## Star Lites

TEXAS MONTHLY Magazine's February issue contains the magazine's annual "Bum Steer" awards, in which the publication zings everyone from politicians to private citizens on the "worst performances" of the year just past.

Heading the magazine's list of "worsts" is author James Michener's book, "Texas," which more than co-incidentally came out during the state's sesqui-centennial year. Texas Monthly calls the book "the longest unbroken string of Texas clichés ever compiled."

Although Michener was given his own office at the University of Texas, plus all the research help he wanted, TM says "Michener's Texas makes J.R.'s Dallas look like an informed sophisticated portrayal of Texas today."

The law does some strange things, and Texas Monthly picked out a couple of instances to cite in its Bum Steer awards.

For instance, a tractor-trailer overturned on a Houston freeway, pinning the driver underneath the wreckage. A passing motorist used a crane that was in the back of his pickup to save the driver's life. Later, a highway patrolman issued the Good Samaritan a ticket because the crane was too heavy for his truck.

Impossible, you say? What about the woman who rescued a kitten which a man had tossed into the Guadalupe River after first holding it in front of two large barking dogs. When she cursed at the man after recovering the animal, she was arrested for disorderly conduct and fined \$200.00.

Among its other "zingers," the magazine cited the following: In a brochure designed by the Texas Education Agency to prepare students for upcoming competency tests, one question began, "Which, if any, of the following words are misspelled?" "Misspelled" was misspelled.

Also, Robert Downing of Houston took a bulldozer from a construction site and drove it through his subdivision looking for his lost dog, doing \$20,000 worth of damage. When he got home, the dog was there waiting for him.

The most unusual prize award should go to the Duncanville preschool PTA, which held a benefit auction in which one prize was a \$500 vasectomy.

Surely, none of our local hunters would mimic the Austin hunter who shot a deer in Mexico with antlers so large that he won the Mexican deer of the year award given by the Texas Trophy Hunters Association. He and the deer were pictured in a hunting magazine. Later, the hunter was indicted on federal charges that he had paid \$20,000 for a set of antlers stolen from a Canadian taxidermy shop, which he then had mounted on a small deer he had killed in Mexico.

Louis Welch, former Houston Mayor who has Parmer County relatives, trying to re-capture his office, made a slip-up during his campaign which TM quoted. Welch was giving an off-the-cuff remedy for the AIDS problem which started out with "shooting all the queers." His remark went over a live microphone which he thought was dead.

Texas prison inmate Ronald Danford was sentenced to serve five more years when prison guards, searching him after a five-day furlough, found an ounce of marijuana concealed inside his artificial leg.

Personally, we thought this should have been entitled "worst luck award"--Kay Osterman, general manager of the curio stand located next to the Battleship Texas, bought the entire contents of the battleship's closed souvenir shop with a sealed bid of \$20,000. The next highest bid was \$501.00.

## Dana Berend Wins Record Third Title

Dana Berend, Friona High School senior, exhibited the Grand Champion steer at the Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show a record third consecutive time last Saturday.

Miss Berend capped her final appearance at the county show by also entering the reserve champion animal, as well as the Grand Champion heifer.

The steer tapped as Grand Champion by Judge Tracy Haymes was a Shorthorn. It was the first Shorthorn steer to be named Grand Champion of the Parmer County show since Mary Tatum had a Shorthorn champion in 1953. It also was the first time since 1980 for a pure-breed animal to win the show. Exotic crossbred steers had won the title for the past seven years.

Sheldon Mason of Lazbuddie entered the Reserve Champion heifer. There were only four heifers entered in the 1986 show.

A Lazbuddie girl, Vandi Tarter, also capped off her senior show year in style. She guided her 225-pound Hampshire barrow to Grand Champion honors in the barrow show, which is annually the biggest division in the county show.

Miss Tarter also had the breed champion Duroc, so two of her entries were in the ring during the Grand Champion drive.

Miss Berend added to her laurels by showing the Reserve Champion barrow. Her entry had been judged champion of the Crossbred division of the show.

Other barrow breed champions were exhibited by Sharlet Johnson of Bovina (Berkshire); Blake Kelley, Farwell (Chester White); Brett Thomas, Lazbuddie (Polands) and Thomas in Yorkshires.

Local showmen did well, as Rachel McMurtrey showed the Reserve breed champion Duroc, Cammy Hancock had the reserve Poland; Sindy Preston had the reserve Hampshire and Shannon Cochran had the reserve Yorkshire.

