**A HUNDRED-YEAR-OLD** country home in a small exclusive area of rural New York, about an hour from the city will cost a couple of million. You may have wondered how the Clintons managed to finance their recent purchase in order to establish residence for Mrs. Clinton's up-coming run for the Senate.

Here are the Clintons applying for their mortgage just like your everyday Mr. and Mrs. John Q. Public:

"Hi, Mr. and Mrs. Clinton. Welcome to EZBreeZee Mortgages. I'm Alan Greenspan. No! No relation, sorry to say. May I call you Bill and Hillary?"

# Chiefs Hit Road Seeking 4th Win

The bad news is, it's the Friona Chieftains' third straight road game Friday when the team travels to Dalhart to meet the Wolves. Kickoff time is 8 p.m. All the rest of Friona's games have a 7:30 kickoff.

The good news is: Friona has scored record wins on the road in each of their last two games, so maybe the home field won't mean that much advantage.

Dalhart sports a 2-1 season record, having beaten Guymon, Oklahoma and West Texas High (24-15), and losing to undefeated Stratford. Both of the Wolves' wins are again so-far winless teams.

Dalhart will be the biggest team the Chieftains have

faced so far, according to Coach Mike Scott. "They are an enormous team. Three of their linemen weigh 280, 290 and 300 pounds. We will have to offset their size and hope to get by them with our quickness," Scott said.

Senior tailback Garland Swecker, a 170-pounder, has some speed. Coach Scott remembered that this player had a good game when the schools met here a year ago. They have a second back who has run well, also.

The Wolves have already bettered their 1998 season, when they suffered through an 0-10 record which included a 0-5 district slate. Last season they were hampered by lack of experience and

injuries.

Coming into this season, Dalhart had 16 lettermen, which included 10 offensive and 11 defensive starters.

Among Friona's 1999 opponents, the Dalhart series is the third longest (behind Dimmitt and Muleshoe), in point of games played. Friday's game will be the 31st meeting of the two schools since 1941.

The Wolves hold the overall advantage, 17-13 prior to Friday. Friona has already clinched the "1990s series," having won six games in a row from the XIT team. They would like to make it a 7-3 decade while they're at it.

Having been able to rest most of the starters for last week's second half against Dimmitt, Coach Scott's charges go into the game in good physical condition.

The purpose of this meeting will be to discuss the budget and at the same time open the meeting to representatives of any organizations that plan to obtain funding from the United Way for the coming year.

