There is a law against the practice of hunting and fishing on the premises of another, which is substantially as follows: Any person who hunts or fishes upon the premises of another without the consent of the owner or person in charge is subject to a fine, provided such premises constitute no mere than 2000 acres; if the enclosure contains more than that amount of land a person can enter if not posted. This may not be exactly as the law is, but it is something like it. - Oakwood Reporter.


