## Commissioners to decide on procedure for JP office

At their regular meeting Monday June 9, county commissioners will determine the procedure for filling the office of Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace. The position is vacant due to the death of JP Valton Howard. Mr. Howard died in a motorcycle accident Friday May 23.

County Judge Bonnie Heald said the vacancy will probably be filled by election on the November ballot. Candidates for the position will have to file as write-in candidates. Filing dates will be from July 27 to August 22. The filing fee is \$375 or by petition with at least 50 signatures.

Judge Heald said even if the commissioners appointed someone now they would still have to run for election in November to fill the remaining 2+ years of Howard's term. In the interim, Precinct 2 Justice of the Peace Vi Hutto and Precinct 3 Justice of the Peace Pam Haseloff will cover Precinct 1 business.

Mrs. Hutto said most people do not realize the extent of the duties of a Justice of the Peace. "It is more than just traffic tickets," she said. If an elected candidate has no experience there is a requirement of 80 hours of training in Austin. Plus continuing special

schools are also required for all JPs.

"We are also required to attend to both civil court and criminal court matters along with other routine duties," Hutto said. Additional information will be available after next week's commissioners meeting.

## Co-Op Gin holds annual meeting

The Friona Farmer's Co-Op Gin annual meeting was held Thursday May 29 at the junior high cafeteria. Jimmy Rogers, CPA, of Rogers, Cross, Hanby, & Co., LLC of Plainview, gave the financial report. The gin produced 10,152 bales in 2007. In past years the gin had baled over 30,000 bales but cotton production in the area was down all around due to many producers switching to corn.

Rogers said the gin had a profit of \$119,526 for the year ending March 31, 2008, thanks to a 2006 seed dividend from the oilseed mill. He told members that the financial condition of the gin is as good as it has ever been with over \$600,000 in

operating capital.

Board president Mitchell Wiseman said the board is in the process of interviewing gin managers and had narrowed the candidates to three. He credited previous co-op manager Jerry Butman with the success of the gin operation. Butman resigned earlier in the year to take a position with a gin operation in Lubbock. He had managed Friona Farmer's Co-Op gin for more than 20 years.

In the board election for two expiring seats, incumbents Butch Preston and Cris Ingram were re-elected to the board. Other board members are Wiseman, Raymond Hamilton, John Jarecki, Davy Carthel, and Gene Welch.

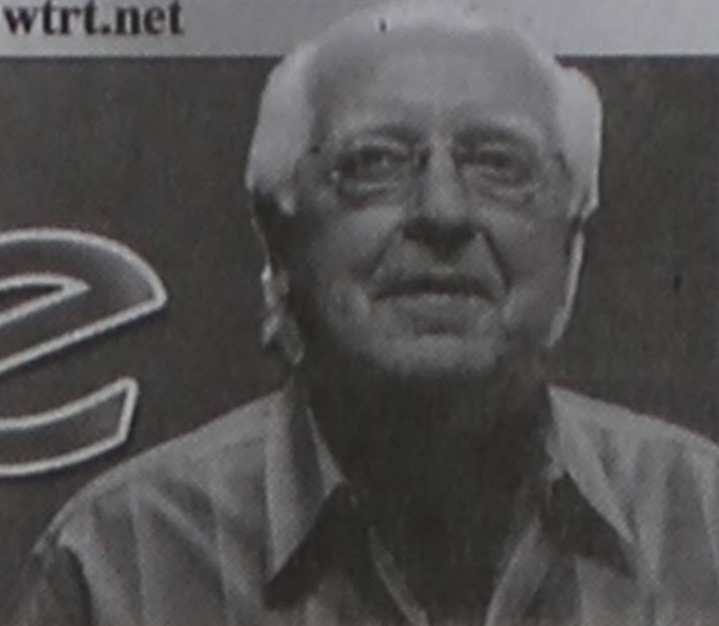

## life is in the classifieds

Often I browse the classified ads in the Amarillo or Lubbock newspapers.

It is only out of curiosity or maybe boredom. I don't need a job or a used pickup. Just curious about stuff.

Every week newspapers like ours get emails from strange sources across the country wanting to place classified ads. It is usually for "bad credit? no problem!" and includes a toll free number.

They will include instructions such as run the ad for the next 25 weeks and request us to email back for a credit card number. We don't accept credit cards and we also don't run those kind of ads from anonymous sources.

There was a time when big newspapers carried 'personals' ads for lonely people seeking other lonely people so they could get un-lonely together. The internet matchmaking sites have eliminated newspaper companionship ads. Folks can hook up a lot faster these days on the computer.

I like to scan the job ads in the big papers, especially the shady ones that make big promises. For instance last Sunday the Insurance Education Centers of America had a big classified in Ama-

riilo that said, "Average starting salary of \$85,000 a yr. Sometimes more. A lot more!"

The smaller print said you had to go to classes for four months to become a highly trained, licensed and job ready insurance adjuster. It did not say how much the classes cost.

We have all been politically correct for years. You can't be a janitor any longer. Janitors are extinct. Janitors became custodians. Secretaries became administrative assistants.

Here is an ad for a 'contract supervisor'. Sounds good. You will be supervising people with disabilities picking up debris, spot litter, and picnic areas along the highway in Vega and Groom. I'm sure we called that something else a long time ago.

