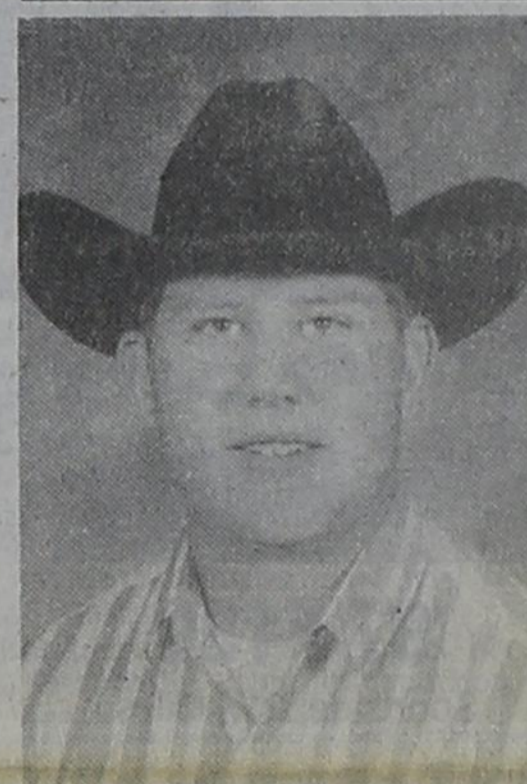
### Cowboy Breakfast Anyone?

### BILLY GARNER Youth Dies In Rural Accident

A Friona youth, Billy Garner, 19, died as a result of a one-vehicle rollover late last Friday, May 22 about nine miles northwest of Friona.

Investigators said Garner was ejected from his Ford pickup as it rolled over twice on County Road 11.

It was determined that Garner was not wearing a seat belt, and that the pickup was traveling at a high rate of speed.

A spokesman for the Department of Safety said that the vehicle went off the roadway, dived into a bar ditch and flipped over twice.

Garner was a 1997 graduate of Friona High School, and was a member of the 1996 Chieftain football team that went to the state semi-finals. He was a tackle and wore number 75 as a senior.

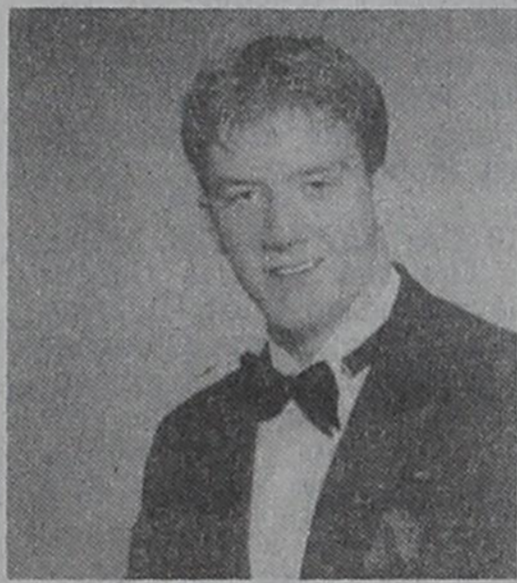
Cameron Turner is the son of Vernon and Tammie Turner. His grade point average for four years is 95.112.

Quint Ellis was MVP for boys varsity track & field. Ellis also earned his way into regional track & field all four years at FHS and holds the school record in the 110 hurdles.

