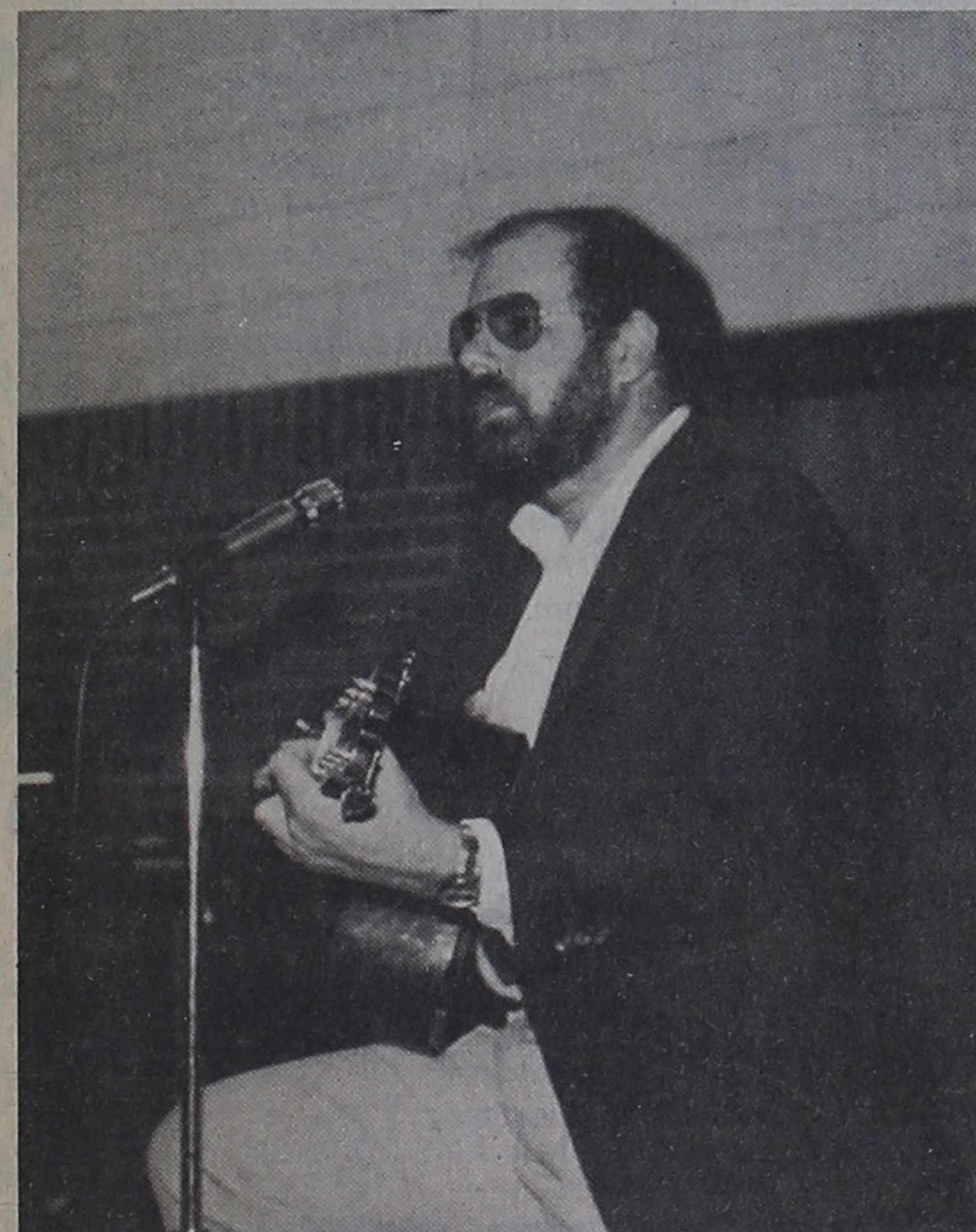

Moss Takes Lead In Football Contest

For the third week in a row, the Friona Star's Football Contest has a new leader.