Another asked for a warehouse generalist for a veterinary company in Hereford. You have to be squeaky clean to get this job because they dispense veterinary drugs. This is legal distribution of controlled substances. You'll get a lot of benefits, holidays, and even tuition reimbursement but first you will need to undergo pre-placement tests, drug screens, background checks, and on-site interviews.

It is not easy breaking into the warehouse generalist field.

Still another ad gets right to the point: "Aren't You Curious?" it says in a big headline. Major Corp. Expansion. 23 FT pos. avail. Start tomorrow. \$3198/Month.

There is an 806 phone number which appears to be in Amarillo but no other information about your duties. Who cares? \$3198 is a pretty nice chunk of change. I could work a month and quit and still be ahead.

You should be able to figure out from ads like this one that it might be a little smelly. But then again maybe not. If they hire 23 fulltime people at \$3198 a month that is an added monthly payroll of \$73,554. The saying "ain't no free lunches" comes to mind.

Some ads bring a smile. Like the one seeking a "Trainable cattle handler." By god boy if you ain't trainable don't be wasting my time. We got cattle trucks to unload here. Untrainable cattle handlers need not apply.

Classified ads work in small town community newspapers like ours. People look at the Star classifieds to see who is hiring, who is moving, or

who is selling stuff, then the Sheriff's Report to see who has been to jail, and Court-house Notes to see who sold their property to who.

Since our newspaper hits the street by Thursday noon every week I'm surprised more weekend garage sales aren't advertised with us. Of course sticking a flyer on the window at the drug store costs a lot less. I'll be honest. It bothers me when I see your garage sales, estate sales, puppies and pickups for sale on our local cable channel and not in the newspaper. Folks out in the country don't receive WT Services cable but most do read the Friona Star.

Many folks think advertising doesn't work and is too expensive. Not so. An average classified in the Star ranges from \$8-\$16. The minimum is only \$5. We sell space, so the larger the message the more the cost. You can say a lot in just a few words.

Here is the bonus. Our classified page is put up on our website every week making it accessible to anyone in the whole wide world. At no extra charge.

Even Thrifty Nickel can't match that.

## HISTORY OF FRIONA STATE BANK 1908-2008

(Part 1 of 2. Continued next week)

Friona State Bank traces its beginning to June 1, 1908, when George G. Wright, owner of George G. Wright Lard Company of Kansas City, opened the first bank in Friona. On the first day \$3,736.62 was deposited.

The bank opened as First State Bank and was located in a wooden frame building on the south side of Main and 6th St. The first stockholders were George G. Wright, L.H. Russell, L.H. Henschel, W.W. Ryan, John Saxine, W.D. McMillan, M.R. Dick, and H.H. Seamond. Mr. Wright was president but not active as he spent much of his time in Kansas City.

The bank's first manager was M.R. Dick, Cashier. On March 4, 1909, Mr. Dick resigned as cashier and director. J.M. Denton was elected cashier and director. He managed the bank until May, 1909, when D.W. McMillan became manager.

### Beets, milk chocolate, eggs? What tha...!

Chipotle Beet Brownies, three words that should not even be used in the same sentence. It says stir 50 strokes with a spoon. If you happen to stroke it maybe 55 times do you have to start over with the recipe?

Here is another monster creation from the Family Features folks. Don't know who comes up with concoctions like these. Surely someone in the food lab prepares and tastes them. Must be brave souls.

Whip up a batch of beet brownies and let me know how they were. By the way, we don't make these recipes up. So here goes:

### Chipotle Beet Brownies

Prep time: 15 minutes  
Cook time: 28-30 minutes

- 1 jar (16 oz) Aunt Nellie's Sliced Pickled Beets
- 1 box (19.5 oz) milk chocolate brownie mix
- ¼ cup vegetable oil
- 2 eggs
- ½ tsp ground chipotle chile powder
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips or chunks
- Confectioners sugar (optional)

1. Preheat oven to 350. Lightly spray bottom of 9 X 13 inch pan with nonstick cooking spray. Drain beets, reserving ¼ cup beet juice. Combine beets and beet juice in blender. Puree until smooth; set aside.

2. Combine brownie mix, oil, eggs, pureed beets, and chili powder in large mixing bowl; stir 50 strokes with spoon. Stir in chocolate chips. Pour into prepared pan. Bake 28-30 minutes as directed on package (what package?). Remove from oven, cool, lightly dust with confectioners sugar if desired.

Makes 24 brownies. Or how ever many you want to slice.

In early 1909 construction on a brick building on the corner of Main and 5th St. was begun. In the fall of 1909 the bank moved to the new location. The building became the bank's second home and housed the operation for the next 40 years.

On February 16, 1914, George Wright sold his interest to A.W. Henschel who was then elected president. Details of the next few years are vague. On November 25, 1919, the bank received a charter from the State of Texas Banking Department and was chartered as Friona State Bank. Henschel remained as president.

On Monday morning, September 20, 1926, the bank was robbed. It is reported that Mr. Henschel, cashier G.D. Anderson, and assistant cashier Jess M. Osborn were the only ones in the bank when three armed men entered. The money was still under time lock in the vault. The robbers had the three employees go into the vault and

close the door. They made off with \$90.28, money that was taken in Saturday evening and early Monday morning. On Wednesday, September 22, 1926, Henschel, Anderson, and Roy Cox went to Amarillo to identify two men that Amarillo officials thought were connected to the robbery. On their return the car overturned near Summerfield and Henschel was killed. On January 31, 1927, Margaret M. Henschel, his wife, became the bank's third president.