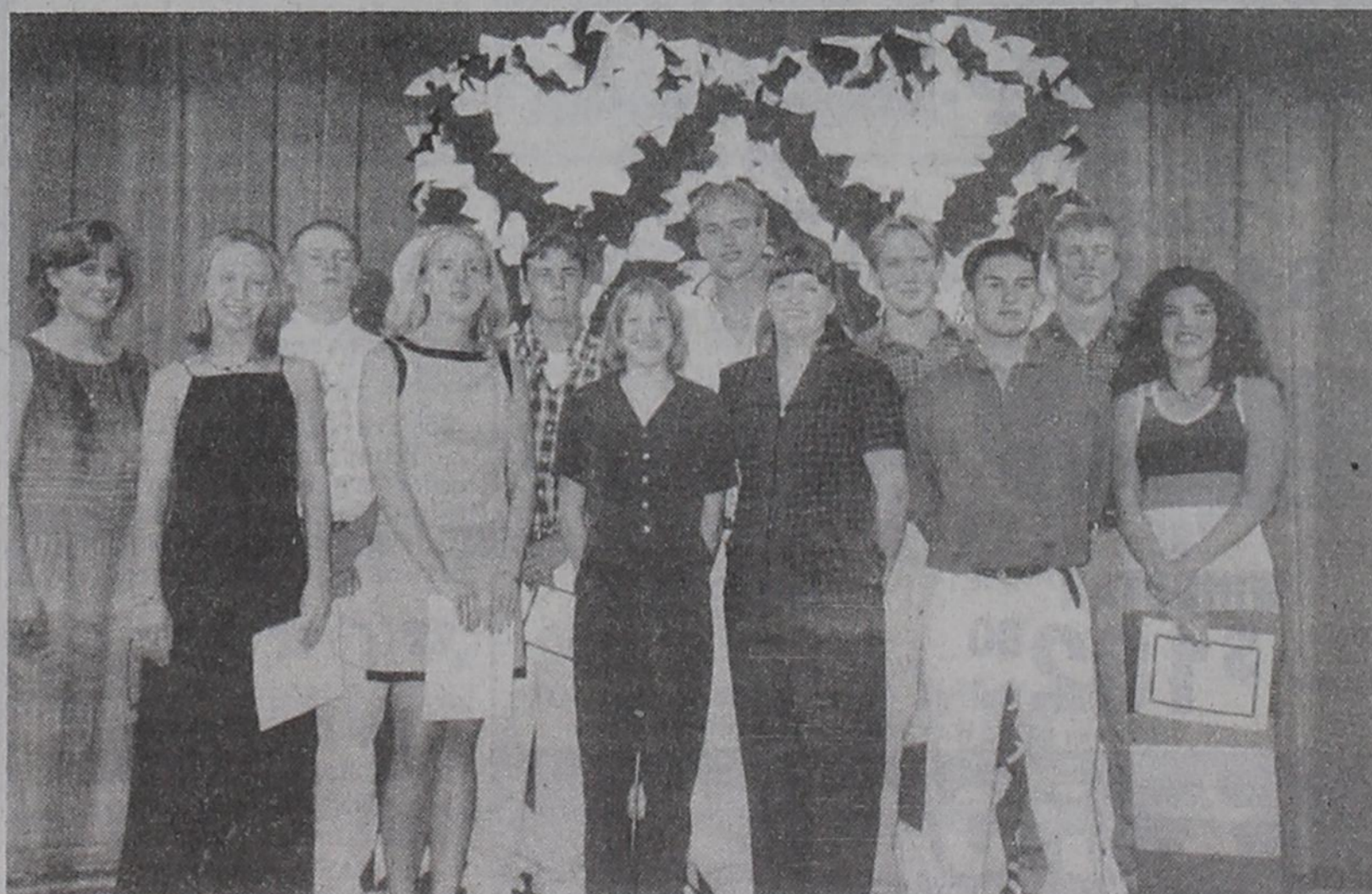

The grave site was piled high with flours as longtime friend, Aunt Jemima, delivered the eulogy, describing Fresh as a man who "never knew how much he was kneaded."

Fresh rose quickly in show business, but his later life was filled with many turnovers. He was not considered a very smart cookie, wasting much of his youth on half-baked schemes -- conned by those who buttered him up. Still even as a crusty old man, he was a roll model for millions.

Fresh is survived by his second wife. They have two children and a bun in the oven.

The funeral was held at 3:50 for twenty minutes.