Tommy Moss, head football coach and athletic director at Friona High School, who has been pushing the leaders most of the season, showed what he could do when he wasn't having to spend all his time coaching.

Moss came up with a score of 18 for the week, and captured the contest lead with a score of 183. He holds a one-point lead over Kent Patterson, the second-place contestant, who stands at 182.

Prior to last weekend, Moss and Patterson were in a three-way tie for the lead with Mike Field of Dalhart. Field's score for the week was 15, and he slipped into a tie with R.L. Blakely in fourth place at 180.

Bruce Patterson and Rick Tullis are tied for third with scores of 181. Complete scores of contestants can be found elsewhere in this issue.

Two weekends remain in the annual contest, with a cash prize of \$100, along with bragging rights awaiting the winner.

In the weekly contest, two entrants managed scores of 19 right for the week: Jerry Bentley and Clyde Renner. Bentley claimed first place for the week on the basis of the New Orleans-Pittsburgh tie-breaker score.

Bentley picked New Orleans to win, 28-20, missing by five points as the Saints won, 27-24. Renner had picked the Steelers to win, 24-20, missing the exact score by seven points. Renner took second place in the weekly contest.

Third place in the weekly event went to Vicky Moss, (the coach's wife), one of eight contestants to correctly pick 18 games. Her tie-breaker prediction of 20-24 won out over the others.

Combest In Visit To Friona

Congressman-elect Larry Combest visited Friona on Friday, November 16 to express his appreciation for the vote of confidence he received from the many citizens of Parmer County. Combest, making a district-wide tour, visited the public at Friona Industries last Friday afternoon.

"Your interest in good government and support in this Congressional race means a great deal to me," Combest said. "I thank you for your input, your assistance and your vote of confidence on November 6."

"I encourage your continued input and please feel free to call on me and my office staff at anytime," Combest said.

On January 3, 1985, Larry Combest will be sworn in as the new U.S. Representative from the 19th District of Texas. Until then, preparations are underway to assemble the staff for the Washington, Lubbock and Odessa district offices.

The Congressman-elect also expressed an interest in a mobile office which would travel throughout the 19th District on a regular basis.

During the 99th Congress, Larry Combest said the major issues he will be facing include the 1985 Farm Bill, decreasing the federal deficit and ensuring that the decontrol of natural gas begins in January.

Not a one of the contestants entering the eleventh week of the contest picked Dallas to lose to Buffalo (only the editor expected them to lose when he put the game on the list). So, no points were gained or lost by the big Cowboy upset.

The next-to-last contest week will be played this weekend, with entries due in by 6 p.m. Friday. The concluding list of games, to be played next weekend, appears elsewhere in this issue.

School To Seek Bids On Drapes

At the regular meeting of the Friona School Board last Monday, the board voted to advertise for bids for new back drapes and improvements to the lighting system for the high school stage.

The bids are to be received until 7 p.m., Monday, December 10, at which time they will be opened at the next regular meeting of the board.

A new grade point system, making differentiation of grade points earned in advanced courses, regular courses and basic courses was approved by the board, and will be used in the determination of honor students beginning with the 1984-85 freshman class.

Basketball coaching duty assignments were presented to the board.

Also discussed was the need for additional classrooms at the high school for 1985-86, due to recent curriculum changes and requirements. Further study of this matter is to be made.

Club Launches Annual Project

Modern Study Club, in conjunction with the Friona Star, will sponsor "Project Christmas Card" in Friona for the 29th consecutive year, it was announced this week.

The project benefits Parmer County Community Hospital during the Christmas season each year, and in the course of its previous 28 years has raised over \$60,250 to purchase equipment for the local hospital.

Church Sets Advent Series

Advent services will be held at the Immanuel Lutheran Church at Rhea beginning on Wednesday, November 28, at 7 p.m., it was announced this week.

The special series will continue each week on Wednesday evenings at the same time, for four weeks.

"We invite you to attend these special services," says Rev. Leonard Riddle, pastor.