On June 3, 1927, the bank was robbed again. This time \$3,681.10 was stolen. One of the robbers was Jim Bryant who was later arrested and tried. He received 14 years in jail. The other robber was Red Cummins who was captured three weeks later in El Paso. He also served 14 years. Mrs. Henschel was active in the bank until July 22, 1930, when Bruce McLean and Esther Noble purchased the bank. McLean was elected president and Noble was cashier and manager until February 2, 1935 when Charles McLean, son of Bruce, became manager.

On June 30, 1936, the bank was robbed again. Those present were Mr and Mrs. Charlie McLean, bookkeeper Orma White Flippin, and a customer, Hugh P. Lee. The two armed made off with \$964. In less than a week they were arrested in Fort Worth. One of the men, Herbert Alvin Stanley, had been serving a 99-year sentence in

Huntsville for a 1930 murder in Fort Worth. The other man was T.C. Britton. He also had a criminal record. The two were tried and sentenced to terms in Alcatraz by the federal court in Amarillo.

Other bank officers during the 1930s got their start in Friona and later made their claim to fame in other cities. Cashier Jesse Osborn had moved to the Friona area as a farmer. When he went to work for the bank he turned his farm over to his brother Claude. Jesse later became president of Muleshoe State Bank and served several terms as state representative.

G.D. "Gabe" Anderson who served as president of the Security State Bank of Farwell for many years, also worked as cashier at Friona State Bank. He had known Osborn in Arkansas. They bought stock in the bank in 1925.

After World War II Charlie McLean went into the military and his wife managed the bank. On April 3, 1944, five local men purchased the bank from the McLeans. The five were F.L. Carson, J.G. (Red) McFarland, Sloan H. Osborn, J.R. Roden, and Frank A. Spring. Osborn was elected president and Spring was elected cashier and chief executive officer. He was elected president September 30, 1959, and served until his retirement on September 30, 1971.

