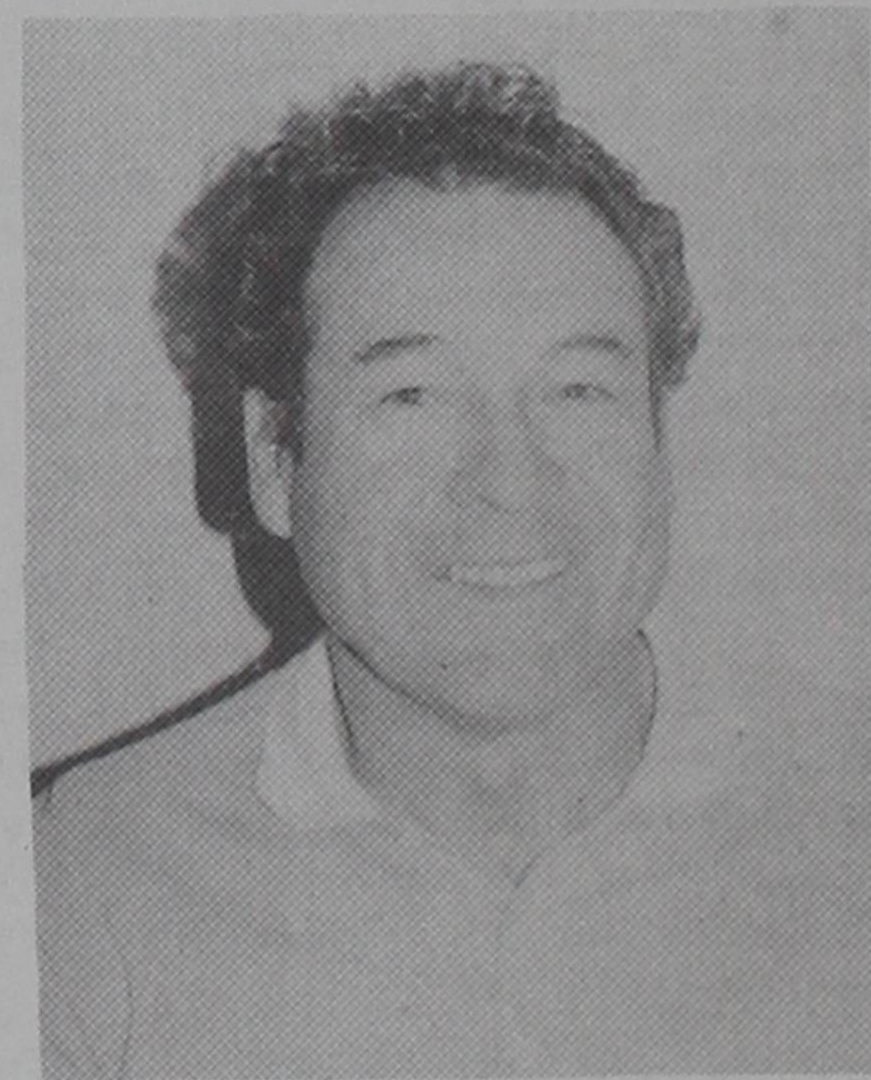

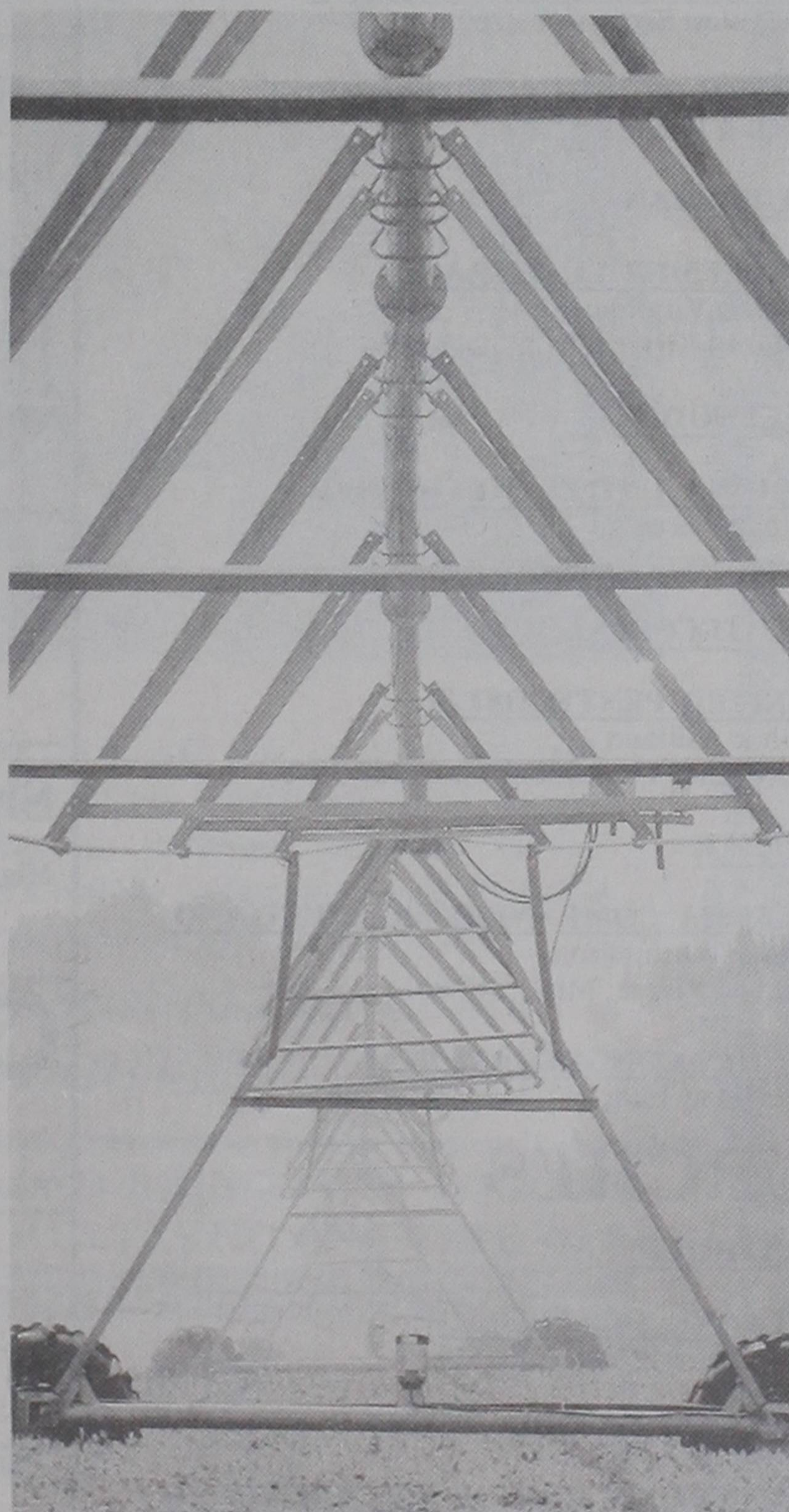

# Varsity Girls Top State-Ranked Sudan For Tourney Championship

The Friona High School Squaws won the championship of the "Shallowater Shootout" last weekend, breezing to wins over Lubbock Roosevelt and Idalou and then scoring a spine-tingling last-second win over state-ranked Sudan in the championship game.

The wins ran the team's season record to 7-0.

Thursday night the team downed Roosevelt, 62-39. Jenny Procter got the team off and running with a pair of three-point baskets in the first period. She finished with five three-pointers for the game.

Friona led 16-13 after one quarter, and with Alicia Widner

coming up with a six-point second quarter, the Squaws went to intermission with a 29-21 lead.

The scoring fell off for both teams in the third quarter, as each team scored ten points. Friona led, 39-31.

The Squaws put the game away with a 23-point fourth quarter. Miss Procter hit three baskets, two from beyond the circle, and was two of two at the line, and Miss Widner added a pair of goals and one of two from the line.

Miss Procter took game scoring honors with 21 points and Miss Widner added 17.

On Friday, the Squaws were ahead of Idalou 7-5 in a low scoring game at the end of the first quarter.

The team took advantage of free throws in the second quarter, hitting nine of 12 to hike their lead. Kendra Gordon made six of six. Mendi Milner scored two of two from the line and a pair of baskets from the field for a 28-15 halftime lead for Friona.

Idalou had their best quarter in the third, outscoring the Squaws 16-14, but Friona still had a 42-31 lead at the buzzer.

