement, many do not have an appreciation for the positive benefits. Additionally myths can result from misconception about the goals and motivations of traffic enforcement. We need to dispel the myths and know the facts:

Myth-Traffic problems are not that big of a deal.

Fact-The average American is more likely to be involved in a traffic crash than be a victim of a crime.

Myth-If I am injured in a traffic crash, it affects only me.

Fact-Everyone pays for traffic crashes and economic costs are significantly more than crime. In 1995 crashes cost Americans \$150 billion dollars.

Fact—I personally have collected detailed statistics that show a dramatic increase in traffic accidents when traffic enforcement declines. The opposite occurs when there is an increase in traffic enforcement, the number of accidents decline.

Myth-Police Officers should be arresting criminals, not writing traffic tickets.

Fact—Traffic enforcement regularly identifies criminals and results in their apprehension.

A license plate violation resulted in the apprehension of the suspect in the Oklahoma City Federal Building bombing.

During 1994, traffic enforcement stops in Grand Prairle, Texas, accounted for 66 percent of all warrant arrests and 50 percent of the arrests made for non-traffic related offenses.

In Peoria, Illinois, an increase in traffic enforcement contrib uted to a six percent decrease in violent crimes and a twelve percent decrease in crashes.

Stolen vehicles are often recovered from traffic stops. Drugs, weapons, contraband and fugitives are all frequently found in vehicles during "routine" traffic stops.

Criminals normally get to work the same way as the average person, they drive a vehicle, and often the fruits of their crime can be found in the same vehicle they are operating.

September 1, 2003, a law was passed in Texas to protect law enforcement officers while they are conducting a traffic stop. The law now requires the following:

Drivers must vacate the lane closest to the emergency vehicle when driving on a highway with two or more lanes traveling in direction of the emergency vehicle; or slow to a speed not exceed twenty miles per hour less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 miles per hour or more, five miles per hour when the posted speed limit is less

than 25 miles per hour. When you see a car pulled over, remember that the law enforcement officer may be doing more than writing a traffic citation. The officer may be apprehending a felon, child molester, a murderer or removing weapons and drugs from your community. Traffic enforcement can, and does, contribute to the quality of life in your community.



Onion Poultice Miracle

Before the days of "wonder drugs", pneumonia was an extremely serious illness. A bout of pneumonia called for home remedies and helping a neighbor in need.

I believe my father would have rather helped someone than go hunting-and that's really saying something. He was an excellent shot and almost never came home without a deer, elk or moose to provide meat for months to come.

Mother canned much of it and made her special mincemeat, and my father made some of it into jerky each hunting season.

Back in the 1920s, we lived along a country road lined with a few small farms of about 4-10 acres each. We all had at least one cow, a pig and some chickens, and sometimes ducks and rabbits. The wives took charge of the children, the livestock and a large garden. The husbands worked wherever they could find jobs.

One winter, during one of Daddy's jobless periods, our neighbor Johnny became very ill with pneumonia. Daddy checked on him each day. One day he reported to Mother and me that it didn't look good. If the crisis didn't come soon, he was afraid Johnny wouldn't make it.

My usually jovial father quietly told Mother that they would have to make onion poultices for Johnny. They'd use a worn-out woolen blanket to make square poultices about the size of his chest and

My Mother immediately began sewing the bags and cooking sliced onions in a huge kettle on our trustworthy kitchen stove. I was big enough to keep the wood box full of split wood from the woodpile outside the kitchen door.

Daddy began filling the poultice bags with smelly onions. When he had filled four bags and sewn them shut, he put them in the roaster pan, jumped into our ancient Dodge touring car and drove over the icy, rutted road the short distance to Johnny's house. Minnie quickly put the poultices on Johnny's chest and back, holding them on with a towel pinned firmly in place. The two extra poultices were placed in the oven to stay hot until it was time to replace the first pair when they cooled. This continued throughout the night.

When Daddy finally came home early the next morning, he told us that Johnny's fever had broken in the night and the crisis had passed. Johnny would be all right, though he'd have to be very careful not to have a setback.

