Witnesses said that two men wearing black clothing and masks entered the business, made patrons lay on the floor, and robbed the attendant. They fled in an unknown direction. One lady customer was taken to Clovis Regional Hospital, and later released, suffering from anxiety over the incident.

The suspects were said to be black males, one six-feet tall and the other six feet five inches tall and skinny. Both were wearing black clothing and black and silver bandana masks.



# Poll Shows Neugebauer Lead

Neugebauer's campaign shows Neugebauer lead- lican candidate for Congress. ing his Democratic opponent by eight points. The poll was conducted by Glen Bolger of Public Opinion Strategies. Bolger is one of the Republican Party's leading pollsters who has been called upon to judge the political landscape in several high profile races around the country, including the recent Toomey/Specter Senate race in the Pennsylvania Republican Primary. The goal of Bolger's firm is to conduct the most accurate poll possible in order to give his clients a true picture of their race.

"Randy Neugebauer maintains a solid lead over Charlie Stenholm," Bolger said. "Randy's favorables have increased ten points as he becomes better known in the new part of the [19th] district. It is very difficult for Stenholm to win in this solid conservative, Republican, Bush district."

The poll of 500 likely-voters was conducted June 28 and 29 and showed Neugebauer with 47% support to Stenholm's 39%. The poll also revealed that Neugebauer now has 79% name recognition, a ten-point increase from last January. The increase comes as voters in Abilene, and other areas, which were added to the 19th Congressional

A poll commissioned by Rep. Randy District, recognize that Neugebauer is their Repub-

'We have worked hard to get to know the people in the new part of the district. We have traveled from Abilene to Graham to Hereford and nearly everywhere in between. Our support in that part of the district has been very encouraging," Neugebauer said.

Rep. Neugebauer's lead is stronger among voters who are more familiar with both candidates. Among 66% of voters tested who have heard of both candidates, Neugebauer leads 49% to 40%. And when all voters polled learned more about the two candidates, Neugebauer's lead grew. When voters heard positive descriptions of both Stenholm and Neugebauer, Neugebauer's support grew to 55% while Stenholm's remained unchanged at 39%.

Neugebauer said, "We are getting the message out that I am a conservative Republican who is going to support President Bush, oppose the efforts by Democrats to raise taxes, and continue to defend the interests of agriculture. That is the message that resonates with people in the Big Country and the South Plains. This poll shows that a majority of people in the 19th Congressional District share the same beliefs that I do."



#### International Driver's License

It seems that in the last several months we have had several Tino P. Information received is that these licenses are being sold for \$150 to \$400 or more and the majority of them are being sold predominately to Spanish speaking consumers.

General, Greg Abbott, thousands of victims are paying hundreds of dollars for these bogus licenses, and these unsuspecting consumers are made to believe that they are legitimate and would la ley. allow the consumer to drive legally in the state. These bogus documents are not recognized by any law enforcement agency.

Most of the companies advertise heavily in the Spanish language, using deceptive misrepresentation that the license is valid. These companies prey on unsuspecting immigrants, who have moved here to make Texas their home. #### **PCG Officers Discuss Insurance Issues**; **TCP Contingent Make Washington Rounds**

LUBBOCK, July 16, 2004 By Shawn Wade PCG President Rickey Bearden and Vice President Mike Hughes traveled to Washington, DC July 12-14 with cotton producers from across Texas to discuss cotton issues and reinforce the importance of the current Farm Bill to USDA officials and members of Congress.

Bearden and Hughes were in Washington as part of a Texas Cotton Producers group seeking to discuss current cotton related issues and to reinforce the strong working relationship the cotton industry has with USDA personnel and Texas Congressional representatives.

During the trip Bearden and Hughes joined the TCP group to visit congressional staff and hear reports from key USDA agency representatives.

The TCP group met with several members of the Texas Congressional delegation. Meetings were conducted with Representatives Ron Paul (District 14), Randy Neugebauer (District 19, Mac Thornberry (District 13), Chet Edwards (District 11), Max Sandlin (District 1), Soloman Ortiz (District 27), Henry Bonilla (District 23), and Texas Senator John Cornyn. Meetings were also held with representatives from the House and Senate Agriculture Committees.

Jim Butler, USDA Deputy Under Secretary for Farm and Foreign Agricultural Services, David Hatch, Associate Administrator of the Risk Management Agency, Al Jennings, Director of the Office of Pest Management Policy, Scott Sanford, Farm Service Agency Fibers Analysis Group, and, Carol Skelly, USDA World Outlook Board, provided updates on cotton related programs and issues.

In addition to the scheduled meetings they conducted on behalf of Texas Cotton Producers the PCG officers also met with representatives of the Risk Management Agency to discuss the current deferred appraisal period for non-emerged seed and to jumpstart the process to find a solution that meets the needs of the producer in the field and the Federal Crop Insurance Program.

During the meeting several options were discussed and progress made toward development of an equitable solution. The ultimate goal is to develop a solution that can be initiated in 2005 crop year.
