This type of criminal activity tends to pick up before special family days such as Mother's Day. Last year several florists reported scam calls as they neared their Mother's Day rush, and one florist in Amarillo reported a scam attempt today. Scammers also are known to prey on restaurants at busy hours. As a reminder, Xcel Energy customers who are behind on their bills will always receive a printed disconnect notice in the mail first. Anyone receiving calls who has not received a printed disconnect notice should assume it is a scam, hang up, and contact Xcel Energy to verify account balances. If payments are due, customers can make arrangements through the appropriate means.







## **Great Plains CASA** calls for volunteers

As preparations for end of school (graduation, prom, awards ceremonies, school trips) and summer vacation begin, more than 100 children in Deaf Smith, Bailey, Castro, Oldham, and Parmer counties will be spending these exciting and activity filled months with people who are not their families because they are in foster care.

At a time when most families get together and celebrate their bonds, for children in the foster care system, this time of year can be a difficult time which highlights their separation from parents and relatives, said Jeri Wells, Volunteer Recruiter/Coordinator of Great Plains CASA for Kids.

Great Plains CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) train and support volunteers who advocate for children in the foster care system. The volunteers' mandate is to help the children move from the foster care system into safe, permanent, loving homes as quickly as possible.

The need for volunteers is especially acute now as the number of children removed because of evidence of abuse or neglect has risen in the counties we serve.

"We have children who have been uprooted from their families and then moved repeatedly in the foster care system. Regardless of how difficult their home lives were before, it is extremely tough for these children in these end of school year and summer months when many of them are spending it with people who, until recently, had been strangers," Wells said.

CASA volunteers are professionally trained to advocate for children in foster care. Volunteer advocates get to know one child or sibling and speak to everyone involved in the children's lives, including their family members, teachers, doctors, lawyers, social workers and others.


The information they gather and their recommendations help the court overseeing the cases make informed decisions. A CASA volunteer commits to one child or sibling group until the case is closed and the children are in a safe, permanent home.

Great Plains CASA for Kids is a member of Texas CASA, a state association of 71 local programs serving children in 207 Texas counties. More than 7,611 volunteers advocated for nearly 23,621 children in foster care in Texas last year. Unfortunately, more than half the children in care do not have advocates to speak up for them in court.

Great Plains CASA for Kids has 14 volunteers serve 30 abused or neglected children in the counties we serve.


#### FISD begins 1-to-1 Initiative with 8th Grade By Abigail Hutchins

The 2015-2016 school year will kick start a program that will eventually put iPads in the hands of each individual FISD student.

At the end of the 2013-2014 school year, Friona technology director Darla Hutchins proposed a plan to provide an iPad to each student for school and home use. In the 2014-2015 school year, the functionality of the iPads and educational application usage were tested on classroom sets for each of the 8th grade teachers. The 8th grade teachers have provided valuable feedback, built their knowledge of the devices, and successfully integrated the use of the devices into their curriculum.

Reading teacher Candice Geske raves, "I love having the 1:1 iPads in my reading class. The amount of paper I collect from the students has been drastically reduced since the majority of their responses and quizzes are completed through different apps on the iPads. It's also reduced the risk of students losing their work because their work and/or assignments can be accessed digitally. I'm loving a paper-free classroom. "

Current 8th grade students have reported their enthusiasm for the use of iPads in the classroom as well. Emma Rector prefers iPads because they allow for faster research, "...unlike books were it takes a while to find the subject you are looking for." Jerry Prieto states, "... I think it is good because we save a lot of paper and a lot of time. It's also a good way to have a little fun while doing work at the same time." Vanessa Chavez says, "... [If] we have a project and we need ideas to get our minds going. We can easily