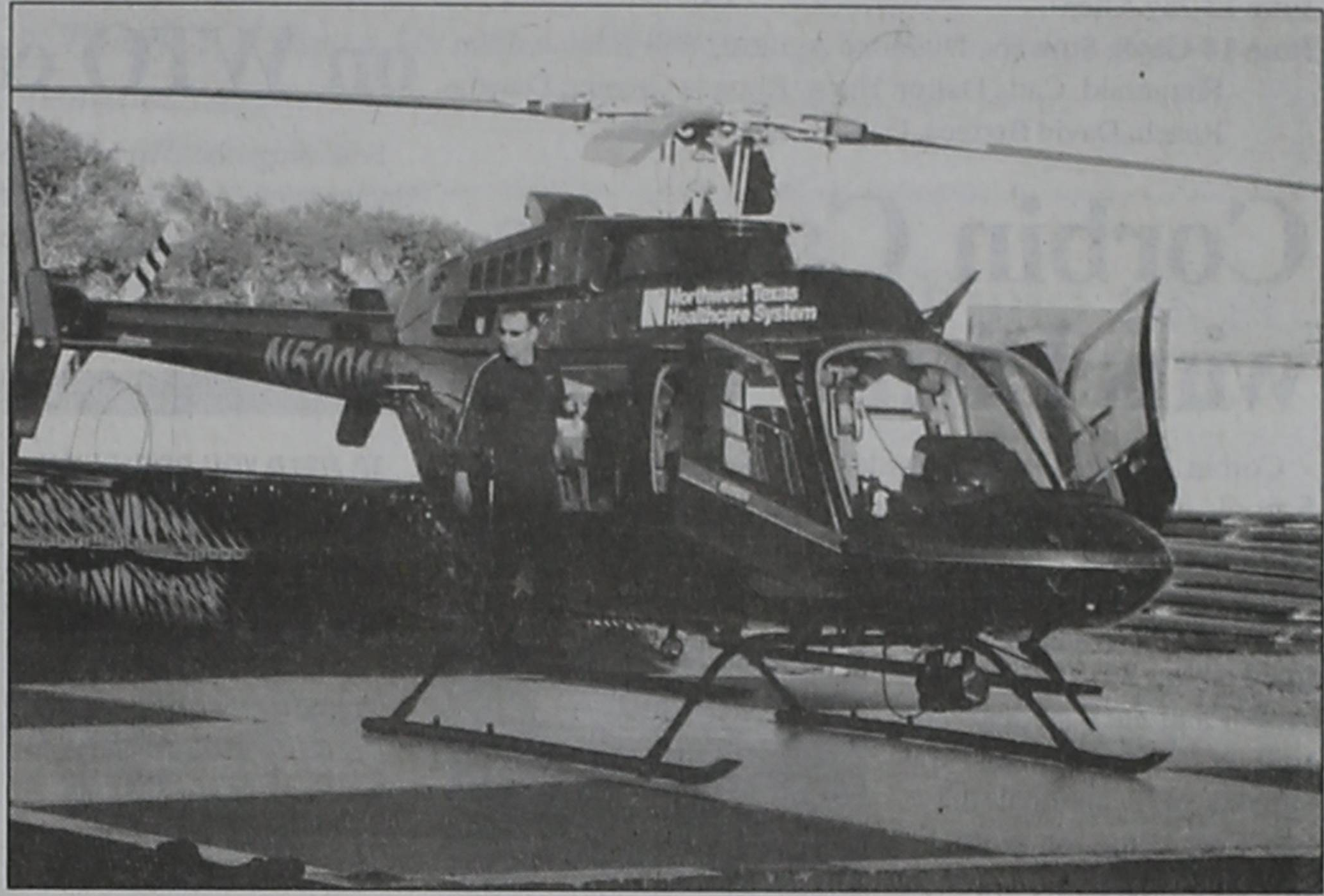

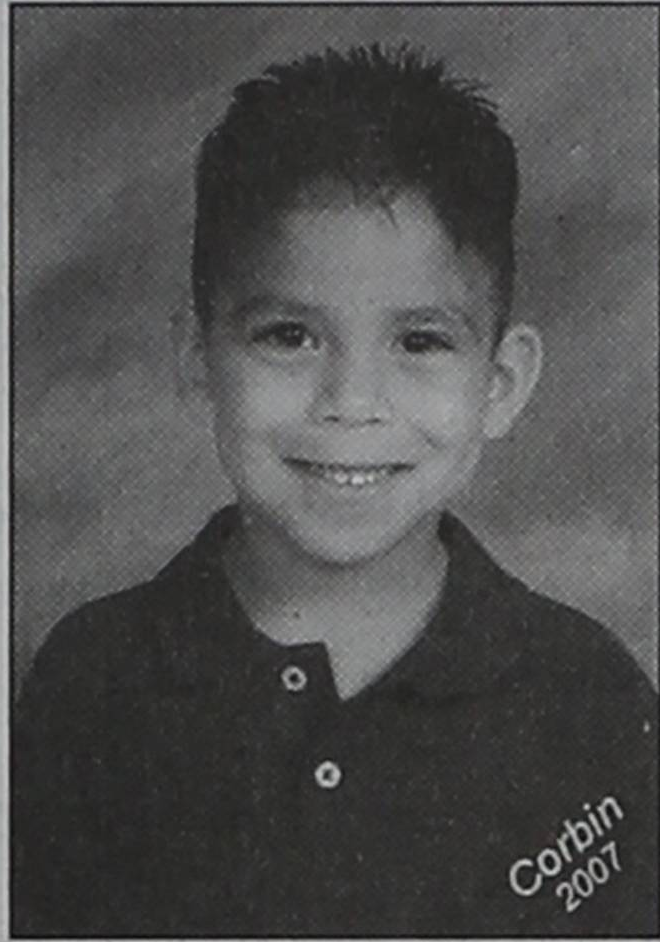

## Neugebauer statement on WTO cotton ruling

Following the World Trade Organization Appellate Body's ruling on the U.S. appeal of the Compliance Panel decision regarding cotton, Congressman

Randy Neugebauer released the following statement:

"Once again, I am disappointed by the decision made by the WTO. I firmly believe the United States was correct in its appeal of this decision. For the WTO to find that the United States had not complied with the original cotton case after we have made changes in our cotton program, specifically eliminating Step 2, just doesn't make sense.

"Since the original case, cotton production has decreased in the U.S., while at the same time it has increased in other countries such as Brazil and India. With higher prices now, there is very little farm program spending. Additionally, the 2008 Farm Bill makes further changes to the cotton program.

"This decision by the WTO is out of date because it could allow Brazil to take actions against the United States based on a cotton program and a cotton market situation that are both significantly different today than when this case started."

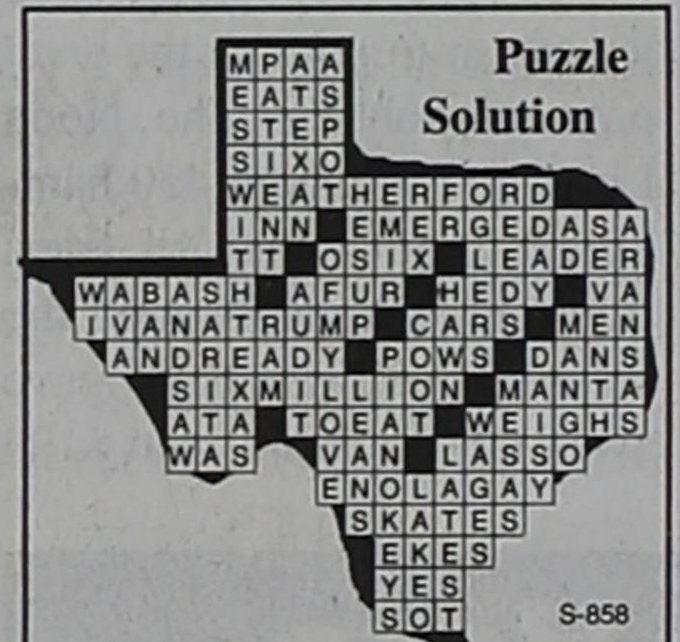

## DPS launches commercial vehicle safety effort

The Texas Department of Public Safety will inspect commercial vehicles throughout the state during Roadcheck 2008, a 72-hour intensive inspection program that runs from June 5 through 7 throughout North America.

DPS Commercial Vehicle Enforcement troopers and noncommissioned inspectors, along with Highway Patrol troopers who have received specialized training in commercial vehicle inspection, will stop thousands of commercial vehicles to inspect safety equipment and check driver log books, driver licenses and endorsements. Inspectors will also look for possible drug or alcohol use.

"It's been a successful program in making sure truckers and commercial vehicle owners meet proper safety requirements," said Chief Randall K. Elliston, head of the Texas Highway Patrol. "The bottom line is we will remove unsafe vehicles from the roadway and issue tickets as necessary."