Then Jenny Procter warmed up with five baskets, two of them good for three points, sparking Friona to 28 points in the quarter and a final score of 70-48.

Miss Gordon scored 15 points, and Miss Procter 14, with 12 of her points coming in the final quarter.

In the title game Miss Gordon scored six first-half points, but Sudan went to intermission with a 24-20 lead.

The Hornettes kept their lead in the third quarter, which ended with Friona on the short end of a 36-27 score.

"Between quarters we decided we needed to make Sudan play our game, and just try to cut into the lead two points at a time," said Squaw coach Shirlene Lilley.

The Squaws put on a full-court press which caused the Hornettes to turn the ball over several times, and sure enough, Friona began to chip away at the lead.

Renee Downey sank three baskets, one a three-pointer; Mendi Milner had six points and finally with 21 seconds left in the game, Friona had trimmed Sudan's lead to two points, 47-45.

Friona called time out and then worked for an open shot. Miss Procter fed the ball to Miss Gordon for an open layup, and the game was tied at 47-all with just four seconds left.

Sudan made a mistake by in-bounding the ball, as Miss Procter stole the pass and went up for a shot. She was fouled on the shot attempt, and went to the free throw line with a single second showing on the clock.

"It was good for us to be tested like this, and have the poise to come back and win. The girls are really fighters. I'm real excited about the way they played. I think we have the ingredients to be a successful team if we continue to improve," the first-year girls coach stated.

