## Credit Union Elects Two New Directors

The Friona Texas Federal Credit Union held its 44th annual meeting on Tuesday, April 7, at the Junior High cafeteria.

The meeting was presided over by John Fred White, credit union board chairman. Entertainment for the evening was provided by Charles Turner.

Brownie Troop #97 performed the flag ceremony.

There were 136 registered members present plus family and guests.

Credit union employees Billie Tongate and Lucy Hernandez were awarded service pins. Tongate has been with the credit union 25 years and Hernandez received a 5 year pin.

Gerald Wylly and Roger Nelson were elected as new

members of the board of directors. Mike Lamb and Henry Gauna were re-elected to the credit committee. Coy Jameson was elected secretary/treasurer on the board.

Credit union president Barbara Maynard gave a positive report to the members. In 1997, there were 317 new members who joined the credit union. Also, a new security system was installed at the credit union building and Friona industrial arts students are building a new sign for outside of the office.

This year, the door prize drawings were for cash certificates to spend with local merchants, to help contribute to the economy of local businesses.

**MARY KATE ZEMAN**, a former Friona resident who has lived in Pecos for a number of years, sent us some interesting material recently.

Mary Kate unearthed her copy of "The First Thirty Years," an account of the establishment of Texas Tech University, written by Ruth Horn Andrews, the daughter of Tech's first president, Paul W. Horn. In her narrative, the author wrote:

"Not everyone was enthusiastic about the new college or thought it was needed.

"A member of the appropriations committee of the (Texas) Legislature told President Horn that if as many as 300 students enrolled at Texas Tech for its first semester, he would walk from Austin out to greet them.

"When the first registration closed (in 1925), a total of 914 students had enrolled. President Horn telegraphed the lawmaker: "Start Walking!"

"Only freshmen and sophomores were admitted that first year. A total of 220 Texas towns and cities were represented. Out-of-state enrollment totaled 24, representing five states.

"By January of 1926, a total of 1015 students had enrolled, proving the college was badly needed, especially in view of the fact that other Texas colleges did not show a decrease in enrollment.

"The following buildings were ready for use on opening day: the first units of the Administration and Home Economics buildings, the Textile Engineering Building (which at that time housed all engineering classes), the Stock Judging Pavillion, the dairy barn and the president's residence (which now houses the Tech Ex-Students Assn.).

With a campus of 2,008 acres, and with only a few buildings dotted here and there, distances seemed endless. Hapless students and professors with nine o'clock classes in the Administration Building and ten o'clock classes in the Textile Building came to refer the latter as the "Amarillo Branch."

In his message to the students in the Tech yearbook La Ventana, Dr. Horn said in part:

"Everything that is done on these West Texas Plains ought to be on a big scale. It is a country that lends itself to bigness. It is a country that does not harmonize with things little or narrow. Let us make the work of our college fit in with the scope of our country. Let our thoughts be big thoughts and broad thoughts. Let our thinking be in world-wide terms.

"There will always be room at Texas Tech for things that are big. There will be room for courage and industry and hard work, for love of God and of man, for faith in God and faith in Humanity.

"May our college make for the spiritual and material development of the land in which we live, for the coming of universal peace and good will among the nations, and for the extension of the Kingdom of Heaven among men."

Thanks, Mary Kate. Hasn't our alma mater proven its need? And with the addition of a modern medical school with its state-of-the-art teaching hospital, and law school, among others, its founders could scarcely have dreamed it would be the institution it is today.

With its new high-rise dormitories, library and other modern buildings on the campus, Dr. Horn would hardly recognize his 1920s creation. It's hard to imagine what the Panhandle-South Plains would be today without Texas Tech.

## Morton Takes Job At Lbb. Monterey

James Morton, six-year coach of the Friona High School Chieftain football team who led the Chiefs to the state semi-finals in 1996, has accepted the position of head coach at Lubbock Monterey High School.

The Lubbock school is a 5A school, with sophomore-junior-senior enrollment of over 2300.

Morton told the Friona Star that it was with "a lot of mixed emotions" that he decided to make the move.