In the lamb show, which was won by a Bovina entry for a sixth consecutive year, Marc Hamil had the breed champion fine wool lamb and Jeff Brown had the champion Hampshire. Steven Smith had the reserve champ fine wool lamb and Julie Brown had the runnerup in "other breeds."

Showmanship winners were, lambs--Guy Ellis and Gavin Ellis, goats--Blake Kelley and Shannon Cochran; barrows--Kevin Owen and Brett Thomas; steers--Dana Berend and Shannon Cochran; and heifers--Dana Berend and Greg Stowers.

Miss Berend's champion steer was bought at auction by Parmer County Implement Company for \$3.00 per pound. Herring Implement Co. was high bidder on the Grand Champion barrow of Miss Tarter's, at \$2.30 per pound. Bovina Fuel Co. bought the champion lamb, exhibited by Donell Garner, at \$5.00 per pound.

## Winter Storm Dumps 6 Inches Of Snow

Just when folks were wondering (1) were we just going to miss winter completely and (2) were we ever going to get any moisture, Mother Nature answered both questions.

The second snowfall in a three-day period greeted Friona residents when they arose on Friday. As of 7 a.m. Friday, official weather recorder Rodney Dunnam measured the snow at four inches, and the moisture content at .52 inches.

On Wednesday, the city had received two inches of snow, most of which melted almost as quickly as it fell. The Wednesday rain and snow amounted to .32 inches of moisture, which added to Friday's receipt, makes the week's total moisture .84 inches.

This will be a big boost to the agricultural section. The winter wheat had been badly in need of moisture, having received none since sometime in December.

The Friday storm prompted Superintendent of Schools Tom Jarboe to call of classes in Friona on Friday. A number of other area schools were also closed. Reports were that Vega received as much as eight inches of snow.

The forecast was for the area to continue getting snow throughout Friday and into Saturday.

The wintry spell comes on the heels of one of the warmest months of January on record in

the local area, and the first few days of February were just like it. The high on Saturday, as an example, was 79 degrees. Temperatures for the six days

## Charles Allen Tells Retirement Plans

Charles E. Allen, longtime banker and civic leader in Friona and Parmer County, has announced his retirement after forty years service to Friona State Bank.

Allen, 65, returned to the Friona area after serving as a naval aviator Captain for the Marine Corps in the Pacific during World War II. He started with the Bank in 1946 in the bookkeeping department and worked in all areas of the Bank in the years thereafter. He was named a director of the Bank in 1957 and has served as executive vice-president since 1972.

Charles is a graduate of the School for Bank Administration at the University of Wisconsin and is widely recognized in banking circles for his accomplishments over his career.

Allen is also recognized as being a distinguished community and church leader. He has involved himself over the years in community endeavors such as the United Way, Chamber of Commerce, and Lions Club. He was elected as District Governor of the Lions District 2T-1 in 1974, served two years as mayor of Friona and was chosen "Man of the Year" in Friona in 1972.

He was instrumental in establishing Prairie Acres Nursing Home in Friona and served on that board in its initial years. He is a member of the Masonic Lodge and is a deacon in the First Baptist Church of Friona.

For various periods of time, amounting to probably 15 to 20 years, Charles served as music

## 50 YEARS AGO--FEB. 7, 1936

The Friona Chiefs romped to a 19-16 victory over the Amarillo Sandies on Thursday evening in the local gym. This is the second game they have taken from Amarillo. The Friona second string beat the Clovis second string, 16-14.

## 45 YEARS AGO--FEB 7, 1941

The next annual meeting of the Parmer County Singing Convention will be held in Friona on February 16, according to Arlie Green, president. Good singers from all parts of the county are expected to be present, as well as quartets, trios and choruses from neighboring counties.

## 40 YEARS AGO--FEB. 1, 1946

During the latter part of last week, F.L. Bandy of Clarendon purchased the "Helpy-Selfy Laundry" and took immediate charge of it. The laundry was purchased from a Mr. Lee, who several months earlier purchased the business from Rev. E.E. Houlette, who originated the business several years ago.

## 35 YEARS AGO--FEB. 1, 1951

Evidently records were shattered in the Friona vicinity last night, with reports varying of low temperatures of from 12 to 22 degrees below zero. From three to four inches of snow fell on Tuesday, but it was very dry, only adding to the treacherous conditions of the roads. Reports were given of water pipes freezing--many for the first time in history.