Equipment which cost over \$45,750 has been provided in the past 13 years by gifts to the project. Last year the project raised \$4,258 to provide heating and cooling for the hospital's X-Ray laboratory.

Mary Moseley, chairman of Project Christmas Card for 1984, says that money raised this year will go to help pay for the recent re-paving of the hospital's parking lot; and for the purchase of new office furniture to equip a new doctor's office, and for a possible new accounting machine for the office.

With the pending retirement of Dr. Lee Spring, the hospital has been attempting to find another doctor to locate in Friona and associate with PCCH and Friona Medical Clinic.

The paving job was done recently while a paver was in town, and was paid from the hospital's general fund, and the cost, around \$5,000, caused this fund to "sag."

Residents of the area are requested each year by Modern Study Club to donate to the fund rather than mailing Christmas cards to local friends.

Names of those contributing are published on a full-page in the Christmas edition of the Friona Star, as a community-wide greeting to everyone in the area, as well as those outside the area who receive the paper. The Star donates the full page to the project each year.

Donations may be left at Friona State Bank. Club members were also placing containers and posters at some 25 local businesses, where residents may leave their donations.

Deadline for donating to the fund and being a part of this year's project will be Friday, December 14.

There is no set amount for the donations, but families are requested to donate at least the amount of money they would normally spend on Christmas cards and postage, mailing to friends and relatives.

Mrs. Moseley, chairman of the 1984 project, has as members of her committee Mary Pryor, Debbie Sweatt, Estelle Caffey and Lois Norwood.

In recent years, the project fund has purchased a heart monitoring unit, automatic beds for the new hospital wing, heating and air conditioning for the emergency and surgery rooms, fire alarm system for the building and an anesthetic machine.

Also, a Coulter counter, a monitor for the surgery room, a spirometer (a device to measure pulmonary functions for lung patients), I.V. drip counters, a table and carts for the operating room and a new light for the emergency room.

Beginning in 1970, the project has selected a particular object or need for its funds, and in that time has purchased equipment costing roughly \$45,750.

Project Christmas Card has been a fine way for residents of the area, and even former residents, to say "Merry Christmas" to their friends, and at the same time assist Parmer County Community Hospital.

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

....from the files of The Friona Star

55 YEARS AGO--NOV. 29, 1929

What might have been a most destructive fire at the gin Tuesday evening was averted by wise management and presence of mind of the overseer, Mr. Waddell. Some cotton became ignited, and Mr. Waddell kept the machinery in motion until the burning cotton reached the press, where it was covered with other lint and bound up in a bale and discharged, so that the only loss was the bale of cotton.

50 YEARS AGO--NOV. 30, 1934

Many farmers of this locality are still busy sowing wheat; the rain that fell two weeks ago delayed planting. Some of these farmers had been waiting for the moisture to complete their seeding operations; others had not sown any, and still others find themselves obliged to resow much of their acreage that had already been sown earlier but failed to get a stand on account of lack of moisture.

45 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1939

Reports reaching the Star office are to the effect that work on the Parmer County REA project is progressing at a most satisfactory rate, and that present indications are that the lines will be ready for energizing by the early part of December. Workmen are busy wiring homes of the subscribers so as to be ready for the current as soon as the lines are ready to receive it.

40 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1944

The biggest crowd in Friona's history is expected for the district

title game which will be played on Thanksgiving Day in Friona between Friona and Hereford. Friona and Hereford won the right to play last week when the executive committee of the district met. Three teams, Friona, Hereford and Tulia, tied for the district's co-championship, but Hereford and Friona drew the right to play to see who represents the district in bi-district play.

35 YEARS AGO--NOV. 25, 1949

The Rev. George Meyer of Baker, Montana, will arrive here during the week, and will preach at the Congregational Church Sunday morning. Rev. Meyer is coming here to look over the situation with a possible view to accepting a call to locate here as pastor of the church.