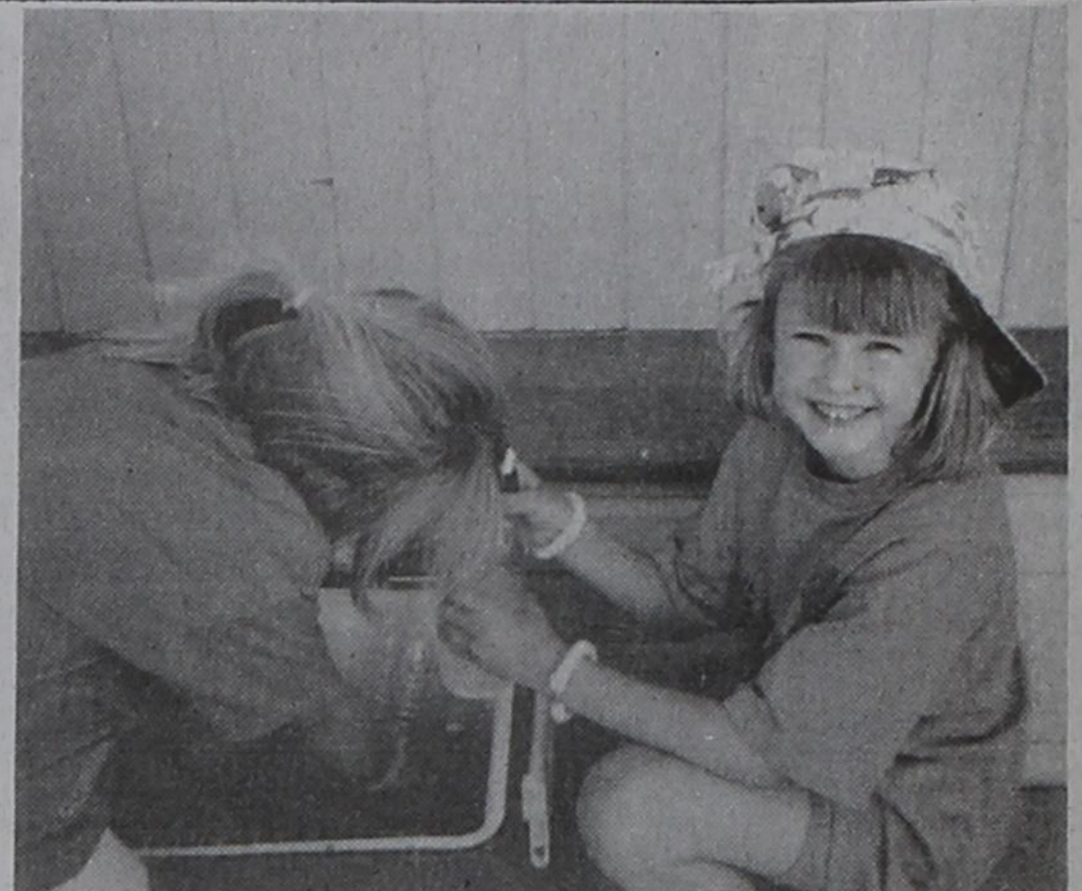

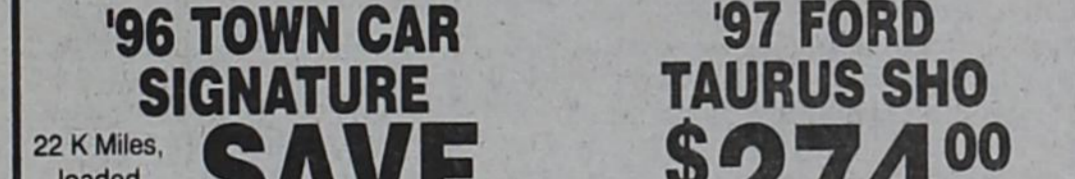

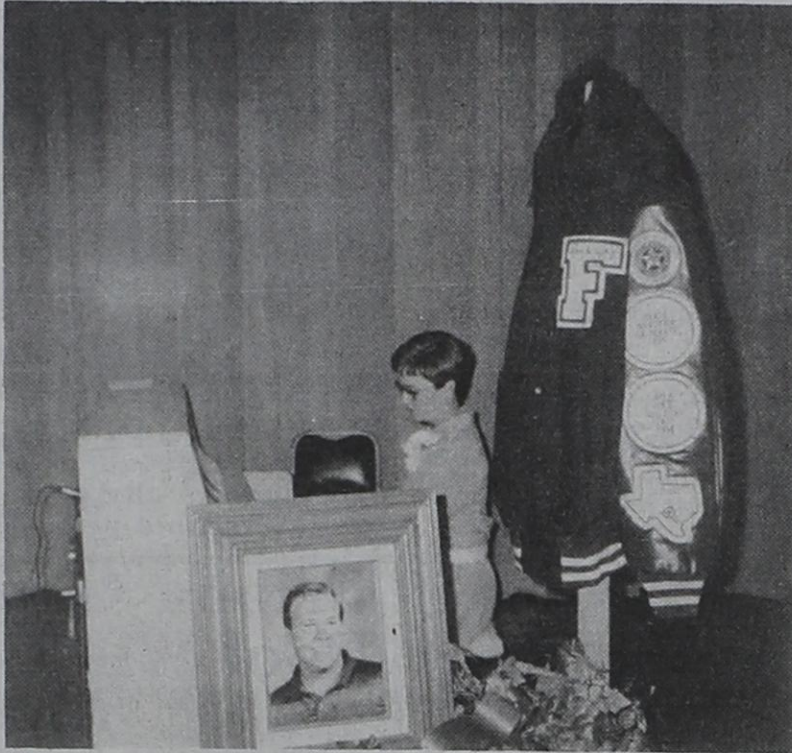

## TAAS/TEAMS Examination Schedule Has Been Released

Individuals who have met all requirements for high school graduation but have not passed one or more sections of the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) or the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) may take the test this July.

Testing will be on the following dates for TAAS: July 14-writing; July 15-mathematics; July 16-reading.

Testing will be on the following dates for TEAMS: July 15-mathematics; July 16-English language arts.

All individuals who wish to take the TEAMS test(s) must register in advance. This includes students currently enrolled in Texas public high schools as well as individuals who have completed all other high school graduation

requirements. The only individuals who must register for the TAAS test(s) are those who are no longer enrolled in school who have not met minimum expectations on all sections of the TAAS test or a student who will be testing in a district other than the district that they are enrolled in.

