Congress has become virtually a "sovereign nation unto itself," Coyne charges, "with a yearly budget of \$2 billion, a congressional staff of 35,000 bureaucrats and the ability to exempt itself from the rules and laws it makes for you and everyone else."

Earlier this century, congress passed a law to limit the term of the president. When you stop and think about it, the president has very little power compared to congress.

Coyne says it is time the American public went "over Congress' head' and demand passage of a constitutional amendment to limit the terms of office. He is asking financial support for the Americans to Limit Congressional Terms (ALCT), a grassroots organization.