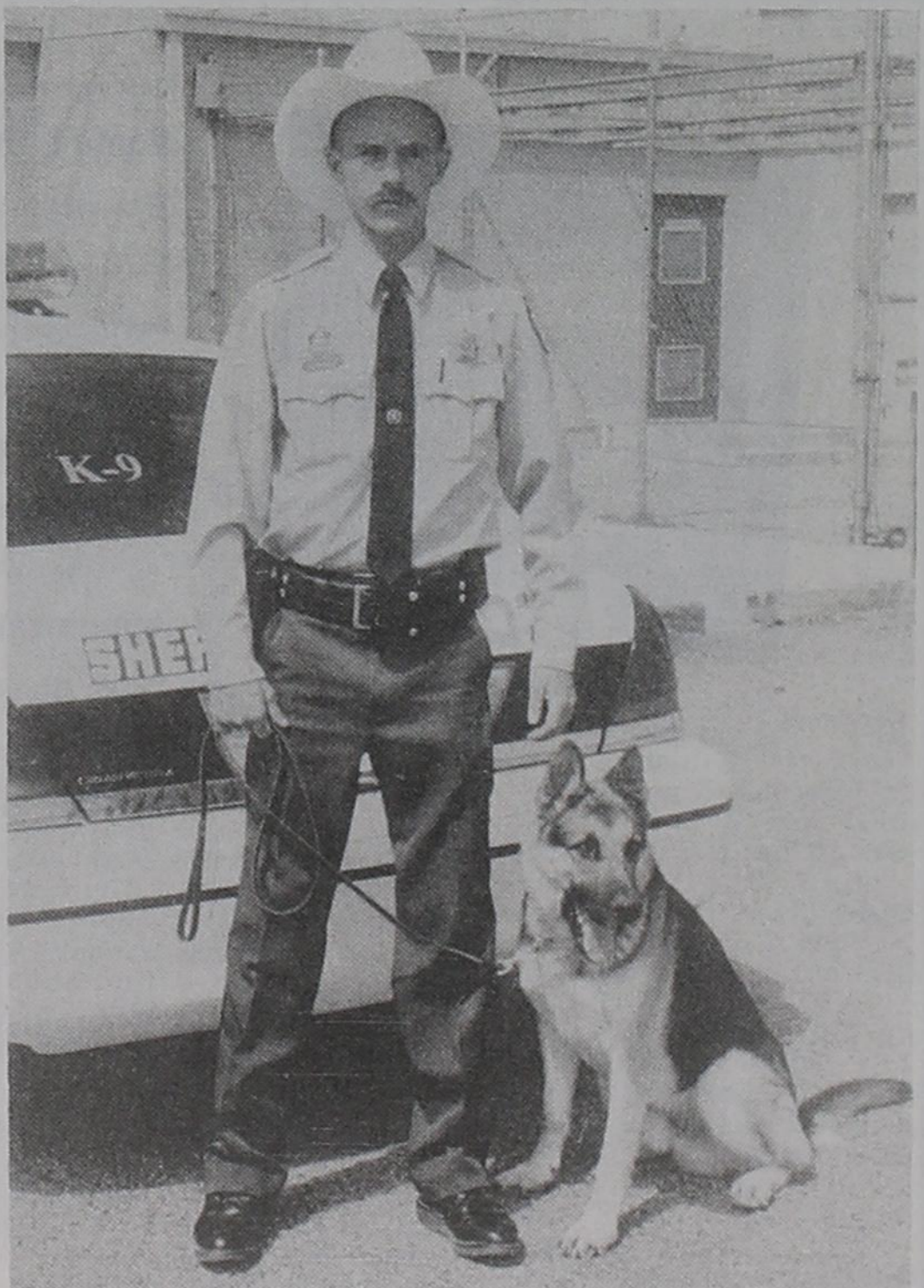

# Chieftains Spoil DHS Homecoming By 49-14

It may be awhile before Dimmitt's coaches get brash enough to schedule Friona as their team's homecoming foe, after last Friday.

The Chieftains gave the Bobcats a good country whipping, 49-14, in front of their homecoming crowd, a Lubbock reporter, and a

visiting Friona crowd that loved every minute of it.

Coach Mike Scott challenged the Chieftains prior to the game to "set the tone" on defense. The team came out and took a 42-0 halftime lead, highlighted by a 27-point second quarter that included three defensive touchdowns.

"We had talked to them (the team) all week about taking the initiative on defense. They responded well. The defense was outstanding. Plus, we took it to them early, scoring first for the third straight week," Scott said.

"We created some turnovers. It was a special night for everyone. We were able to play some young kids, which is bound to pay off later," he added.

The Bobcats were held to minus yardage in the first half. Dimmitt managed only two first downs in the half, and one of these came on a penalty.

The Chiefs most likely could have beaten the 'Cats 84-0 if the coach had been of a mind to. But as Friona's biggest problem in '99 appears to be its depth, he opted to rest his starters in the second half, making sure they would be healthy to play another week.

Dimmitt's first team, meanwhile, managed to outscore the Chieftain reserves, 14-7 in the second half, and managed to get their statistics out of the hole.

Nothing the Bobcats did last Friday worked out. They won the toss and deferred getting the ball until the second half. The Chieftains took the ball, and after a nice return by Joseph Bandy, covered 63 yards in just four plays, aided by a face mask penalty against the 'Cats, to grab the lead.

Bandy ripped off a 23-yard run to get the drive going, and when the Dimmitt tackler used Bandy's mask as a tackling aid, the play was turned into a 38-yard gain to the Bobcat 28.

Noel Grajeda gained five up the middle, and then Friona QB Nathan King rolled out to the right, and lofted a pass to a wide-open Grajeda who caught the ball at about the Dimmitt five and raced in untouched for the opening score.

Trent Cook began another string of good kicks, for a 7-0 Friona lead. Only 1:51 had elapsed in the opening quarter.

The rock-ribbed Friona defense caused Dimmitt's first fumble on their next possession, and took over on the Bobcat 41. Joseph Bandy dashed 20 yards on a nifty broken-field run. On third and three from the DHS 14, Bandy was given a good hole, and responded by dashing into the end zone for Friona's second touchdown.