During Roadcheck 2007, inspectors examined 6,051 vehicles in Texas. As a result, troopers removed 1,659 vehicles and 259 drivers from service because of the serious nature of their safety violations-both numbers were an increase over the year before.

The Roadcheck program, which stretches from Mexico to Canada, is designed to reduce commercial vehicle highway fatalities through increased vehicle safety. The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA), which sponsors Roadcheck, reports a significant decrease in the commercial vehicle crash rate in North America since the program's start in 1988.

Vehicles passing inspection receive a CVSA decal exempting the vehicle from inspection for a 90-day period, unless they have an obvious safety defect.

This is the time of year when Gypsy Moth eggs begin to hatch and their troublesome, destructive little caterpillars begin to feed on trees, shrubs, and all sorts of native plants that are in bloom. The Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources began aerial spraying of more than 220,000 acres of state and private forestlands in 27 counties in late April as a way of reducing the Gypsy Moth population after several years of relative respite from this costly insect pest.

This year a team of aerial spraying professionals from Aero Tech, Inc. arrived in Carlisle, PA, on May 5 to begin mid-state spraying. Doug Carthel and Cleo King were on hand to pilot Aero Tech's larger Air Tractor 802A aircraft while four other planes operated by Bruce's Flying Service of Arlington, GA, joined in the effort under Aero Tech's management.

"We have a very small window of opportunity," Carthel said during a testing period before flying operations began May 7. "We begin fly-

ing at daybreak and fly up until about noon, depending on several conditions. Those conditions include things like wind speed, hu-

midity, temperature, and probability of expected rainfall. The spray material needs to have six hours on the trees before it rains or it can be washed off the plants."

since 1984. He has been with Aero Tech since 1994. In Pennsylvania the spraying project included coverage of about 115,000 acres

flying. Carthel raises cotton, wheat, corn, and milo on his 850-acre farm. He also raises mixed-breed feeder cattle.

Carthel said he really enjoys flying the Air Tractor 802A. "This plane is outfitted for firefighting as well as crop spraying," he said. "It is equipped with a GPS computer controlled system that regulates the rate of application of the spray material, and logs the data. At the end of the day we download the information into DCNR computers and that way they have a detailed record of where we sprayed and how much we applied. The information also includes the weather and flight conditions such as altitude, speed, wind direction, and of course, GPS coordinates."

"With these Air Tractor 802As we usually fly four to five sorties per day," Carthel said. "They have an 800 gallon capacity for spray material and that is in addition to a full fuel load." He said that with the plane's 1300 horsepower, jet turbine engines, and large high-lift wing construction, the 6,500-pound (empty) plane has a tremendous load-carrying capacity. They are capable of taking off fully loaded weighing 16,000 pounds.

When Carthel isn't flying spray planes he makes his home on a crop and cattle farm in Friona, Texas. He said he has a farm manager who has been with him for many years and does a wonderful job while he is away

# New Ag Engineer to boost irrigation

Nich Kenny has been on the job for a month finding out just how the water flows in the Texas Panhandle; irrigation water, that is.

Kenny, a Texas AgriLife Extension Service agriculture engineer, joined Leon New in the Amarillo District office in April to learn how the AgriLife Extension system works with county agents and clientele.

"My goal is to become very familiar with all the irrigation systems here so I can provide expertise as farmer's needs arise," Kenny said. "Leon is my mentor in the process, with his 40-plus years of experience in this area."

New is the AgriLife Extension irrigation specialist in the Panhandle, and has coordinated crop-watering programs ranging from row-water irrigation to center pivot and drip irrigation.

"Nich is eager to learn the irrigation systems and crop production practices and get out into the field to work with producers, especially in

the area of irrigation power and fuel requirements and pumping costs," New said. "This is where I think he will excel and be a special resource to farmers during this fuel price crisis."

Kenny, a native of Yuma, Arizona, earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Arizona in Tucson, and most recently served as president and owner of NPK Inc., an engineering and agricultural applications consulting company.

In that position, he said he oversaw projects in Arizona concerning effluent reuse facilities, landfill and waste handling operations, wildlife habitats and a variety of irrigation methods, including flood, drip and sprinkler. "Engineering principles are universal, but the implementation is dependent on the local practices and parameters," Kenny said.

Soil and weather conditions, crop timing and scale of operations are all different here, as well as water quality

and quantity, he said. Another difference is the wide variance between progressive and traditional producers, with the challenge being to meet each operation's unique needs.

"Nich has an excellent ag

engineering background and has some excellent practical knowledge of irrigation systems, so I am excited about him joining the AgriLife team in Amarillo," said Dr. Galen Chandler, AgriLife Extension district administrator.