## 25 YEARS AGO--FEB. 2, 1961

Friona Country Club's membership drive was kicked off Tuesday morning with several teams of men contacting prospective members in hopes of assuring early beginning of construction on the proposed clubhouse and the nine-hole golf course. Roy Beardain, 68, was found shot to death at his home at 1205 Washington in Friona Wednesday morning. Peace officers were holding Beardain's son, Rex, in connection with the shooting, and arrangements were pending Wednesday afternoon. Officers said the elder Beardain had been shot with a 22-calibre pistol. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Frances Euler, justice of the peace.

The food items will also be distributed at the Community Center in Farwell; the county barn in Lazbuddie, and the Community Action Center in Bovina on February 13.

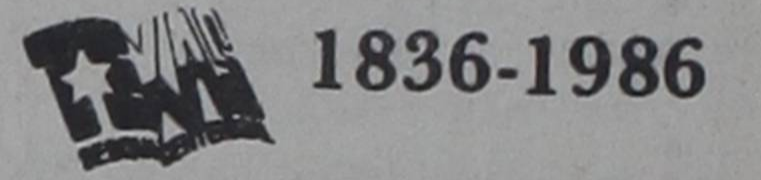

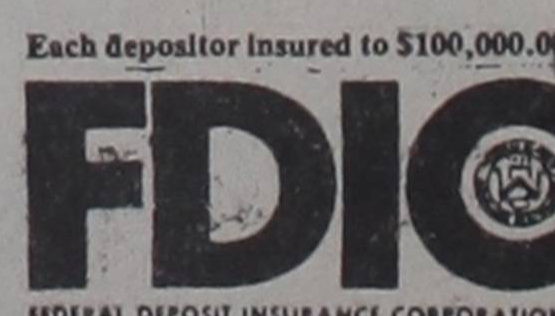



# Squaws Score Big Win Over Idalou

The Friona High School Squaws scored a big win at Idalou Tuesday night, 36-33, to continue their quest for the second half championship in District 2-AAA.

The Squaws had a cold-shooting night in the low-scoring affair. "Everybody was off their regular game. It's freakish to have everybody cold on the same night, but that's sort of what happened," said Coach Vicki Hatton.

The Squaws hit only 29 per cent of their field goal attempts, a figure which was helped by the team making 58 per cent in a big fourth quarter rally when the team went for the clincher.

Friona found themselves in foul trouble, in the persons of Ronda Ratcliff, Kelly Wied and Kerry Cain. The Squaws went into the intermission trailing in the game, 20-16.

"We went in at the half and talked about the problems we were having, and how to handle them. We told the players in foul trouble that they were just going to have to deal with that problem, and they went out and did it," Coach Hatton said, very pleased with the outcome.

Mika Maddox sparked the Squaws' fourth-quarter rally, during which they outscored the Idalou girls, 14-8. Miss Maddox scored three timely baskets during the period.

Mika Maddox went to the line with only two seconds left on the game clock, and Friona holding a 35-33 lead. She hit the first shot, which more or less clinched the win.

"It was not a pretty win, but we'll take it," Coach Hatton said.

One of the problems facing the Squaws was a very small gym, when they are accustomed to their own spacious facility.

Defensively, the Squaws played a pretty good game on Tuesday. The team pressed Idalou early, and

got some turnovers, but due to their cold shooting, just couldn't capitalize on the turnovers.

In a game here last Friday, the Squaws downed Floydada, 47-32. The FHS girls pulled away from a 12-6 lead with two minutes left in the opening quarter for an 18-6 lead and were never threatened after that.

Kelly Wied scored a pair of jump shots, Mika Maddox stole the ball for a layup and also connected on a jump shot, and Lacey Osborn sank a jumper, as Friona hiked its lead to 26-8.

Floydada's only points in the second quarter were a pair of free throws with 2:07 remaining. Friona had a comfortable, 32-10 lead at halftime.

Coach Hatton was able to substitute freely in the second half, and the scoring tapered off somewhat, but everyone saw action.

Kerry Cain led the scoring with 17 points, and Ronda Ratcliff scored 12.

The two wins left the Squaws with a 16-8 season record. They stand 5-0 in second half district play.