On the PAT, Cason White took the snap and decided to go for two. He raced around right end and managed to get the nose of the ball across the stripe as he was tackled. The score became 15-0 with 5:55 left in the opening quarter.

Neither team could score in their next three possessions. Friona drove to the Bobcat 10 early in the second quarter, facing fourth and one. But Grajeda was tackled for a yard loss to end the threat.

However, as the Bobcats tried to move the ball from

near their goal-line, speedy Justin Sutton had the ball knocked out of his hands, and Landon Martin picked up the ball and ran into the end zone

for a TD. Cook's perfect kick brought a 22-0 Friona lead with 6:44 left in the half.

Following the kickoff, Dimmitt ball-carriers were stopped for ten yards in losses around an incomplete pass, and the 'Cats quickly had to punt.

After picking up a first down to the Dimmitt 32, King rolled out to the right, and spotted Martin wide open in the clear, and hit him right in the arms for another touchdown. Cook's third kick made it a 29-0 Friona lead at the 3:14 mark.

The Chieftains were about to add two more quick scores, in spite of not having the ball.

Friona forced a punt, and Martin was Johnny-on-the-spot again, blocking the punt. King fell on the ball in the end zone--his second "recovery TD" in two weeks, and after Cook did the honors it was a 36-0 game. There was still 1:57 left in the half--plenty of time for another score.

With 33 seconds left to play, Bobcat B.J. Hill was separated from the ball. Jesse Allen picked up the loose ball and ran seven yards into the end zone. Fans did a double-take at the 42-0 pronouncement on the scoreboard. Friona had scored 27 points in just over six minutes of clock time--about half of a quarter.

As stated earlier, the Bobcats tried to make the final score a bit more respectable against Friona's subs, but one of Friona's reserves had a good showing himself. Adam Bandy, taking his brother's place in the backfield, ripped off gains of seven, 11 and 16 in three straight carries to answer Dimmitt's first score. Cook added his fifth kick.

The Chieftain placekicker is now 15 for 15 in PATs and one for one in field goals, for 18 points.