A registration packet may be picked up at any high school campus, district central office, or education service center.

Your completed registration form must be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than 5 p.m., June 12, 1998.

# Friona Volunteers Perform Rope Rescue At Feed Yard

John Taylor, Steve Jones, and Randy Gerie have attended several rope rescue training courses over the years but until Thursday, May 21, had never needed the skill in a live situation.

On that Thursday, a worker at Friona Feed Yard stepped backward on a 60-foot high tower and found his foot tangled in a grain auger.

The worker was on top of the tower alone and unable to extricate his foot from the auger or to get anyone's attention for help.

According to Paramedic Dana Hendrix, he forced his foot loose from the auger and managed to get someone's attention on the ground by throwing grain down.

Friona EMS and Fire Department volunteers called to the scene found it necessary to scale the tower by ladder, then cross a catwalk to reach the victim.

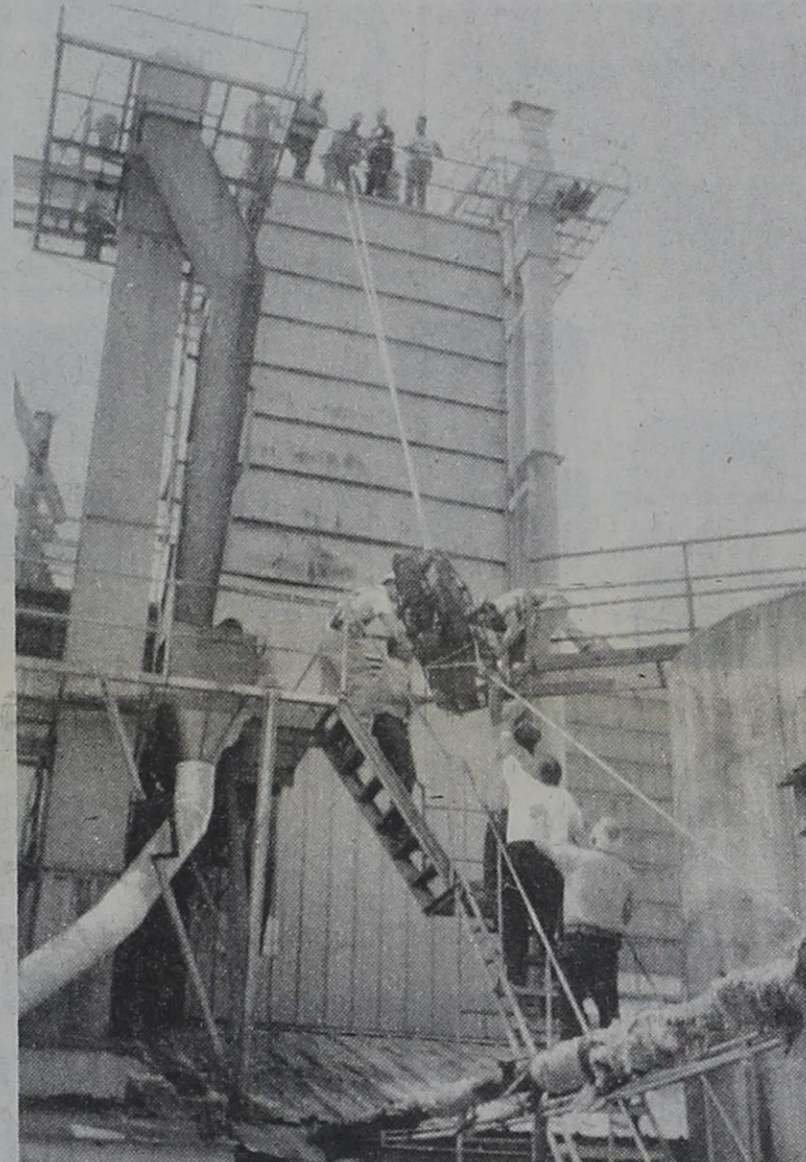
Hendrix, Taylor, Jones, Gerie, and Bryan Harris scaled the tower while many other volunteers were on the ground to coordinate the rescue efforts.