30 YEARS AGO--NOV. 26, 1954

Less than \$9,000 stands in the way for construction planning for the new Parmer County Community Hospital, manager Jimmie Baxter said this week. The organized drive is still underway to secure the needed funds in the next few days, and over one-third of the contacts remain to be made in Friona alone. At last accounting, \$32,594 was in hand on the project with another \$8,688 on the books as pledged.

20 YEARS AGO--NOV. 26, 1964

Nine members of the 1964 Friona Chieftain football team were named to the all-district teams chosen by District 3-AA coaches at a meeting Monday at Olton. Four of the players, tackle Dale Milner, fullback Doug Dodd,

tackle Gene Weatherly and halfback Milton Hargus, were selected to the first teams. In addition, halfback Danny Murphree, tackle Ray Braxton, guard Bob Sims, center Bing Bingham and end Larry Buckley were named to the second teams.

15 YEARS AGO--NOV. 27, 1969

Lazbuddie's Longhorns, out for their second straight class B bi-district championship, will face a Groom team bent on revenge when the two meet Friday night at 7:30 p.m. at Panhandle.

The last service to be conducted at the old building of the Union Congregational Church will be held next Sunday morning at 11 a.m. The adobe building, which the members of the church have been using for 47 years, will see its last use as a place of formal worship on this date.

10 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1974

Boswell and Crafton, Inc., Contractor, has begun reconstruction work on the first section of State Highway 214 from the Bailey County line, north to Clay's Corner. Work will include the reconstruction of the grading, structures, flexible base, and asphalt surfacing to a 26 ft. travelway with 9 ft. paved shoulders.

Lars Asbrink of Stockholm, Sweden, was a visitor in Friona the week of November 8-14, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. W.A. Cochran. The Asbrinks were the host family for Kay Cochran, who was an American Field Service exchange student to Sweden during the summer of 1973.

5 YEARS AGO--NOV. 25, 1979

Friona's 1979 United Fund drive topped the 100 per cent mark this week. Co-chairmen Danny Kendrick and Larry Knowles, reported that as of Wednesday noon, a total of \$10,934 had been deposited at Friona State Bank. This represented 103 per cent of the 1979 goal.

As of Thursday, November 22, 8,005 bales of cotton had been ginned in Parmer County.

New Pact To Lower

Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) has negotiated contracts that will significantly reduce costs customers eventually pay for hauling coal by rail from Wyoming mines for use at SPS power plants, company officials announced today.

New contracts with the Burlington Northern Railroad and the Santa Fe Railway will lower costs of delivering coal to the power plants by about \$27 million in 1985, said Bert Ballengee, SPS president and chief operating officer.

"The new contracts will save our customers an estimated \$790 million through the year 2002," Ballengee said.

Ballengee cautioned, "These contracts provide an excellent overall savings for customers. We're lowering fuel costs by some five to six per cent. But, of course, purchasing fuel on the open market--as we must do--remains expensive for us, as it is for everyone."

The new contracts will hold down the average SPS residential customer's electricity bill by about \$1.07 per month, Ballengee said. The reduction could begin as early as January 1985.

Check Safety To Make The Holidays Bright



- Before hanging strings of lights, spread them on the floor and check for frayed or bare wires, cracked insulation, loose connections, and damaged plugs or light sockets.
- Check extension cords for wear or damage and don't run them across walking areas.
- Test lights before putting them on the tree. Unplug them before making repairs or replacing bulbs.
- Overloading circuits with too many lights can cause fire. Follow manufacturer's instructions about the number of lights allowed on one circuit.
- Choose a fresh, green tree, trim its base and keep it in plenty of water. If the needles are brown and break off easily, it could be a fire risk.
- If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it has been tested for flammability by Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Place your tree away from the fireplace or other heat sources and out of the traffic pattern.
- Never string lights on a metallic tree. Light strings with damaged insulation can electrically charge a metallic tree. Instead, shine unattached colored floodlights or spotlights on the tree.
- Always turn off lights before leaving home or going to bed. You'll save money and be safer, too.
- Never use lighted candles on a tree or near evergreens. And don't burn evergreens in the fireplace.
- Do not use inside lights on the outside. All outside lighting equipment, including lights, cords and plugs, should be waterproof and made for outdoor use. Also, hang sockets downward and don't leave a socket empty.
- When hanging lights on the rooftop or in tall trees outdoors, stay clear of electrical lines. Make sure you or your decorations don't come in contact with them.
- Should you receive a CB radio or television this Christmas, let a qualified serviceman install the CB base unit or television antenna for you. This delicate job is best left to the professionals.
- Be sure electrical toys are tested for safety. Look for the UL mark.