"In some ways it's an advancement. But we've had a lot of great things here. The relationship we've had with the players, parents, fans and members of the community have meant a lot to me. We thought and prayed about the matter quite a bit. It wasn't an easy decision," Morton said.

Morton told his players earlier this week about his decision, and indicated that this was a very hard experience.

"Words can't express my thanks for the support we've had from our great fans. The biggest enjoyment I've had while in Friona was seeing how the town 'came alive' and supported us. But they also supported us the first year, when we were 0-10.

"I grew up in a small town, and Friona is the epitome of small towns and how they support their teams and kids," Morton said.

"I'll always want the best for these kids who are coming up. The school officials are the same ones who brought

me in, and I'm confident they'll find a qualified person to take over here. This hasn't been a "James Morton" deal (the success we've had). It's been WE, and not ME," he emphasized.

Morton's last two teams set won-lost and advancement records at FHS. His '96 team won 13 straight games enroute to its semi-final appearance at Texas Stadium, and the '97 team was the only one in Friona history to roll up a 10-0 regular season record. The last two years combined for a record of 23-3, which is a laudable 88.4 winning percentage.

Even with his 0-10 start with the 1992 team, Morton's overall record was 42-24-1, a winning average of 63.4 per cent.

Anyone interested in voting early may do so at the Friona Schools Administration Building at 909 E. 11th from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The election will be held on Saturday, May 2 with voting taking place at the Fire Station at 102 E. 8th Street. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

"Voting for public officials is not only a right in our country, but a privilege which some people in our world do not have," said Chamber Executive Director Kathryn Goddard. "We urge everyone who is eligible to exercise this privilege."