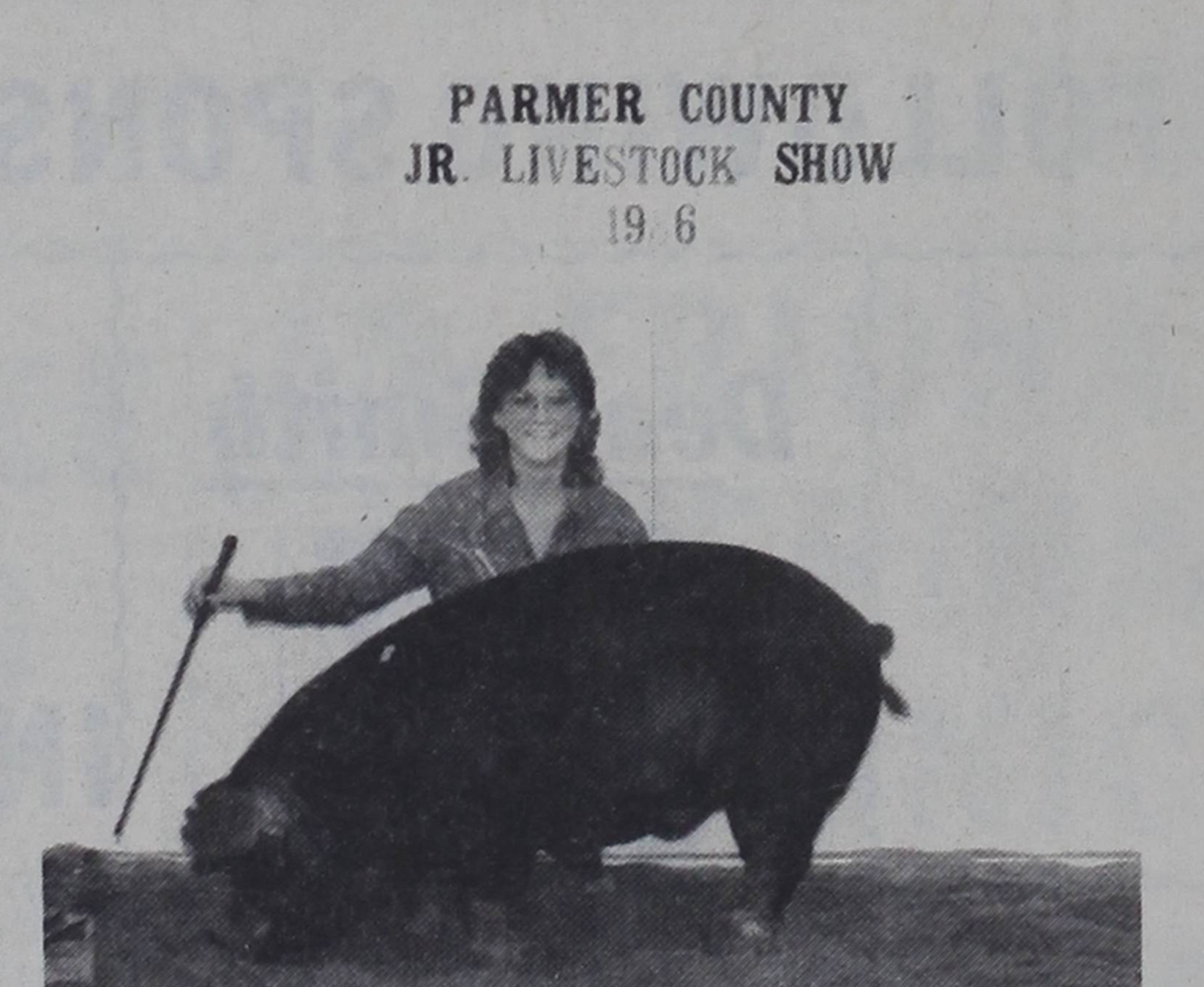

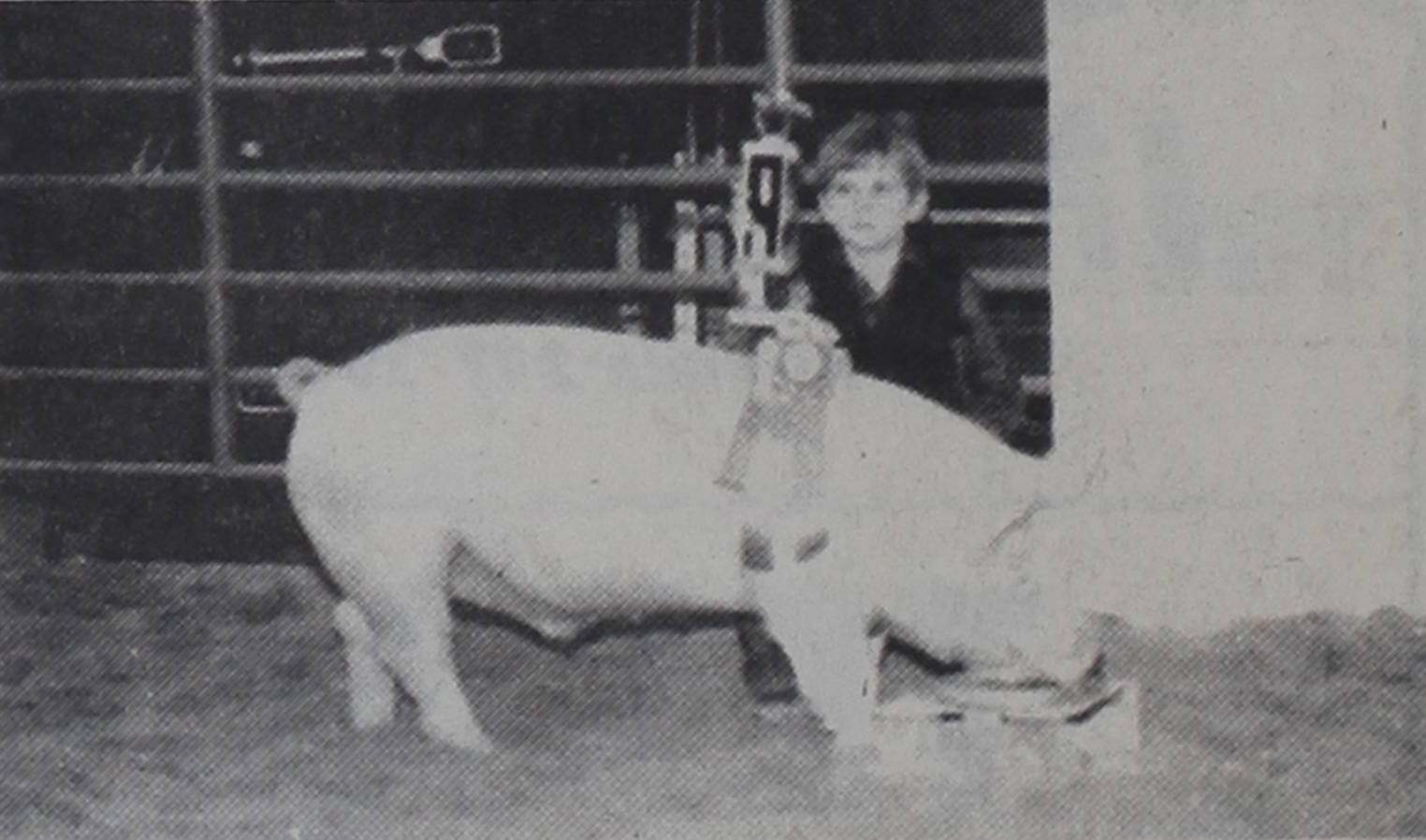

