

The names of the other candidates for State offices were presented and voted on at one time, and all were endorsed by acclamation. As stated before, the nominations of candidates for State offices were merely formal. as there was only one aspirant for each position before the Convention.

After the nominations for State offices were declared, the Convention proceeded to the election of the Chairman of the Democratic Executive Committee, which was disposed of before the Convention adjourned for noon. Of the chairmanship contest I shall write under another caption below.






