
Allen and Emma Lou Stewart with small son, Robert, came to Friona and opened one at 518 Main Street, May 15, 1948.

There want them to do it. But, if they do make the choice to go out and get drunk, I have caused them to stumble, and that is wrong!

God is in control, and He places everyone in authority, whether you are the President of the United States, a parent, minister, teacher, member of a board of directors, etc. And, because you accept that position of authority, I believe you are held to a higher standard by God and mankind. He is counting on you to pray and make decisions so that His will, not yours, can be fulfilled. Sometimes, we don't know what to do when we are in a position of authority. We don't know which side to take, what decision to make. It is tough when you are put in a spot where you simply don't know what to do. To be honest, I hate it when people put me in those positions where you look at all angles of a situation, and no matter what you do, someone is not going to be happy. My study in Romans has helped me with this. Romans 14:12 does say "each of us will give a personal account to God," so don't agree with something unless you are 100% convinced that the decision you are going to make is right. If you have any doubt about your decision, it is best to say no. If you have the least inclination that your choice or decision might cause someone to stumble, don't do it. Your decision may cost you in some way, but God's peace is worth a whole lot, and if you have His peace, that is all that matters.
