## Travis Auderer Earns Scholarship

Travis Auderer of Friona was recently honored as a 1989-90 recipient of the American Petroleum Institute Scholarship at South Plains College.

Auderer, drafting technology major, is among 25 SPC students who were recognized for outstanding academic and vocational achievement by SPC faculty members and API representatives.

During the scholarship luncheon, the South Plains chapter of the American Petroleum Institute granted SPC an \$8,000 contribution to fund scholarships for the 1990-91 school year. Charles Miller of Levelland, chairman of the API Scholarship Committee, presented the award to Dr. Marvin L. Baker, president of South Plains College.

"You are a walking billboard for the success of the API scholarship program," Miller told the students. "We like to support your educational opportunities because we know you are hard-working and dedicated individuals. These are qualities we like to see in the petroleum industry."

Since 1971, the API South Plains Chapter has given South Plains College \$155,000 to fund scholarships for 450 students. An additional \$30,000 has been contributed for the purchase of instructional tools and aids.

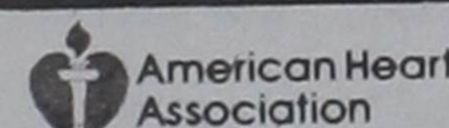
## J'Mai Cash Is Honored At A&M

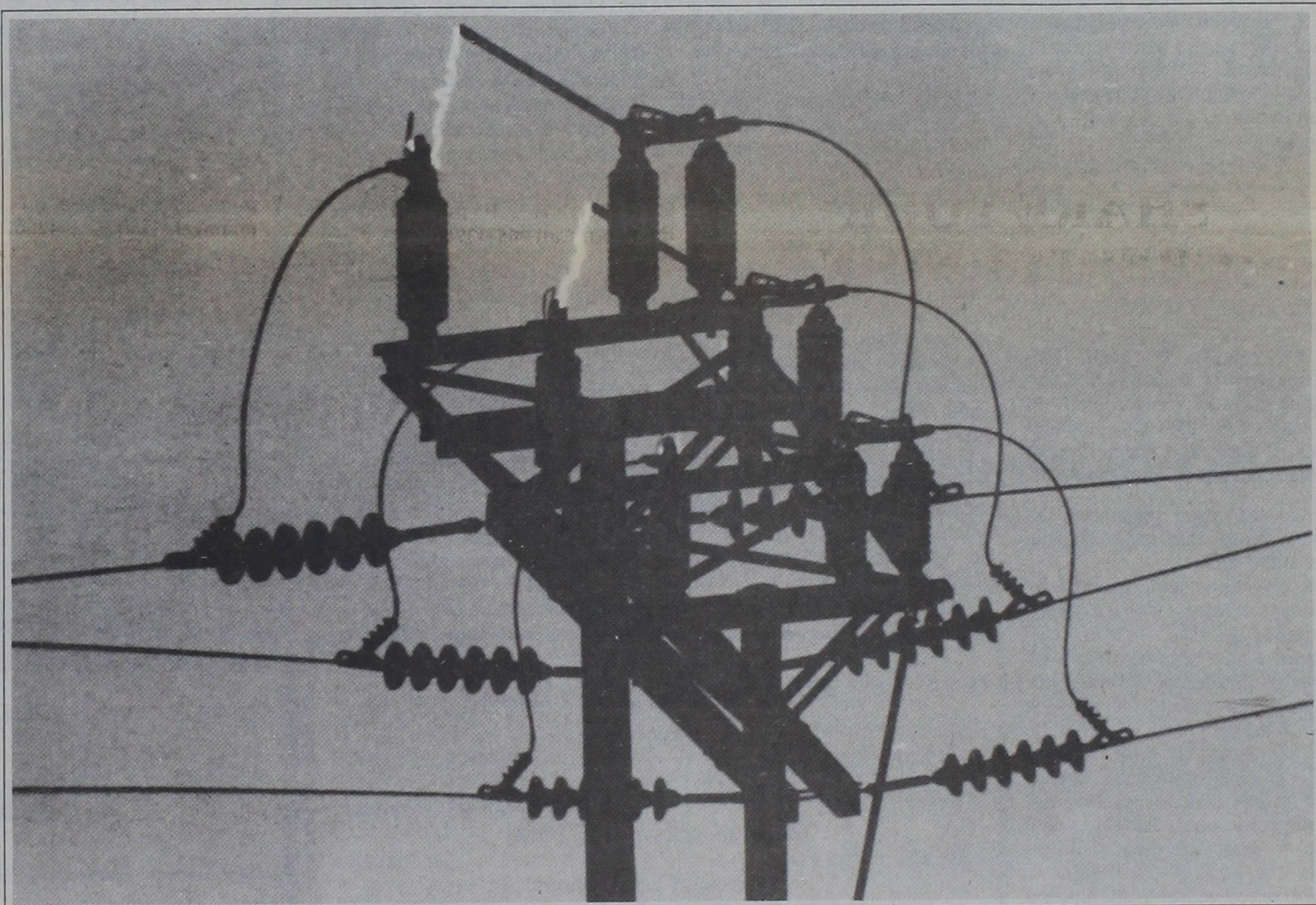

Children through sixth grade will be provided for at the Seminar. Registration is \$25 and housing will be furnished.

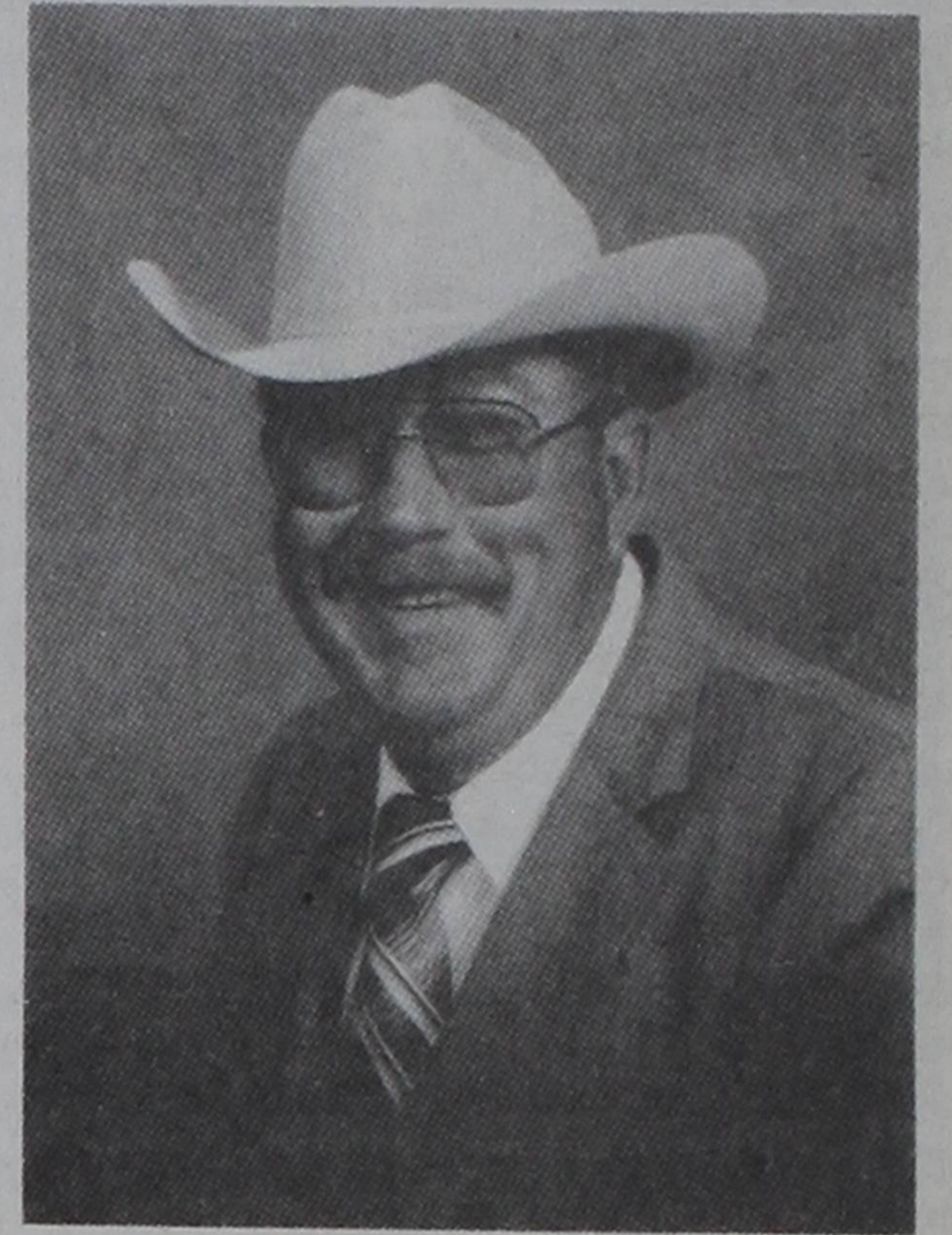
