

Whitney said those arrested Sunday are suspects in the October robbery. He said the Clovis robberies are "very similar" to another October Dairy Queen robbery in Amarillo.

The three men are being held in the Parmer County jail pending extradition to New Mexico, Whitney said.

At Cargill Friona, safety is not just a priority, it is a mission. The plant recently reached a milestone of 6.7 million workhours without a lost time accident. In recognition of the accomplishment, all 2,000 employees received Cargill jackets with lettering that reads "Cargill Friona Tx, Leaders in Safety".

According to General Manager Jarrod Gillig, the Friona plant has consistently led the company and industry safety record "The key to that success is the dedication of the people here to create a safe place to work," Gillig said. "Our goal is to prevent all workplace injuries and insist that all work be performed safely. Our people make that possible."

few minutes with four of those veteran employees: Safety Manager James Rudd (20 years), and safety officers Freddie Bermea (13 years), Joe Bowens (14 years), and Oralia Zallar (12 years). Each is responsible for safety and training in different areas of the plant, Bowens in maintenance, Bermea in the fabrication area, and Zallar for the 400-500 line workers.

Employees are trained and retrained to Cargill standards in areas of safety around the machinery and on the grounds of the plant. All employees wear different hard hats designating their employee status. Mrs. Zallar wears a red hat, Mr. Bermea's is gold, designating them as a part of the safety team.

Mr. Bowen, who was wearing a black hard hat with a Pittsburgh Steelers logo on the side, is responsible for safety practices throughout the vast equipment maintenance required at the plant. Outside contractors are on site at the plant every day. Some even maintain offices



Padma's Mexican Mac & Cheese

BY RON CARR

Grab some ditalini and goat cheese and whip up some Mexican Mac & Cheese. It is easy says Padma Lakshmi, author of Tangy Tart Hot and Sweet: A World of Recipes for Every Day. Padma says this recipe serves 4-6 and is an easy Thanksgiving dish (if you're tired of the same old Thanksgiving casseroles).

Mexican Mac & Cheese

2 tbsp olive oil

1/2 cup diced shallots by I word and a postfort I are

3-4 pickled jalapenos or pickled Serrano chilies, minced.

1/2 tsp dried Mexican oregano

1/3 - ½ tsp raw sugar

8 tbsp (1 stick) butter 4 cups whole milk

2 cups ditalini or elbow macaroni

1 1/3 cups grated cheddar cheese 1 cup grated mild jack cheese

1/3 cup goat cheese

1. In a large ovenproof skillet heat olive oil. Add shallots and chiles and stir. After 2 minutes add oregano. Sprinkle sugar over shallots, stir for 3 minutes. Once shallots begin to caramelize, turn heat to low and add butter.

2. After 2 minutes add milk and stir. Add macaroni. Turn heat to medium. After another minute sprinkle in 1 cup of cheddar cheese, jack cheese, and goat cheese. Stir for 30 minutes.

3. Preheat oven to 350.

4. Remove skillet from heat and sprinkle rest of cheddar on top. Put skillet in oven for 10 minutes, then broil for 3-4 minutes until cheddar is lightly browned.


Cassie Moseley is one of top-ranked barrel racers

I know of a professor who made a point concerning the complaints and worries of his soon-to-be graduates. They were asked to come to his home and have hot chocolate.

He made the best hot chocolate in the world, and on purpose, he laid out 30 cups of differing types: some very expensive; most were plain, everyday cups, but some, styrofoam. The ones who arrived first picked the fancy cups and the plain ones. Styrofoam was soon the only choice. Every student made comments about their cups without realizing not one cup added a thing to the quality of the chocolate. Some cups even distracted from the chocolate.

The moral: Well, it's not about economics where there exists a theory where we should all have fancy cups, or the other one where we should all have styrofoam. It's not even about choice.

It's not quite like the old Buddhist story of the monks comparing their individual masters to one another's, until one monk said, "What if the master was like the moon, and all should reflect one light? What would happen if we all point the same direction?" It wasn't long until they all began comparing each other's hands. Cups are more like the last sentence - they're vessels.

We miss the point when we focus on another as better or worse. Sure, people and things are different, no doubt. Some better at some things, some worse. But when we compare, we had better pay attention to how we feel about ourselves when we find someone better and someone worse. One leads to envy, the other, pride. Unawareness distracts us from how we feel about the other too.

Life is the hot chocolate. We are the cups. Or is it the other way around?



Water district sets hearings on rule revision

"This second phase of rule amendments includes changes suggested to us by constituents at earlier public meetings in each district directors' precinct, changes requested by the district's board of directors, and changes recommended by staff to clarify existing rules," said General Manager Jim Conkwright.