Myrl Buske has started her 80th year off in style.

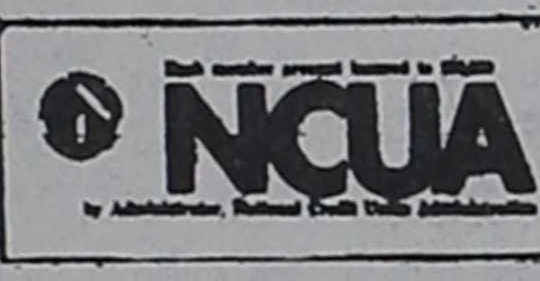

Sgt. Hernandez Reports For Marine Duty

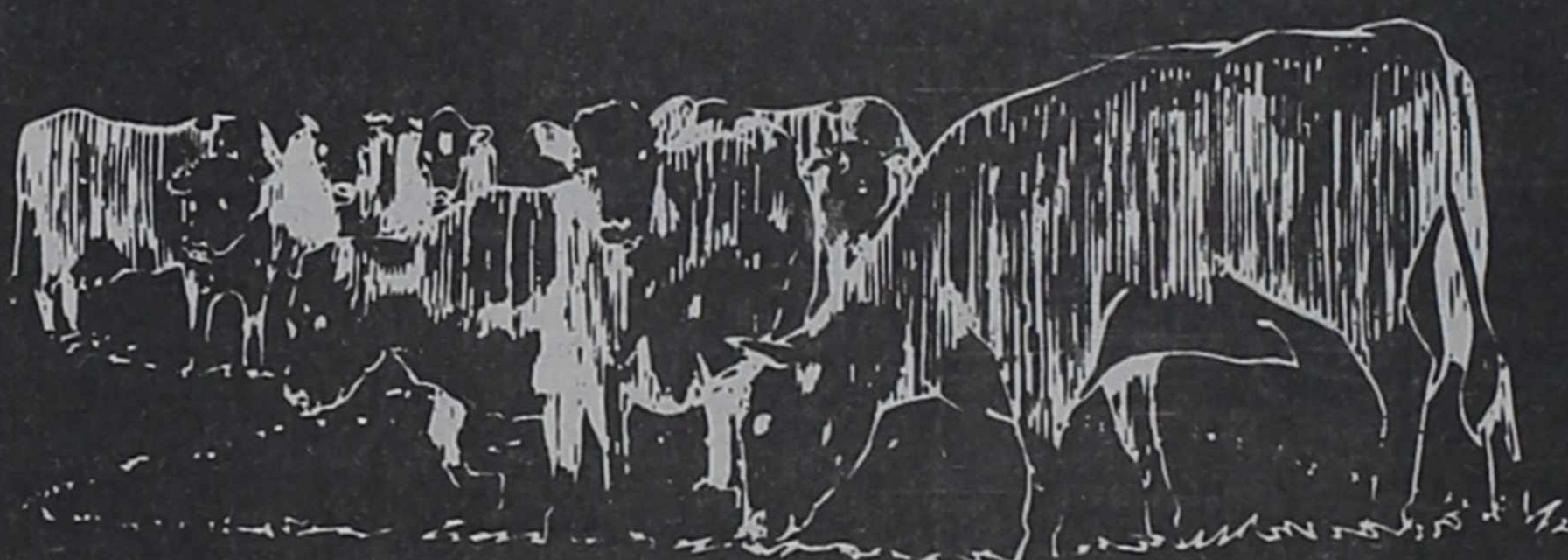