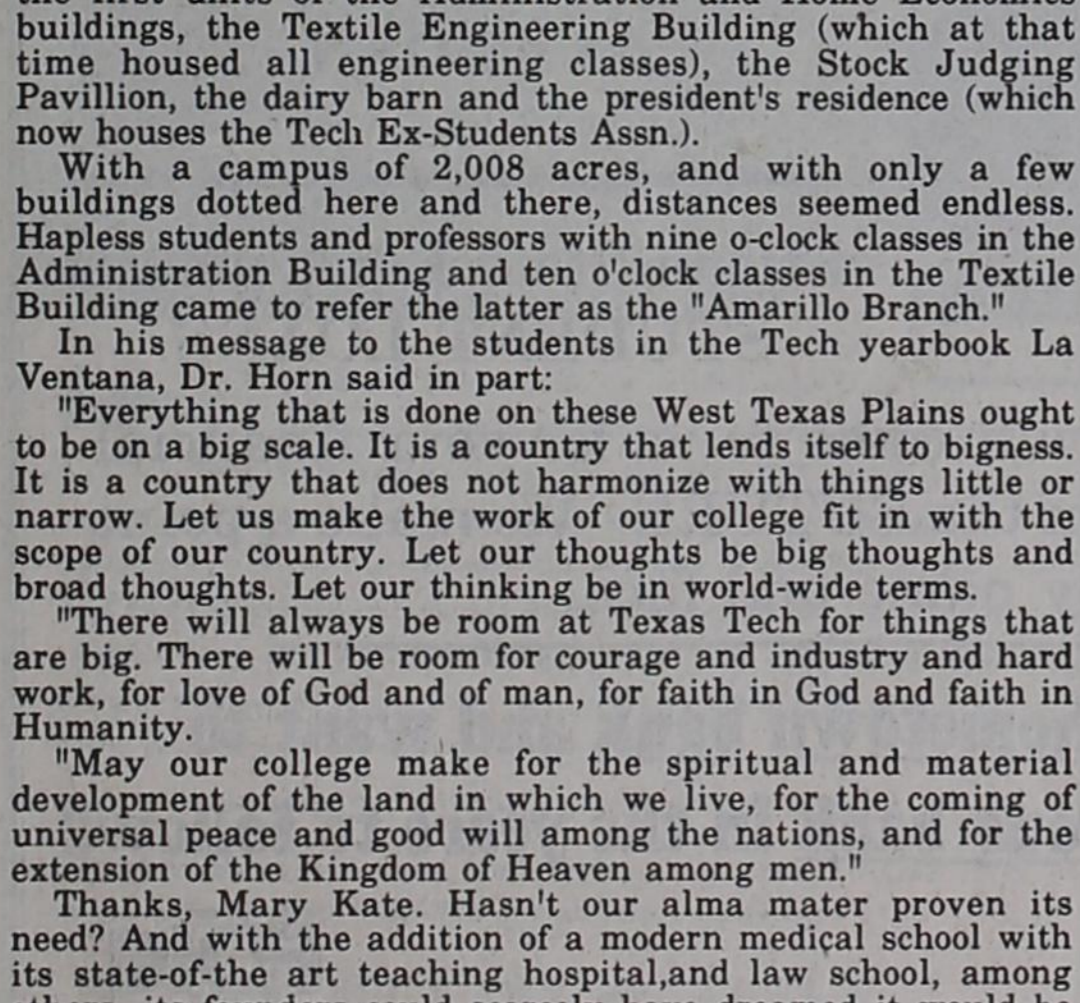

A lost-time accident is one in which an employee suffers an accident and is unable to return to work the following day. In addition, a facility's lost-time accident record is used in determining its qualification for the President's Safety Award which honors Farmland facilities for establishing and maintaining outstanding safe work environments.

To qualify for these annual awards, facilities must operate for an entire calendar year with no lost-time accidents (LTA) or reduce both the number and severity of LTAs by ten per cent of a three year average.

"Farmland is proud of the safety record the employees at the Black facility achieved by making safety a part of their work philosophy," said Dwight Fenton, director of Farmland's Environmental Health and Safety division. "Their successful safety record shows that each employee is committed to maintaining a safe work environment."

# Friona Flashbacks

## 70 Yrs Ago-April 13, 1928

On Tuesday morning of this week, the town was aroused from its slumbers with the news that the Dixie Filling Station was burning. The entire building, which contained three compartments, housing besides the filling station the Woodell Produce and Restaurant, and the Highway Garage, was completely destroyed. S.M. Malone of Roswell owned the Highway Garage. Mr. and Mrs. J.H. Woodell owned the restaurant.

## 60 Yrs Ago-April 8, 1938

F.W. Reeve was re-elected as mayor of Friona in the city election here Tuesday. Reeve received 42 votes, to 34 for J.A. Blackwell. F.L. Spring and Carl C. Maurer were elected as members of the city commission. Votes were 60 for Spring, 45 for Maurer, 25 for T.J. Crawford and 20 for O.F. Lange. Spring and Reeve have each served two terms on the city council.

## 55 Yrs Ago-April 9, 1943

Funeral rites for Clyde Seamands, Friona's outstanding pioneer cattleman and rancher, was held here Sunday afternoon at the Union Congregational Church. Rev. Paxton Smith, pastor of the church, was in charge of the services and preached the funeral sermon.

Mr. and Mrs. Dick Habbinga, who have been in Indiana since selling their farm here last summer, have returned to Texas, according to a card from them this week.

## 50 Yrs Ago-April 9, 1948

In the annual school election here last Saturday, two trustees were elected from a slate of seven candidates. Jake Lamb, with 81 votes, and D.O. Robason, with 54, were elected. Others were Marvin Lawson, 26 votes; Leo McLellan, 34 votes; Ralph Wilson, 49 votes; Glenn Reeve, 12; and Carl Maurer, 28.

In the city election Tuesday, Mack Bainum was elected mayor, with Carl Maurer and Nelson Welch elected as commissioners in a write-in vote which produced one of the liveliest city elections in years.

## 45 Yrs Ago-April 9, 1953

Rev. George E. Meyer, who has served as pastor of Friona's Congregational Church the past three years, announced his resignation this week. Rev. Meyer said he planned to leave the ministry.

## 40 Yrs Ago-April 10, 1958

An all-new building and plant to house and produce The Friona Star will soon be a reality, W.H. Graham, Jr., publisher, announces this week. Development plans call for completion on June 20, and first production work is anticipated July 1, he says. Jones Construction Company got the contract for the construction of a 48x46 foot addition to the present school cafeteria for their bid of \$20,722.