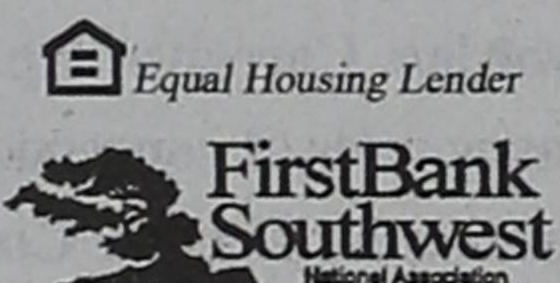

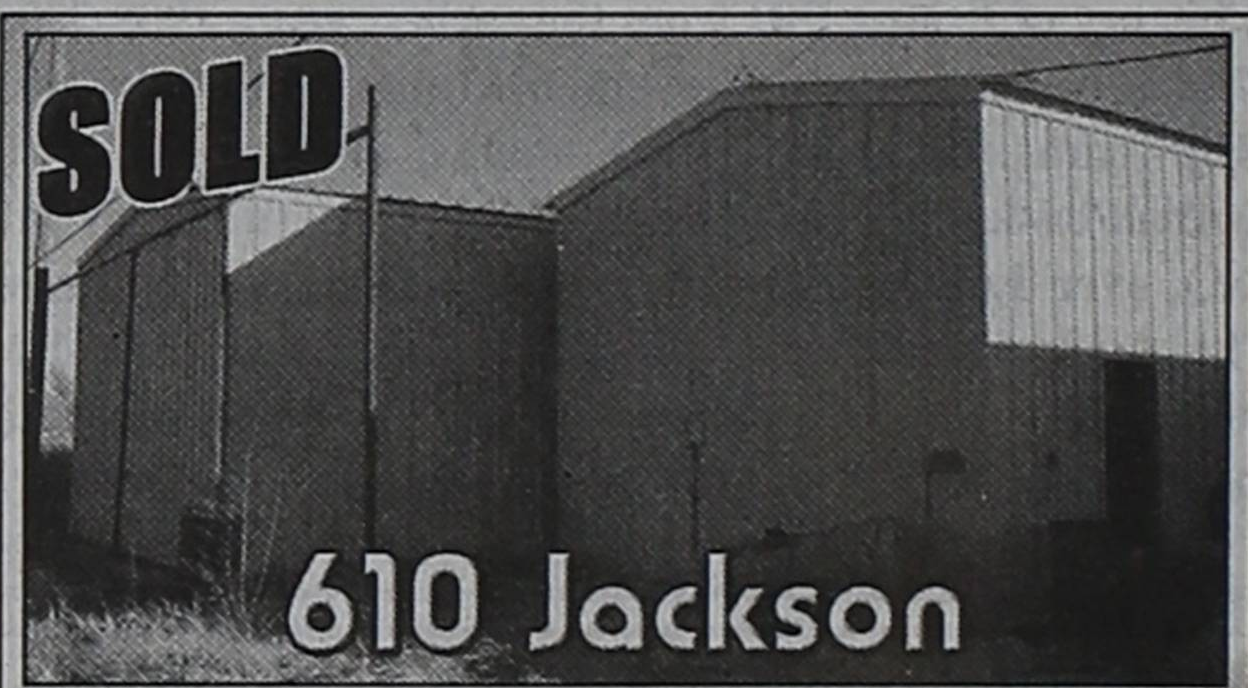

Friona school memories of (As told by her daughter, Mary)

Mary Eulelia Wiley's family were time residents of Friona. Her parents, Rose Wiley, her sisters Alice and brother Melvin Wiley, raised their parents and sisters are buried in Friona. The following is submitted by Mary Wiley. Before my mother's death on May 19, 1966, I spent many hours studying stories of her life. She was born November 8, 1919. Due to ill health of her father, in 1921 moved with her family to Friona where they were early settlers and long residents.

She had three sisters, Ella, Alice, and two brothers, Melvin and Sister Anna was 16-months old when Mary and they were always together lived on a farm located about 5 miles southeast of Friona. At this time was a small town and the school was a gathering place for the community and church services were held there. The family attended services in the school until the Church of Christ was built.

## Friona Schools Centennial Review

**Friona school memories of Mary Eulelia Wiley**  
(As told by her daughter, Mary Lee Boston)

Mary Eulelia Wiley's family were early settlers and long-time residents of Friona. Her parents were Ralph Grier and Rose Wiley. Her sisters Alice Whaley and Ella Dukes, and brother Melvin Wiley, raised their families in Friona. Her parents and sisters are buried in the Friona Cemetery. The following is submitted by Mary Lee Boston:

Before my mother's death on March 24, 2008, at the age of 96, I spent many hours sitting with her, listening to stories of her life.

She was born November 8, 1911, in Snyder, Oklahoma. Due to ill health of her father, in 1925 when she was 14, she moved with her family to Friona where they were early settlers and longtime residents.

She had three sisters, Ella, Anna, and Alice; and two brothers, Melvin and Ralph. Sister Anna was 16-months older than Mary and they were always together. They lived on a farm located about 5 1/2 miles southeast of Friona. At this time Friona was a small town and the school building was a gathering place for the community and church services were held there. The family attended services in the school until the Church of Christ was built.

Mr. Reeve and some other men decided that Friona needed school buses. Several trucks were bought and big, box-like affairs with seats inside were mounted on the trucks. They were painted a dark red. Friona was the first school district in Texas to have buses.

One morning as Reuben Gisler, the bus driver, drove along the road between Hub and Friona, the bus turned over. Mother was behind in a second bus and watched as the bus slid off the wheels. The children had to walk part of the way to school on a muddy road.

She and her sister Anna and brother Melvin were the first to be picked up on the bus route and the last to be delivered home. This made them arrive home in the late afternoon when chores needed to be done. Then they gathered around the dining room table with a coal-oil lantern for light to do their homework.

There are two books in mother's library that were her cherished possessions, a music book and history book she had while in Friona high school. She and Anna sang in the Glee Club, which was only for girls. Boys and girls sang in the Choral Club.

