IF YOU HAVE NOT had a servic call from the telephone company
lately, it could be that you need to know some of the new policies whic have sprung up as part of the recent "deregulation" of telephone companies.
Last year, the Public Utilities
Commission, in approving ate Commission, in approving a smaller
rate increase than General Telephone Company was asking, gave blanke approval for sweeping changes by the telephone company
structure for service calls.
If you report a telephone out of
order, the receptionist at the business order, the receptionist at the busines
office will tell you something like " am required to inform you that if the trouble turns out to be in the wiring of your telephone, th
minimum charge of $\$ 17$
minimum charge of $\$ 17$
Previously
servicedsly, the telephone company customers were paying a monthly lease, at no charge to the customer Now, if they come into your home or place of business, there will probabl be a charge of at least $\$ 17$.
Not only that, but the telephone PUC which would permit Genera Telephone Company to charge up to $\$ 25$ per jack for replacing faulty wires in a telephone. If the jack itself has to charge.
A service call for a telephone user could run as much as $\$ 77$ per visit, if
the proposal is passed by the PUC o May 19.
If you can unplug your telephon and bring it by one of the ser established, it won't cost you
anything to have a faulty telephone repaired. Being able to unplug th 'phone may then be the only problem, as only the newer style
telephones are designed to unplug from the jack.
If you have a telephone that you have purchased and are using on your system, the telephone repairman will work on this type of 'phone at th
same charge system as noted above. If you refuse to let the repairman work on a telephone, preferring to do it yourself, this is well and good, bu the company can disconnect you in the meantime, and then charge yo an additional $\$ 20$ to reconnect. th the past year's rate increas were approved by the Public Utilities Commission.

of their service in the future.
