In remarks on the Senate floor today, U.S. Sen. John Gornyn (R-TX) spoke about his amendment to the Every Child Achieves Act, which allows states and local schools to use Title I funds to pay for efficiency reviews, allowing schools to better serve students without expending additional resources. The amendment is based on a successful model employed by the Texas Comptroller's Office, which has allowed the state to improve student achievement while keeping expenditures low.

"This amendment builds on an incredibly successful program in Texas, one that brings greater accountability to our schools and helps them discern how they can make each dollar go just a little bit further."

"There is a broadly-held fallacy that the quality of educational outputs is equal to how much money you put into it. In other words, if you want a better product educationally, all you have to do is spend more money."

"There is a smarter, more efficient way to deal with that, and that's what the financial allocation study is designed to achieve: to measure academic achievement relative to spend-

"With the eventual passage of Every Child Achieves Act, we can make sure that school districts all across the country are using their dollars for what they are really intended: classroom education, not stuck back in the back-office bureaucracy."

"I'm very proud of the good progress we've made across a number of issues this year so far. Passing anti-human trafficking laws... we passed a budget for the first time since 2009 that balances in ten years. And, yes, we worked with the President of the United States on a bipartisan basis to pass Trade Promotion Authority."

"Next week, we will conclude this Every Child Achieves Act by reforming our early and elementary childhood education system to get more of the power, get more of the authority out of Washington and back to parents, teachers, and the states where it really belongs."

A donation was approved by the Lions Club to Parmer Hospital Chronic Clinic for a needy eye care patient.




One of the adventures we enjoyed was hunting for those tail feathers. We learned that it was easier to collect them after the feathers had fallen from the peacock, so we would hunt.

Have you ever had James 4:12b, "Who are you to judge your neighbor?" thrown at you?

It is so important to know God's Word, so that when we find ourselves in those situations where we are being labelled "judgmental" and not loving, we can speak truth in love. It is tough, but God will provide the necessary words and a calm voice. People will not begin to change unless they hear the truth!