Mr. Conway, the school superintendent, was their director. They had chapel once a week where they would sing songs, say the pledge of allegiance, and Mr. Conway would give a talk. Up until the end of her life Mother could recite poems that she had memorized in school. She could also sing some of the songs she learned in the Glee Club.

Mary and Anna were members of the Society Clubs at school. All students in high school were divided into two groups: Anna belonged to the Tomahawk Club and Mary belonged to the Montezuma Club. The purpose of the clubs

was to provide entertainment for the school. She also told me she and other girls went down on the field to cheer the football boys. These were happy times for her.

Mother sold eggs at the grocery store in exchange for school supplies. For the Junior/Senior banquet the girls invited the boys. She asked Harry Hamilton. Since she and Dorothea Benger did not have evening gowns, two of their teachers, Miss Odom, the P.E. teacher, and Miss Ruth Holmes, the Spanish teacher, offered to loan them dresses.

They went to Mrs. Horton's home where some of the teachers boarded. Dresses were hung on nails in a large bedroom to keep them from wrinkling.

As a fundraiser Miss Holmes and the students made hot cheese sandwiches to take downtown. They went up and down the street at noontime yelling, "hot cheese sandwiches" but they did not sell one sandwich. So they all had a picnic after school.

During the summer before Mary's senior year her sister Anna and her husband Pearl Taylor, introduced Mary to Pearl's brother Roy. He fell in love at first sight. That fall she started her senior year and was looking forward to graduation with her class.

Roy came to see her and while they were sitting in his new car watching football practice at noon, he asked her to marry him. She wanted to wait until after graduation but he persisted and they were married November 2, 1929. She later finished school at the American School of Chicago, Illinois.

Another of her prized possessions was an autograph book. Some of her Friona "chums" were Neva Jones, Dorothea Benger, Lucille Allen, Estella Welch, Martha McFarland, and Lillian Nailon. This was another of her prized possessions. She also was very proud of her picture of Friona High School.

Mother's sisters Anna and Alice and brothers Melvin and Ralph attended Friona schools. Ella, her oldest sister, finished school in Snyder, Oklahoma. Anna married Pearl Taylor, and Alice married Watson Whaley. Melvin married Irene Robards and Ralph married Ola Iris (Sue) Nelson. After Ella joined the family in Friona she married Jennings Dukes. Alice, Melvin, and Ella's children attended Friona schools.

Those afternoons with her are gone now but the memories are precious and linger on.