Johnny fully recovered in time for the birth of their sixth child, a little son. They chose to name him Walter, after my father. My father was proud and honored to have Johnny and Minnie's baby boy named after him.





CONTACT LENSES DESIGNED FOR BIFOCAL USE

It usually takes a few days to a week to get used to wearing contact lenses. Ads some more time if you plan on donning bifocal contacts for the first time. How long it takes to adapt may depend on the type of bifocal lens.

Segmented contacts work like bifocal glasses with the distance portion on top and close-up part on the bottom. Several visits to the contact lens practitioner may be needed to get the right fit. Bifocal lenses that allow both distant and near objects to be in focus at the same time are called simultaneous vision contacts. Although these lenses are simpler in design than segmented ones, some wearers cannot get used to them. A strong desire to wear contact lenses helps.



The monovision approach consists of wearing a contact lens on one eye for distance vision and on the other for near vision. Although this is a popular option, some individuals have difficulty with depth perception. Ask your vision-care specialist to suggest an alternative for your specific needs.

A Gift Idea for Christmas

BY ALVIN PETTY, Calvary Baptist Church of Friona

Here is a great gift idea for Christmas. Give yourself permission to learn to practice positive imaging. You already have the gift of positive imaging within you, from your creator. You need to give yourself permission to become aware of its power and practice it to change and improve your life.

Norman Vincent Peale is perhaps my favorite American minister. Over the years through his writing he has been my pastor and has helped me to successfully keep and live my faith more than any other one person. He wrote a book, "The Power of Positive Imaging".

In it he says that positive imaging is faith, or positive thinking carried one step further. You not only believe your desired goal is possible, "but you see or visualize it in your imagination and reinforce it in prayer". Constantly seeing the goal before you releases inner powers that work mightily to help you achieve the goal.

Peale was a rather shy and inhibited young man with great promise. But his self-confidence was lacking. A college professor challenged him to change himself and live up to his potential. He prayed for God to help him change. He came to realize that an image "vividly conceived and stubbornly held has a reality of its own". He became one of the twentieth century's greatest pastors and most beloved speakers.

The depth and intensity of focus of believing in the images does make the difference in how well positive imaging works for one. Jesus taught us to pray imaging the desired goal and acting as if we have it and then eventually we shall receive it (Mark 11:24). Christmas in 1940

It was our first Christmas at Boy's Ranch. Robert (my twin brother) and I arrived in February of 1940 and began what, for us, was the start of a wonderful and fantastic time of learning and doing that provided us with the knowledge and tools we used to deal with all the good times and bad times of our lives.

It was a time for milking cows twice daily, doing the chores that make up much of farm life, cutting trees into firewood, keeping the wood box filled, going to school and studying our lessons every night in front of the fireplace in the courthouse. And, it was a time for learning how to do things with our hands and how to think and do our best. We learned how to work together. These were only a few of our finest Christmas presents that year.

Sometimes I find it hard to recall what happened yesterday, or maybe last week, but it's very easy to remember that first Christmas. There were only 18 boys at the Ranch, and we all lived, slept and ate in the old courthouse that is now the Julian Bivins Museum. Our winters were cold, but filled with fun. We had one "retired" cow pony named Strawberry; Pet and Meg, our mule teams; five or six milk cows; a few chickens in an old bunkhouse from Tascosa days; and two lovable dogs, Jimmy and Scout. Our heat was the fireplace. We all wanted to chop wood, but the bigger boys usually won out, for using an ax and pulling on an old crosscut saw took a little more muscle than some of us had. We all got to carry the logs up to the courthouse though, one by one, till we had filled our woodbin.

That first Christmas was more than "presents" to us. Every day was a "present". But, there were actual presents too. In early September, the Ranch was visited by "Mother" Bivins, who came from her home in Amarillo to see us. She let each boy select, from a short list, the one thing that he most wanted Santa to bring him.

