

Since New York and Philadelphia are the two principal cities to which poultry from West Texas is shipped. and since the various states quarantining against Texas commodities because of the hoof and mouth disease. has caused general misapprehension among a number of shippers in the promulgation of the rules by various states, we desire to state that so far as New York and Pennsylvania are concerned the following will apply:

New York: Dressed poultry from Texas may be shipped into, or thru New York State if accompanied by certificate issued by Federal or Liv-Stock Sanitary, Commission inspector of Texas certifying poultry originated outside infected ereas to be packed according to amendment No.

Pennsylvania: Dressed poultry orginated in Texas permitted into and thra Pennsylvania if fouls are slaugh tered under the inspection of U. S. Bureau of Animal Industry and have passed such inspection and passed and marked accordingly

It will be observed that the regulaions of Pennsylvania are much more drastic than those of New York, and all practical service routes for this will be necessary for us to comply with the Pennsylvania regulations in order to move through that state.

Mr. J. E. Boog-Scott, Texas Live Sanitary Commissioner, and Mr. J.S. Hershey of the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe railway, are both actively interested in this matter.

Since the organization of the present company in 1895 it has not failed in any year to earn its full interest, nor since dividends have been declared to earn them in full. The Preferred Stock dividends are limited to 5%. The first payment was made in 1898 at 1% and in 1900 full payments of 5% were begun and have been maintained for the ensuing 25 years without interruption. Common dividends were begun in 1901 at 31/2% and have been maintained steadily since that date with gradual increases, 6% having been paid since 1909.

For the railroads, as a whole, the records of the Interstate Commerce Commission show that at the close of 1923 there were 807,524 stockholders, or 30,392 more than the preceding year. The average dividends on the outstanding stock amounted to \$4.03 per share.



They made an amalgam of lead and the with which they "siltheir mirrors, and conquered the attention of all Europe, and the other parts of the world then com-

Venetian mirrors were almost priceless, so highly were they esteemed. Vincent de Beauvais, writing in 1250, declared that the mirror of glass and lead was a marvel and the best of all. Kings tried to make arrangements through special emissaries and ambassadors to have mirror makers come to their courts-but in vain. The Venetian doges proclaimed a law that my glass maker carrying his art into a foreign state should be forced to return; if he did not, his closest relatives were arrested and imprisoned as hostages.

Should be still remain at the court of a foreign king, special agents were sent to bill him and destroy his establishmert. This state of affairs lasted until the reign of Louis XIV of France, when Colbert, the famous minister, began to break up the Venetian monopoly of mirror making. In the face of all the disastrous laws of Italy, he imported twenty artisans from the mirror guild of Venice, and established them in Paris, in the Faubourg St. Antoine, where they enjoyed the prefection and patronage of the

Thus was the mirror industry firmly established in France. Later on, when t was safe, these artisans were distributed to other parts of the kingdom, and several manufactories started in the provinces.