Hendrix said his foot was severely mangled and the volunteers had to stabilize his injured foot and ankle, then lower him by rope in a stretcher basket.

The operation took an hour and ten minutes. A helicopter was called and landed at the feed yard.

The worker was transported to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo and was immediately taken to surgery. Doctors said the foot could be saved if infection did not develop. At press time,

we were unable to get an update on his condition.



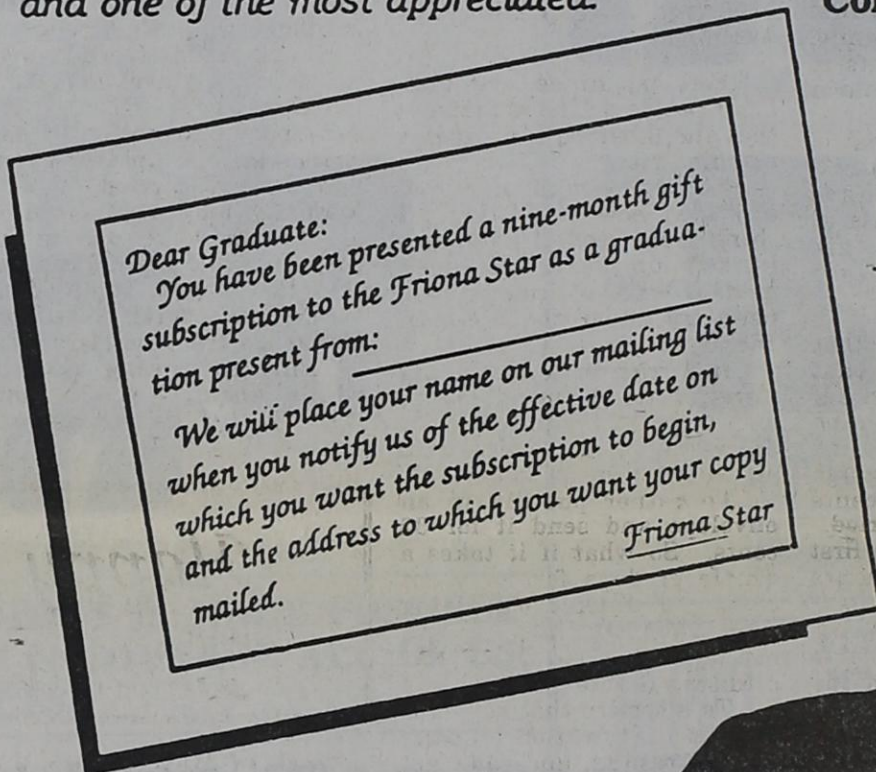

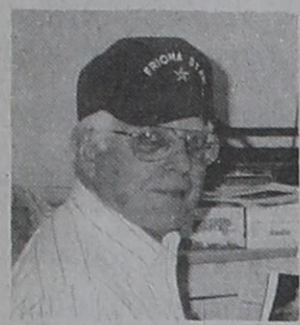

# Out Here

## Here Is 32 Cents. Take This To New York City.

Last week, I mailed my water bill to the City of Friona.