We wrote our name and what we wanted on a piece of paper and gave it to her as she sat in the courthouse living room, talking to us. Then, we helped her into her car, and we put our wishes away for later, hoping that they'd come true. Of course, they always did. Shortly before Christmas, Mr. Weeks, our Ranch Superintendent, returned from Amarillo, his auto packed to the roof with food and other "goodies", and of course, a present for each boy. On Christmas day, we all went into the living room, sat in a circle around our fireplace, and gave prayers of thanks for what we had. Then we feasted on punch, candies, popcorn and cookies before we opened our gifts. There were other, more practical gifts to excite us as well. We ate much and we grew fast, so we were always in need of shoes and clothes. Mind you, many of them weren't new in those days, but they were clean, and seemed to always be what we needed the most. Even now it's hard to put into ordinary words how much we appreciated all the donations that came from every direction to keep us clothed, fed, healthy and happy.

In 1940, our cook, Ms. Massie Owens, lived in one room upstairs in the courthouse. She cooked for everybody, six days a week, on a wood burning stove in the kitchen at the rear of the courthouse. She performed culinary miracles in her tiny kitchen. Homemade rolls, roast turkey and ham, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce, sweet potatoes topped with marshmallows, all the foods that we had dreamed about for months, we had for our Christmas Day meal-one that will remain forever in my memory. And, of course there were the "leftovers" that we enjoyed for several days

You see, in those days, the Ranch was young, and of course,

so were we. We grew up as parts of one another until, without realizing it, we became as one. The love and discipline of those who watched over and guided us, the skills we learned, the training and ideas implanted in our minds during our stay at the Ranch came together in a way that enabled us to go out and make our way through the lives that we've been living.

To be sure, all our days weren't happy ones. There was much work and we had to do it all. We had goals to meet and were required to give answers if we didn't meet them. We had to study, clean a million dishes and eating utensils every day, sweep, mop, dust and stand "inspections", then go outside to do the many things needed to take care of our animals and keep the Ranch going. Older boys helped the younger ones, both at study as well as work. When someone fell behind, there was always loads of help from his buddies.

I will forever remember the visits of Mr. and Mrs. Farley who, more often than not, would surprise us, suddenly arriving at the Ranch for a short visit from the office. As busy as they were, and faced with the problems and challenges they had to meet everyday, they made time to be with us, the boys, who stopped everything but their chores while they were at the Ranch.

There are so many things to remember about the early days at Boys Ranch. The ordinary folks who gave part of what they had to the Ranch, who drove the then dirt and muddy roads to get to us, bringing clothes, canned goods, often homemade cakes and cookies, so many things, all of which we needed desperately.

I thank my Lord for my first Christmas at Boys Ranch. And, I won't ever forget to say "Thanks" in my thoughts and prayers, for all those who somehow saw to it that our needs were met.

Christmas in the 1930s

I was the middle child-not the middle child in one family, but in between aunts, uncles and cousins on my father's and my mother's sides of the family. All three families were close and we celebrated holidays together, taking turns hosting the rest of the

No one had a table large enough for the crowd, so we children had a separate table where we were served after the adults had loaded their plates with the abundant, mostly homegrown food. No one even thought of turkey during those Depression days; all three families raised chickens, and two or three roasting hens were a treat.

Without enough chairs to go around, we sat on the piano bench, end tables and apple boxes. Because we kids knew we could depend on Cousin Barbara spilling her milk, we never relaxed, but were ready to jump up to old. avoid the flood.

After dinner, if it wasn't pouring rain-as it frequently was in western Washington-we played cops and robbers or cowboys and Indians. The boy cousins supplied the firepower with their cap guns, al-

though we seldom had storebought caps. But we didn't need them; we just yelled, "Bang-bang!" The only arguments arose over someone who disliked what we who was "dead" at any given time.

we never would have expected multiple gifts like we exchange today. My best present ever was a delightful surprise, even though I at the sewing machine after my bedtime. 
You see, Jesus didn't come to earth just to give us a touching story of a baby in a manger. He came to die!

As the boy turned to go back out into the blizzard and head home, the principal swallowed hard and blinked back the tears, because he knew that this boy's name was on the list of underprivileged children who were to receive gifts from the Santa's Helpers Fund.

This boy had within him the true spirit of Christmas: unselfish, sacrificial love. That's the good news of Christmas, and that's what keeps us going. It happens right in the middle of all the confusion and chaos. I hope and pray that you see it, hear it, feel it, and share it this year...as never before!