## 35 Yrs Ago-April 11, 1963

The Friona Independent School board was faced with 70 applications for the job of coach of the Friona Chieftains in its regular monthly meeting Monday night. Applications came from all parts of Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico.

The annual spring meeting of the Texas Home Demonstration Assn.'s District I will be held in Friona today. Around 350 women are expected to converge on Friona from a 19-county area.

## 30 Yrs Ago-April 11, 1968

Over 40 representatives of the press and area industrial leaders attended a special tour of the Missouri Beef facilities Monday, conducted by Missouri Beef's president, R.E. (Gene) Frye. The special tour was arranged to help publicize the new Friona plant's dedication and open house on April 20 and 21. The dedication ceremony, to which the public is invited, is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. Saturday, April 20. State Senator Jack Hightower of Vernon will act as master of ceremonies.

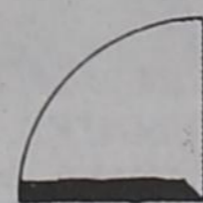

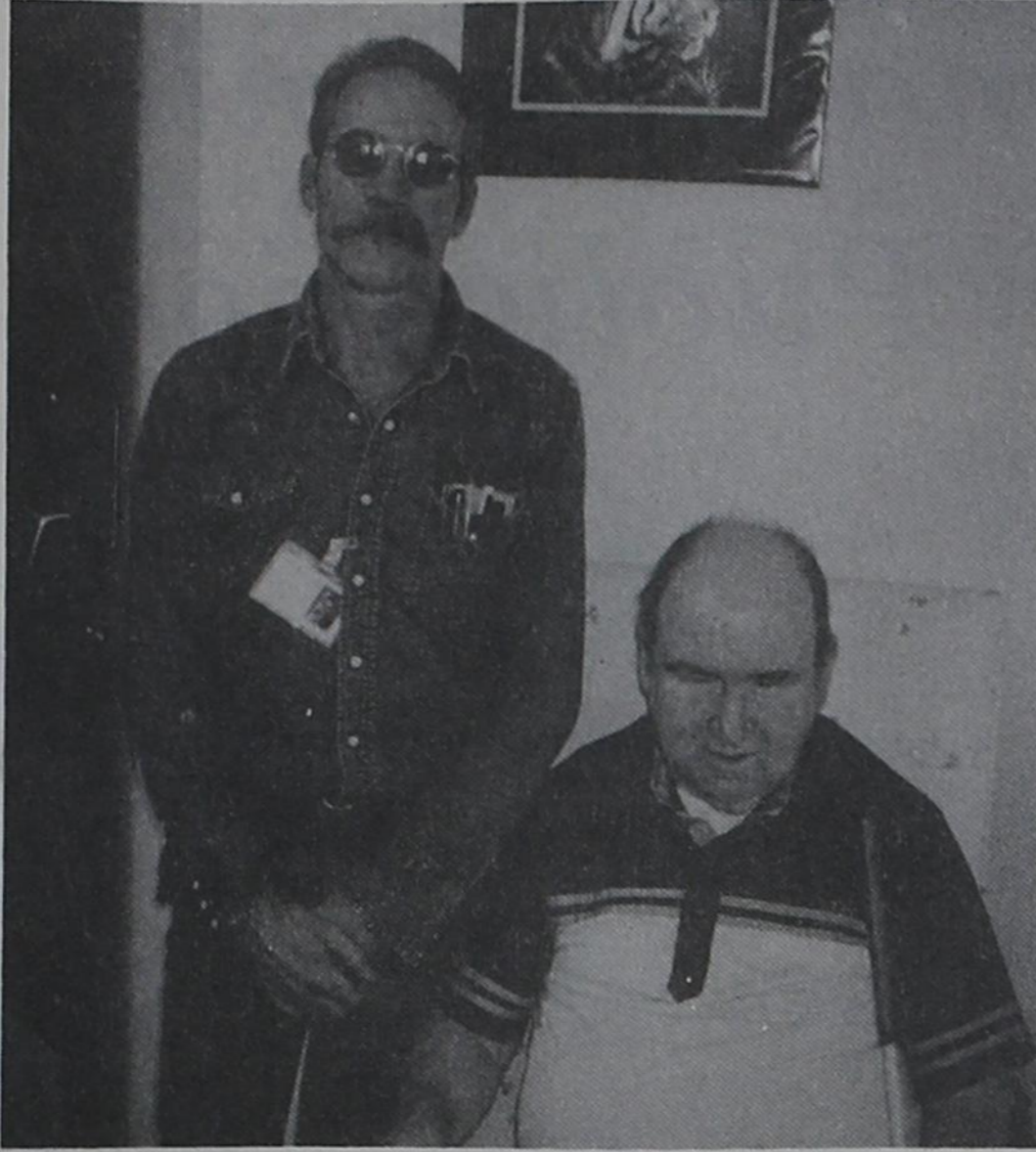

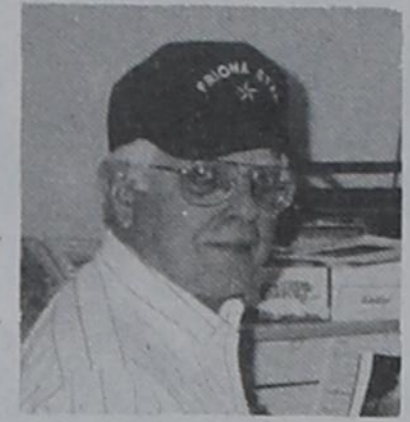

While tinkering with some pieces of plywood and a yardstick, Mr. Shoemaker and Mr. Knabusch made a wood-slat-reclining lawn chair. A furniture buyer refused to buy it unless it was upholstered, so they added that feature.

Unsure what to call the chair, they held a name-the-chair contest and La-Z-Boy beat out the Sit-N-Snooze, the Slack-Back, and the Comfort Carrier.

It would be 33 years later, in 1961, when Mr. Shoemaker combined a platform rocker and his recliner; the first La-Z-Boy Recliner Rocker.