Even though I drive by City Hall several times a day, I mailed them my water bill.

Even though our Main Street is nice and new and I could park at the City Hall front door and run in to pay the bill, I still mailed it.

The United States Post Office is only about six blocks down Main Street from City Hall. I decided to pay them the 32 cents (about a nickel per block) and let them deliver it for me.

Actually the neat deal is that I wrote the check and addressed the envelope at home, put it in my curbside mailbox and raised the little red flag. My nice postlady even picked it up at my house and took it to City Hall. All for 32 cents.

There has been a great deal of whining criticism from the great unwashed because the U. S. Postal Service plans to increase the price of a first class stamp by one penny. Soon it will cost 33 cents to "hire" the post office to deliver a letter for you.

Old timers are fond of recalling when a stamp cost three cents. They rant and rave about "them bandits at the post office that are ripping us off and can't even deliver the mail on time."

It doesn't seem to bother these same old-timers that the cost of a gallon of gasoline has risen from nine cents to a dollar and nine cents (or more), while a stamp has only gone up 30 cents during the same time period.

Raising the price of a first class stamp to 33 cents doesn't bother me. There is a price level for a stamp which I would not pay, but 33 cents ain't it. It is still one of the best bargains around.

I think it is time to stop with all the criticism about the postal service.

The Big Paper in Amarillo ran an editorial that

concluded "it is not fair for the postal service to ask for more money." Who decides what is fair?

The last time I took a look at life, there were numerous occasions which seemed unfair. For instance, I don't think it is fair that a box of cereal costs \$5. I don't think it is fair that others win the lottery.

I don't think it is fair that an airline can lose your luggage and still charge you for the air ticket. Fair is fair but usually we don't care if it applies to others, just ourselves.

I have two kids in Wichita Falls, one in Colorado for the summer, one in Dallas, and one in Coppell, plus a bunch of friends scattered from coast to coast.

For 32 cents and the cost of a card or piece of paper, I can hire several people to deliver a message to them.

Of course I could drive to Colorado or Dallas and carry the letter myself for maybe \$100 and a couple of days travel time.

Fax machines are fast. Only problem I have found is that the other person needs a machine too.

I could e-mail if I had any idea how to do that. I think you need a computer hooked up to a telephone modem and of course you need to know their e-mail address.

If I was in a really big hurry, I could spring for an overnight UPS or Fed-Ex delivery which could run anywhere from \$8 to \$15.

I'd rather put \$10 in an envelope and send it for 32 cents. So what if it takes a couple of days for it to get there. If I have something important to say I can always use digital cellular cordless satellite phone.

To a society that worships instant gratification, expects instant results, and can't get out of the car long enough to sit down and eat, the United States Postal Service is an

easy target.

They get beat up with jokes like "postal service is an oxymoron". First class mail is derided as "snail mail." Killing people in anger is even described as "going postal."

Some folks joke about the caps and ties and merchandise the post office sells these days. Isn't this still America?

I bought some really neat thank you notes at the Friona post office, but I must admit their ties are pretty loud but I don't wear ties anyhow.

I don't care what they sell. Nor do I think they should be criticized for making a billion dollar profit the last two years.

Nobody criticizes Bill Gates for making billions selling you software programs you don't even know how to operate.

The postal service is only raising first class rates. There are still other postage options, like second, third, and fourth class or bulk mail.

I use Priority Mail all the time to send stuff to Zac and Megan. They get excited when they see the red, white, and blue package in the mailbox.

I have a friend who writes for a travel magazine in New York City. We correspond on occasion. I can write him a couple of pages and have it carried to New York City for only 32 cents.

Besides, I like to go in the post office and see if I can get the last word in a conversation with Valton Howard, a true civil servant.

Find something else to whine about. A 33 cent stamp is still the best bargain around.