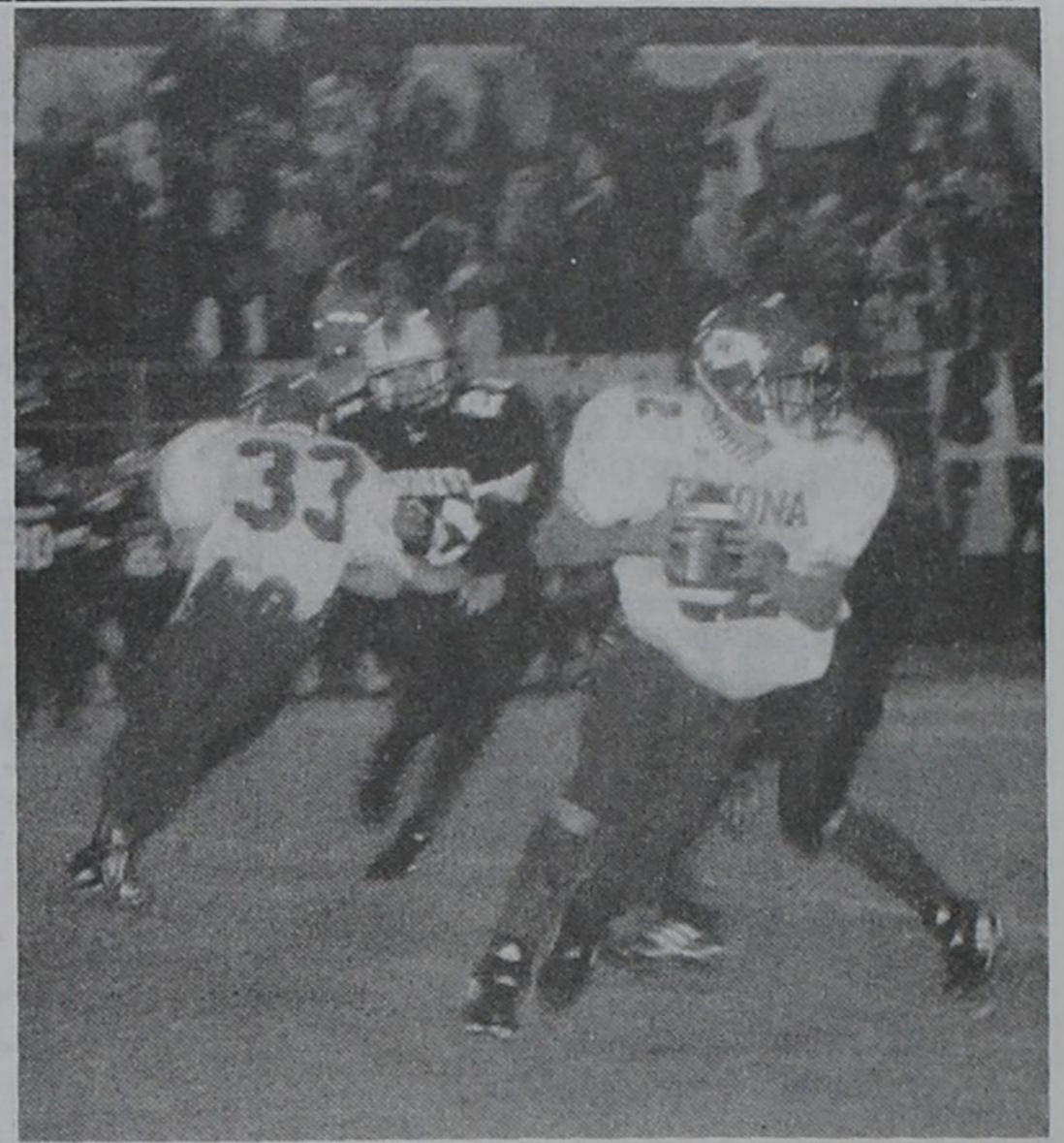

The JV Chiefs forced four fumbles. Cunningham, Randy Baca, Alex Wilkerson and Chris Ureste each recovered a fumble. Carthel and Heath Gammon each came up with a pass interception, as the team caused six Dimmitt turnovers, sort of setting the pattern for their "older brothers" the following night.

So well did the young Chieftains control the game that they never had to punt a single time.

## New Seat Belt Law Is Being Enforced

DPS Trooper Trey Ellis brought us a list of new driving-related traffic laws which took effect September 1, which includes:

- Large trucks (including 18 wheelers), assorted vehicles pulling trailers and school activity buses will now be able to drive the same speed limit as cars on interstates and highways numbered by the federal and state government—a maximum speed limit of 70 mph day/65 mph night on those roadways. The truck speed limit will remain the same (maximum 60 mph day/55 mph night) on farm-to-market (FM) roads and ranch-to-market (RM) roads.

- School buses without commercial vehicle inspection stickers will now have a maximum speed limit of 50 mph. The prior law allowed school buses to travel 55 mph on interstates. School buses with commercial vehicle inspection stickers will now be allowed to travel 60 mph on interstates and state numbered highways.

- The speed limit on beaches has been lowered to 15 mph.

- Although legislation to raise the driving age had been introduced during the session, nothing passed. The standard legal driving age in Texas remains 16.

- The current seat belt law has been broadened to cover all children in a vehicle, no matter where they are seated. That means that all children under 15 must be properly restrained—period. The new law also now requires seat belt usage for children under 15 years of