They say it was the right chair at the right time since television took over America's living rooms during the 1960s. It earned a nickname of "the bubba chair" with the image of a bubba with a

remote in one hand and a beer in the other.

These days, the La-Z-Boy can be purchased with a built-in massager, a built-in speakerphone, or a plug for a laptop computer.

Up until his death, Mr. Shoemaker, the man with an eighth grade education, served as executive vice-president of engineering and vice chairman of the board.

At first, the La-Z-Boy market was mainly men who brought home the bacon, then sat back while the wives cooked it.

In 1963, one advertisement said, "The king of the house should have a throne, here's a Reclina-Rocker all your own." Now, La-Z-Boy says women account for half the company's sales.

Mr. Shoemaker's son said his dad died sitting in his La-Z-Boy during halftime of a football game. "It beats the hell out of a cancer ward," he said.

Thank you Mr. Shoemaker and may you always have your favorite La-Z-Boy in heaven. \*\*\*\*\*

The sign over in front of the State Farm office says "Jesus Is Alive." That means it is time again to celebrate Easter.

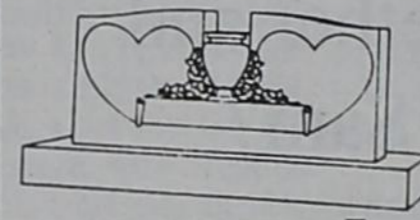

My son Victor Guzman is married to Rosie Vasquez and they have four children, Audrey, Stephanie, Mark and Victor, Jr. They live in Big Spring, Texas.

My son Felix Guzman is married to Lisa Guerra. They have two daughters, Alexis and Alicia. They live in Friona.

My only daughter, Vickie, is married to Mark Devance and they also live in Friona.