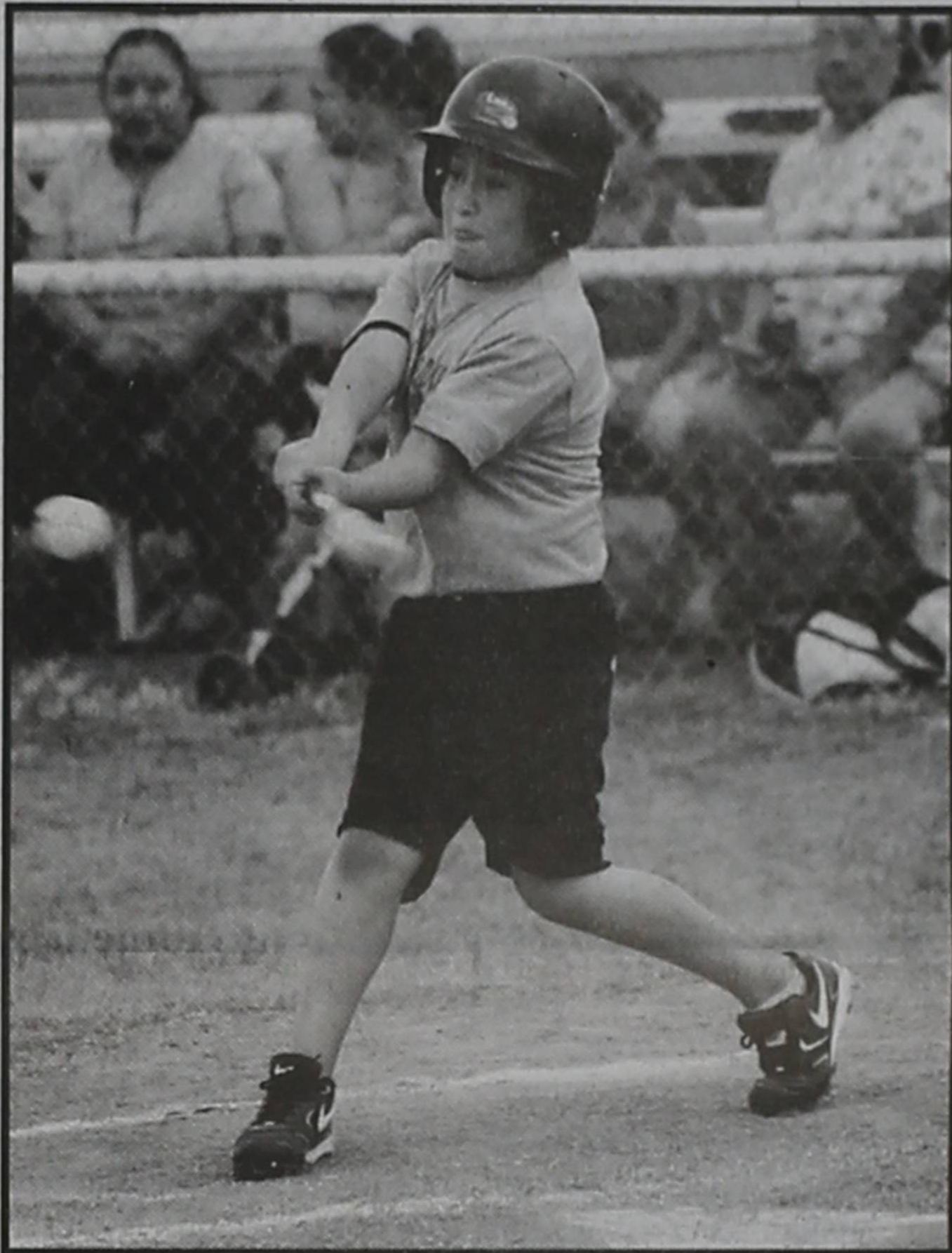

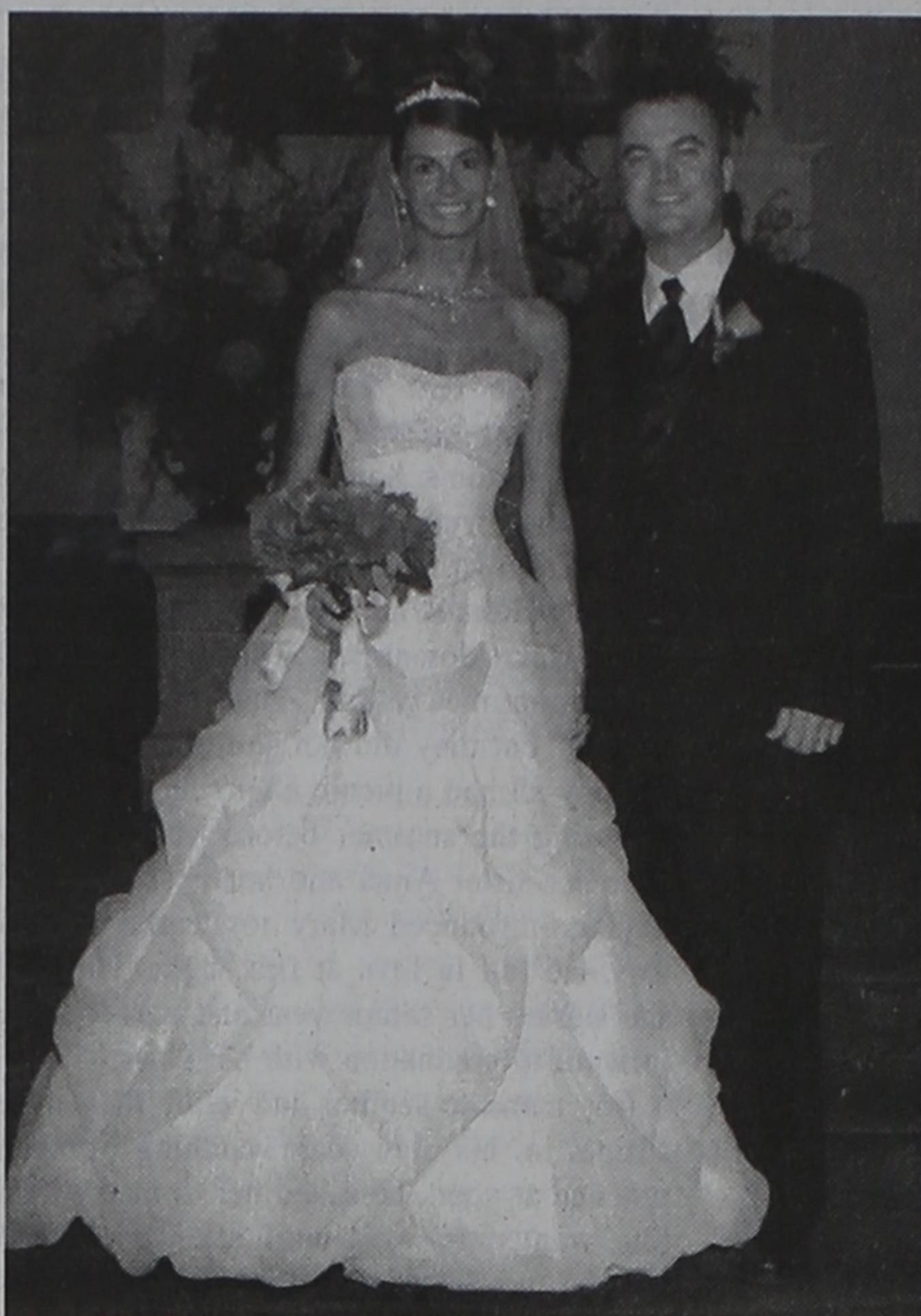

## Emergency farm loan applications accepted

Applications for emergency farm loans for losses caused by fire and high wind are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) office located in Farwell, Thomas S. Taylor said.

Parmer County is one of the ten in Texas recently named by the Secretary of

Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from fire or high wind.

Taylor said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, which-

ever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan," Taylor said. Farmers participating in

the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to consider proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until January 15, 2009 but farmers should apply as soon as

possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing, with possible delays into the new farming season," Taylor said.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part

of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who meet U.S. citizenship requirements and to farming partnerships, corporations, or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship requirements are met by individuals holding majority interest. The FSA office in Farwell is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