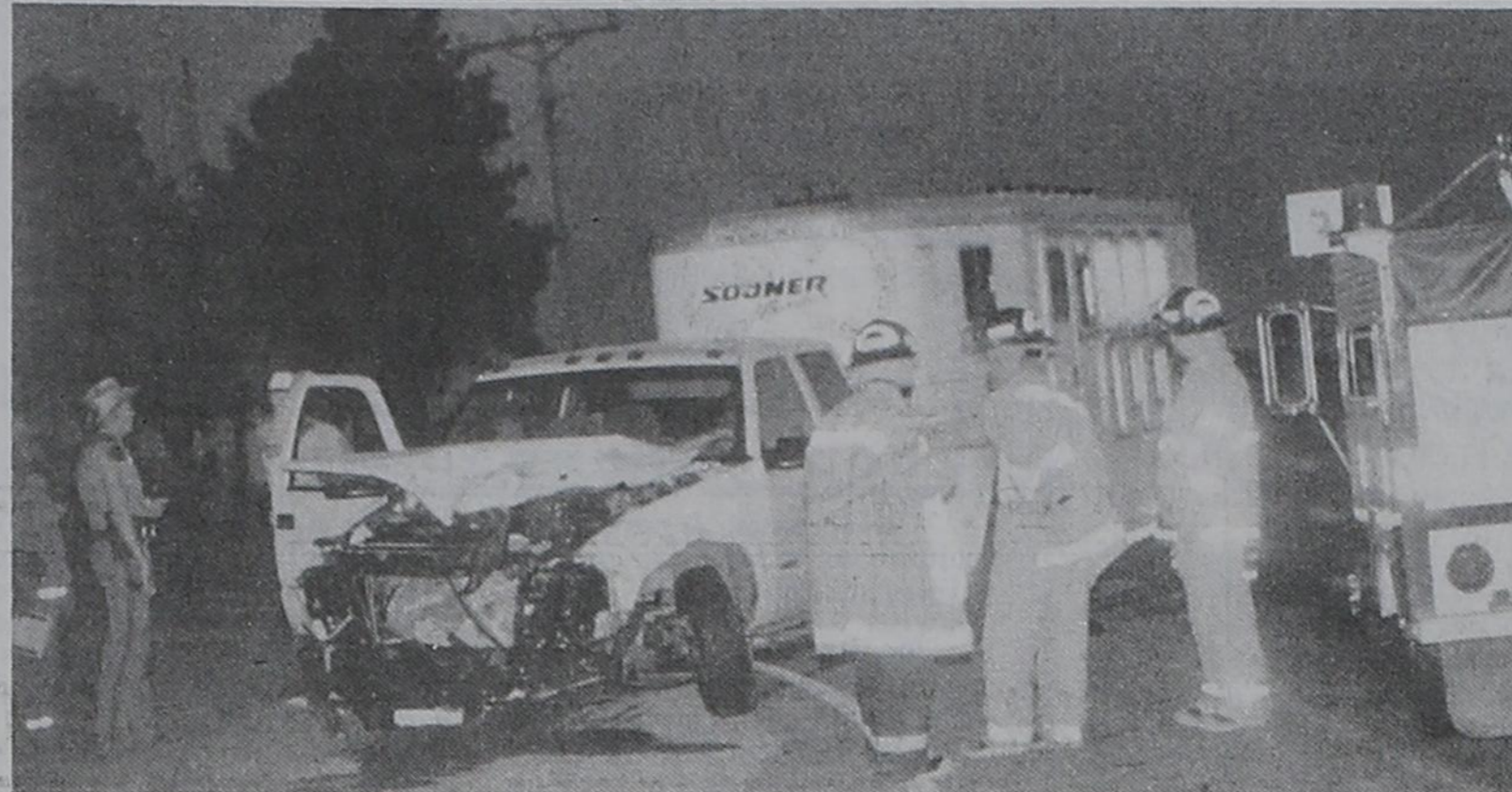
age in one-ton pickups. This does not apply to adults. (Please note that children under two years of age must still be seated in an approved car seat.) One other change clarifies that safety belt means a lap belt and a shoulder strap, if the vehicle is so equipped.

- The DWI threshold will drop from 0.10 to 0.08 blood alcohol content. This change in the law also will affect the Administrative License Revocation program, which allows for the civil suspension of driver licenses for those who register a .08 or above, as well as those who refuse a breath test.

- Vehicle inspection fees will increase on September 1, 1999, as follows: safety only inspection—\$12.50; motorcycles—\$12.50; mopeds—\$5.75; new car initial inspection—\$21.75; emission only inspection—\$13.00; safety and emissions inspection—\$25.50.

- Starting January 1, 2000, all gas caps will be pressure-tested during vehicle inspections to make sure caps are not leaking gas fumes into the atmosphere.

- Beginning September 1, new driver licenses, identification cards and renewals will have a writeable surface on the back, so license holders will have the option to fill in a contact number to call in an emergency if law enforcement agencies need to contact next-of-kin. License and I.D. holders already are able to write in where an emergency directive to physician is filed and any allergic reactions to drugs the license holder may have.



**HUB WRECK...**At about 7:30 p.m. last Saturday a westbound pickup pulling a loaded horse trailer, top, slammed into a northbound loaded cattle truck at the Hub intersection of Highways 214 & 86. The impact caused the 18-wheeler trailer to overturn and the rig came to rest against a power pole, bottom, causing a temporary loss of electricity in some parts of the area. Out of 54 head, about 6 head of cattle died but the horses and the vehicle drivers escaped injury.