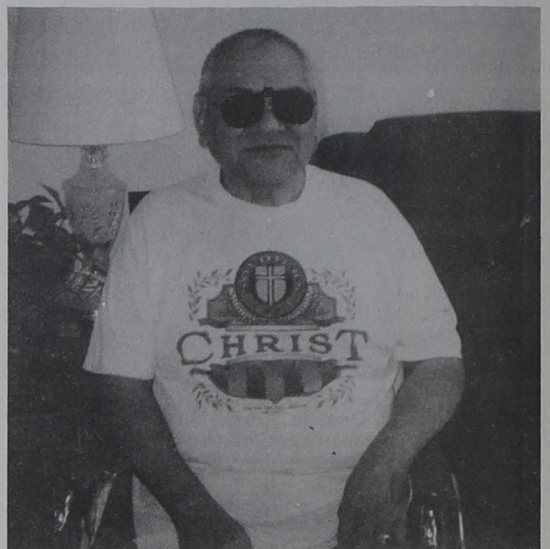
My youngest son, Nicholas Guzman, lives in Friona and is in the ninth grade in high school.

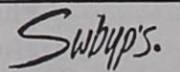

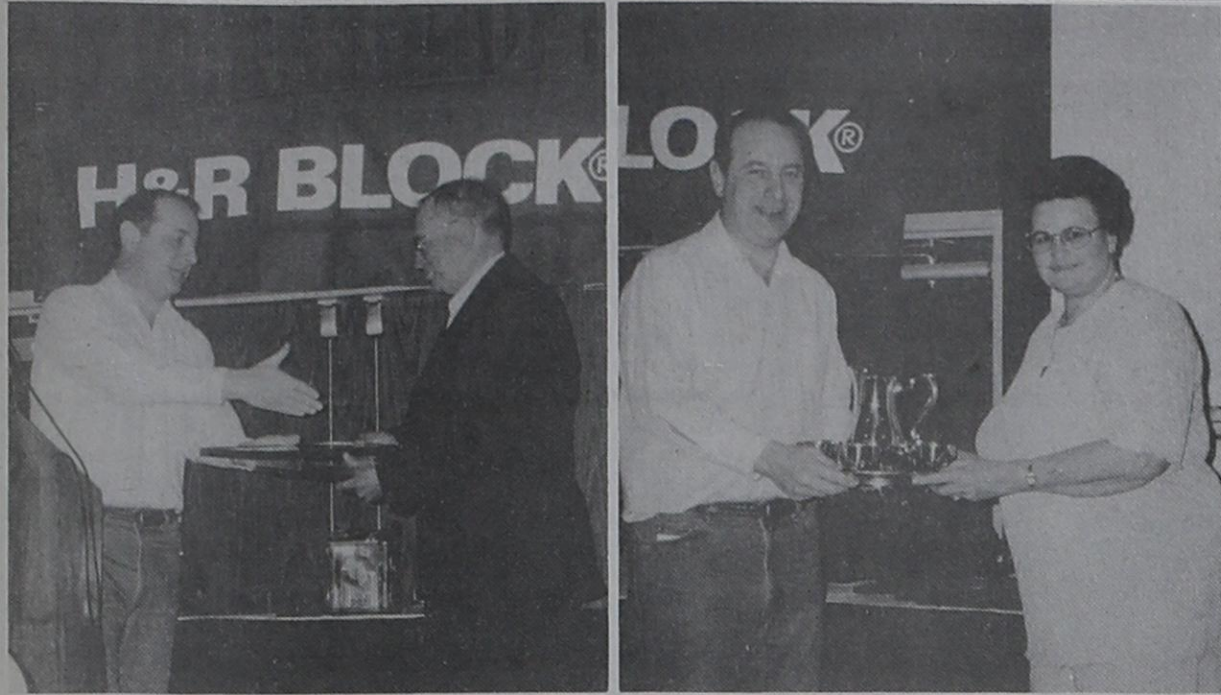

Approximately 215 Texas Tech University students were recently inducted into the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, one of the university's highest awards.

