IMMIGRANT SEAMEN.

One of the biggest immigration leaks in this country since the adoption of the quota system is the inflitration of sailors. By the official record there were 23,477 desertions of foreign sailors in American ports last year, and there must have been thousands not reported. Most of these are not real sallors at all. They ship aboard vessels clearing from low-quota New York or some other American port, they either desert outright or else inform our immigration officers that they expect to re-ship on some other vessel. They are allowed 60 days ashore on that condition. Then they quietly filter into the interior and disappear. It isn't any worse than other kinds of immigrent-smuggling, but is another impressive indication of the pressure of foreign populations to get into this fortunate country, and the difficulty of enforcing the restrictions.

AMERICANS IN GENEVA.

There are several interesting things, about the now celebrated job held by John D. Rockefeller Bd at Geneva. These, for instance: That the services of a Rockefeller are considered worth \$200 for the summer. That a Rockefeller scion is on the payroll of the League of Nations. That his job consists in "receiving the throngs of American visitors at the secretarist, and furnishing them with information and literature explaining the league's hims and accomplishments; and also taking charge of the guides who accompany viritors through the building." This job might be meanly interpreted as a subsidy to interest. Americans in the league's work, if the salary amounted to anything and if Americans were not showing so much interest of their own accord as to make the job! necessary.

WRECK LAW FOR AIRPLANES.

A strange situation has arisen with regard to the Bremen, the German airplane which was the first to cross the north Atlantic from Europe. After efforts A strange situation has arisen with regard to the to fly it to this country were abandoned, the plane was left near Long Point, Quebec, with one guard, Eugene Thibault of the Canadian Transcontinental Airways. No doubt it was thought that the plane would be safe from souvenir hunters in that remote section of Canada. Nevertheless strangers of all types have come from everywhere to see the Bremen, and some of them have tried to strip it. The guard reports that the most serious pillagers are fishermen off the Grand Banks who insist on regarding the Bremen as a wreck and therefore subject to free salvage. They come in groups, sometimes as many as 20 together, and try to make off with valuable parts of the airplane. The Bremen's crew of three has long since returned to Europe. Because of these appeals, made with so much fulsome flattery and seeming political honesty, 95 per cent of the Klan supported Dan Moody for Governor, giving him more than 20,000 majority in Dallas county alone.

Double-Crosses Klan at State Convention

A short time thereafter we held our county convention and elected our delegates to the state convention, most of the delegates being anti-Klansmen. Our county convention instructed for W. L. Thornton, a distinguished citizen of Dallas, for state executive committeeman. At the same convention, Dan Moody requested the committee on credentials to leave Thornton's name off the executive committee because he was a Klansman. The Dallas delegation raised hell on the floor of the convention, and Dan, embarrassed and humiliated, went before the convention, and withdrew his objections to Mr. Thornton, after he knew the convention would ignore his request. To add insult to injury, Dan had John Boyle to lead the fight against Thornton on the floor of the convention.