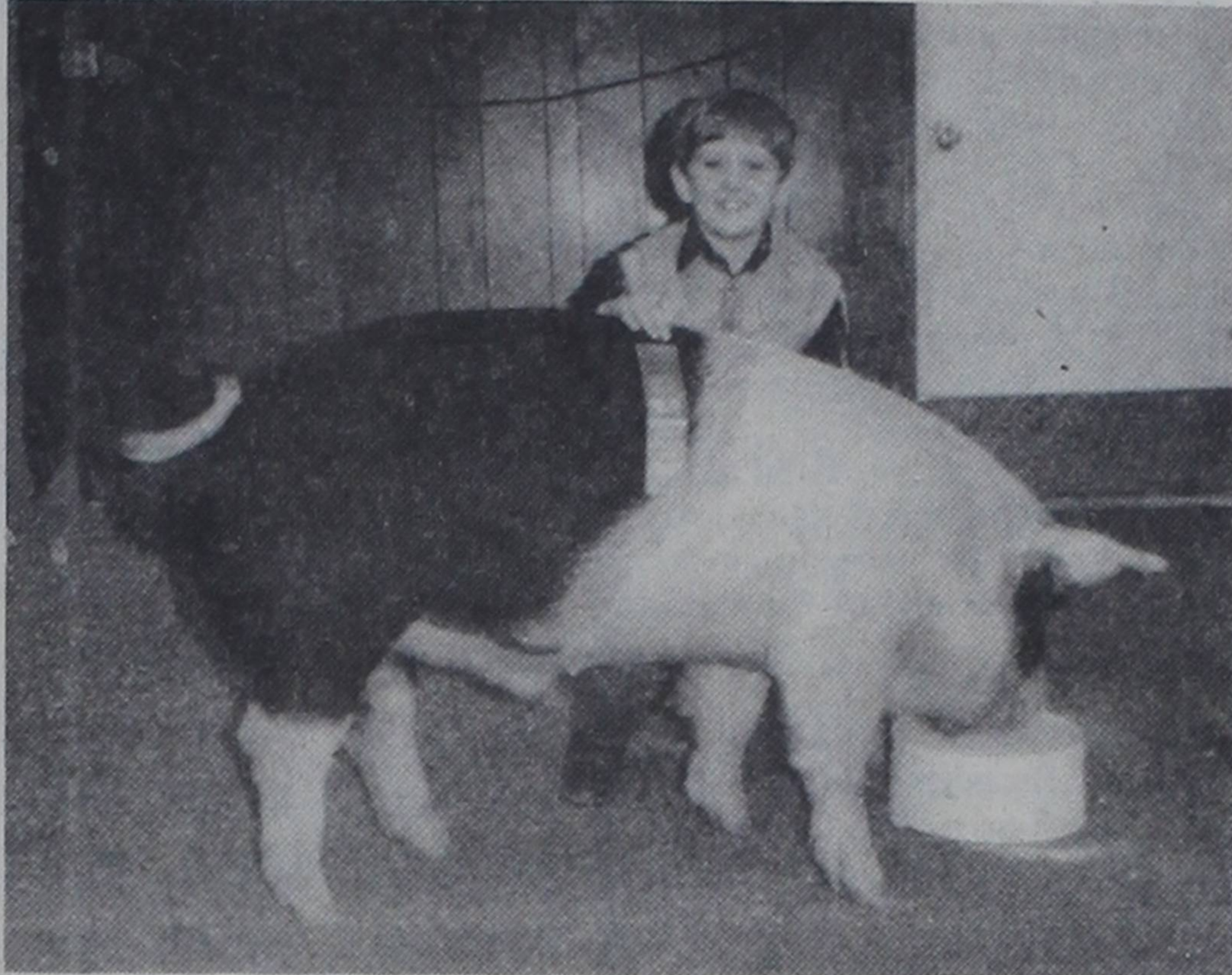

the points. Barnett connected on