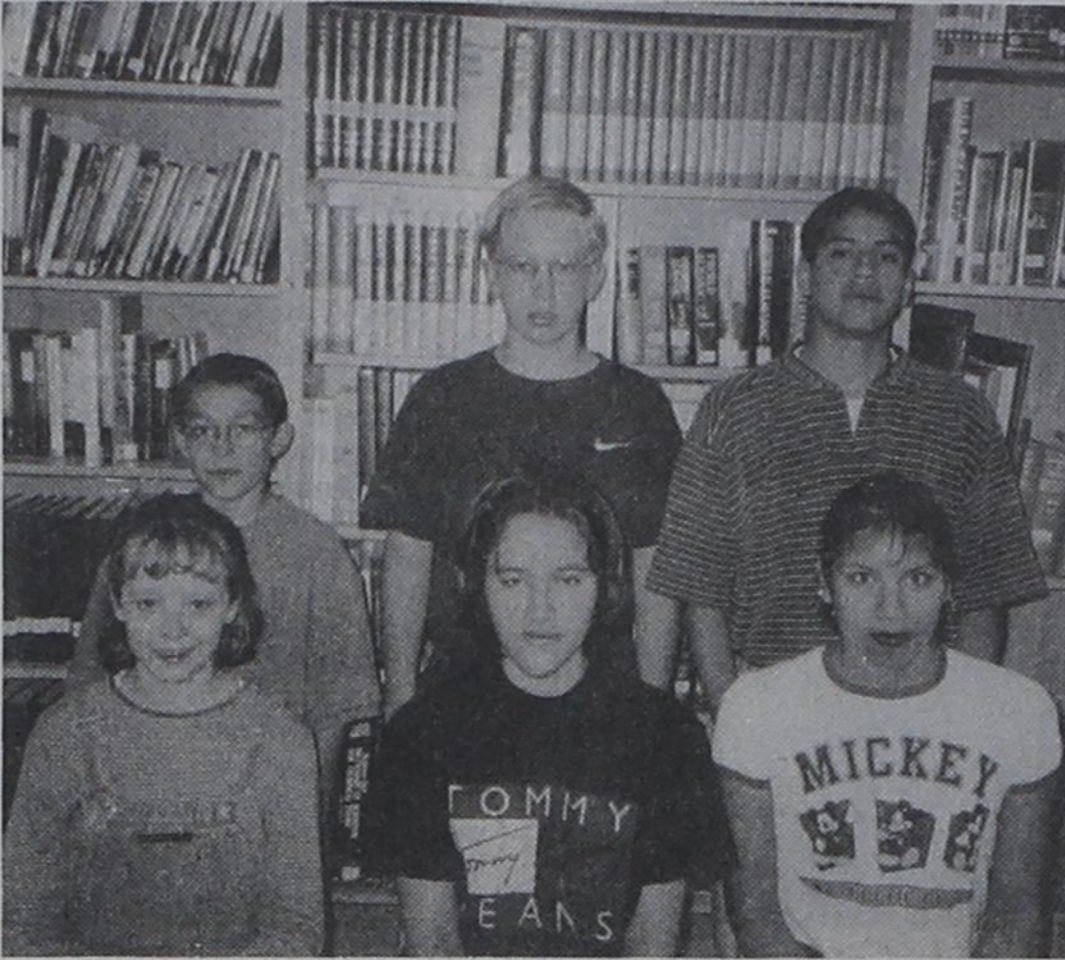
Teresa Jack, a Texas Tech accounting major, was among the inductees. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Taylor of Friona.

## YOUR EYES

### Can You Prevent Cataracts?



For many years, it seemed that cataracts were inevitable. If a person lived long enough, he or she would eventually suffer the impaired vision that comes with cloudy or opaque lenses. Recent researchers indicate that good health habits can prevent cataracts, or at least delay them.

Sun exposure over a period of years has been shown to be a key to developing cataracts. Smart move: wear quality sunglasses that protect against both ultraviolet A and ultraviolet B. Wear them whenever the light is bright enough to make you squint, even on cloudy days and most especially at high elevations.

Smoking is another culprit. The risk of cataracts rises with the number of cigarettes smoked. Smokers are at least twice as likely to develop cataracts as nonsmokers. On the plus side, there is some evidence that vitamin-rich diets high in vitamins C and E and beta carotene may forestall or prevent cataracts.
