





#### KEEP THE YOUNG

CROP GROWING The secret of successful crop raising consists first in proper preparation and fertilization of the soil and is only an illustration of what can be then in rapid and proper cultivation. It is true that when one has thoroughly prepared his soil and fertifized it he has done the hardest and most expensive portion of the work. but the cultivation of the soil after the speds are up is still a very important factor in final success. The objects sought in the cultivation of the crop are mainly three-fold. First, the destruction of any foreign growth such as weeds and grass; these are objectionable because they use both moisture and food that should go towards nourishing the plants that are being grown. All sidewalks herein ordered to be constructed shall be uniform, shall be four feet in, width and shall be built upon uniform and regular grade, and of a uniform thickness of four inch grouting with a top coat one inch thick, and of uniform. material, consisting of sand, cement and gravel as follows: For grouting. 3 parts gravel, 2 parts sand, and 1 part cement; and for top coat 2 parts clean sharp sand and I part cement.