nine of nine from the free throw line.

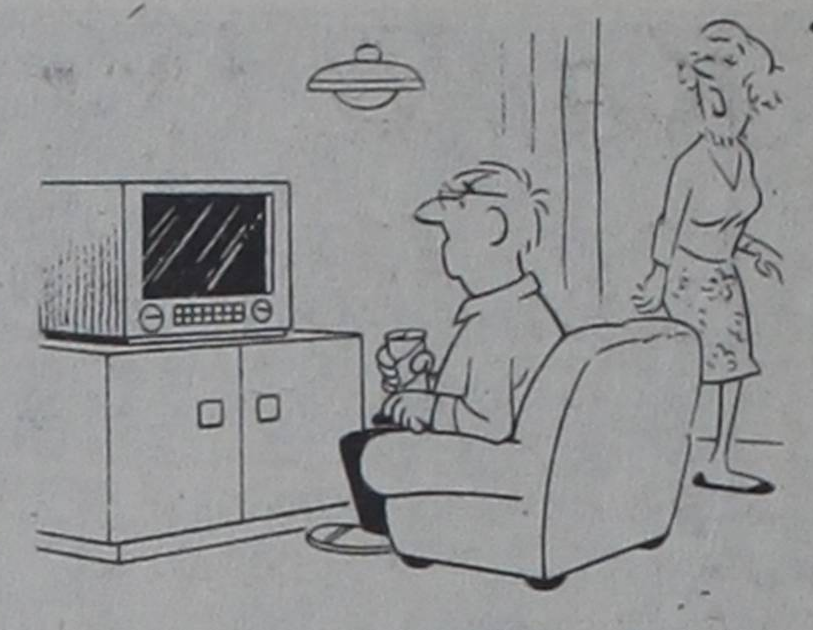