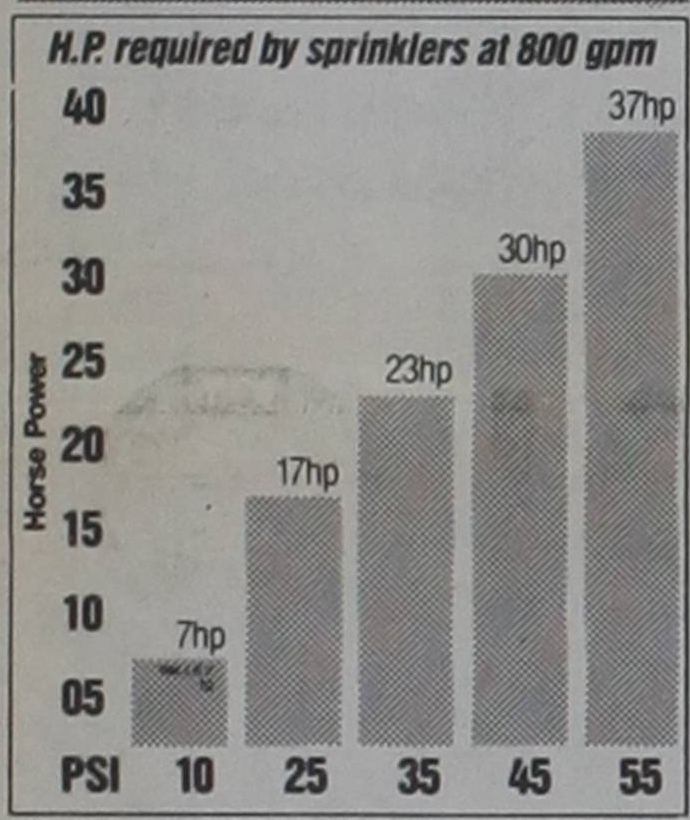

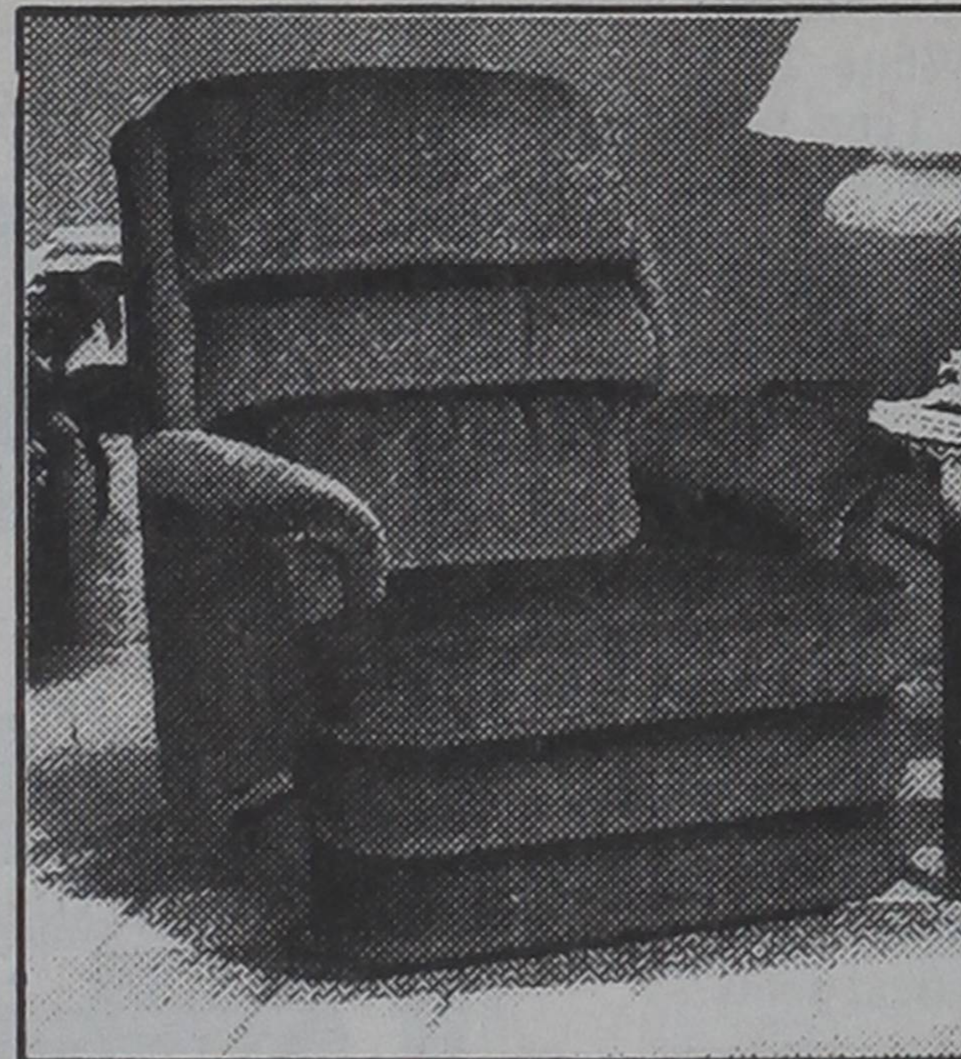
