For some distance I rode with a a man who was slightly intoxicated, but was agreeable in disposition. did not feel charmed with his presence. I felt thirsty and walked to the water tank for a drink. My 'partner" followed me and presented his flask of red-eye. I informed him that my religion, politics, and lodge obligations forbade my indulging, whereupon he very kindly assured me that he had "plenty of it" and that "it was perfectly free." His generosity was admirable; but it was of no service to me, as he and viewed the temperance question differently.

Laredo is a dingy, dusky place. Were it not for the fact that Laredo s an important gateway between two Republics and in the midst of considerable mining interests she would be an insignificant place. On the south bank of the Rio Grande River is located Nueva Laredo, a town of about 6,000 people. Both the American and Mexican Laredos are greatly Mexicanized. The streets are narrow and the buildings unartistic, as a rule. I had thought in times agone that the Plains country could present fewer people with bleached cutis than any other country in America; but I changed my mind after visiting Laredo. Many of the white people at the Laredos are so greatly tanned that they could rass unchallenged as Mexicans among people not accustomed to associating with Mexicans.

An iron bridge spans the Rio Grande River connecting the two Laredos. It is used as both a wagon and a foot toll bridge. I paid five cents for the privilege of walking across to New Laredo and the same amount to return. At about the