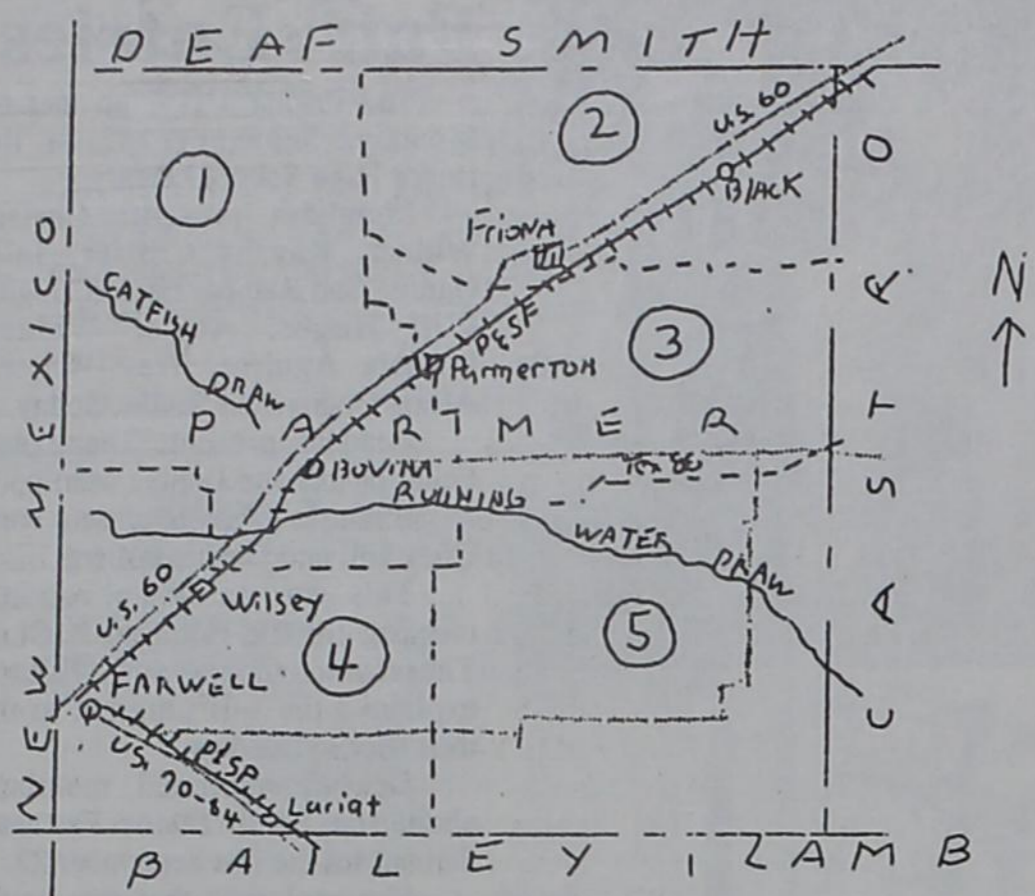

### Parmer County SWCD Sets Director Election

An election of a Soil and Water Conservation District director to serve in Zone 3 on the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District is scheduled for October 6 at Friona State Bank, McFarland C. Osborn, chairman of the board, announced. The election will be held at 10 a.m.

State law decrees that to be eligible to vote in a Soil and Water Conservation District election, a person must own agricultural land within the district where the election is being held. The person must also live in a county all or part of which is in the district and the voter must be eighteen years of age or older.

Legal qualifications state that a candidate for the office of a Soil and Water Conservation District must own land in the subdivision he or she represents. Be 18 years of age or older and be actively engaged in farming or ranching. The candidate must also live in a county all or part of which is in the district. Soil and Water Conservation District directors serve four-year terms of office. Zone 3 of the district


includes all land in the south Friona School District.

Current members of the board of directors of the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District are M.C. Osborn, chairman; Troy Christian, vice chairman; Kevin Welch, secretary; Mike Beauchamp, member; and Mike Miller, member.

The purpose of the Parmer County Soil and Water Conservation District with headquarters in Friona is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on agricultural lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers, ranchers and local community entities on conservation matters.

The district board of directors coordinate the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations. The district has the authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purposes.

All conservation programs managed by the district are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator or other potential users of the S.W.C.D.'s programs.
