The 52nd Annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show was held last Friday and Saturday, January 22-23 at the Friona Community Center-Showbarn.

Lamb judging began the activities on Friday morning with 58 lamb entries. The goat show immediately followed the lamb show. There were 13 goat entries. Dennis Luce of Ft. Sumner, New Mexico, served as the judge with Sonny Moore of Bovina as lamb division superintendent.

Two medium wool lambs took the top honors. Cade Morris, a Lazbuddie exhibitor, was the owner of the lamb that was named Grand Champion Lamb of the show. His 118 pound entry was the winner of the medium light medium wool class. The 156 pound heavyweight medium wool lamb shown by Cassie London of Friona took the honors of Reserve Grand Champion.

Jeremy Campbell's heavy-weight Crossbred barrow, weighing in at 240 pounds, was named Grand Champion of the 1999 show. He is a Friona exhibitor. Robbie Jan Barrett of Friona took Reserve Grand Champion honors with her 212 pound Duroc barrow that had earlier been named Breed Champion.

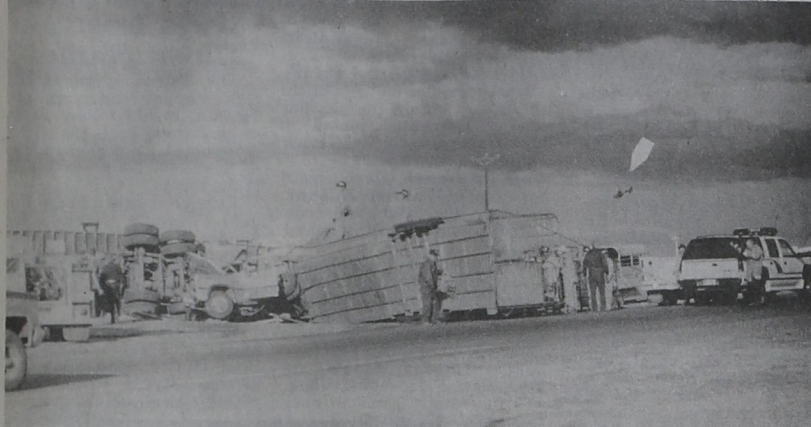

The tryout schedule is as follows: third and fourth graders, 9-10 a.m.; fifth and sixth graders, 10-11 a.m.

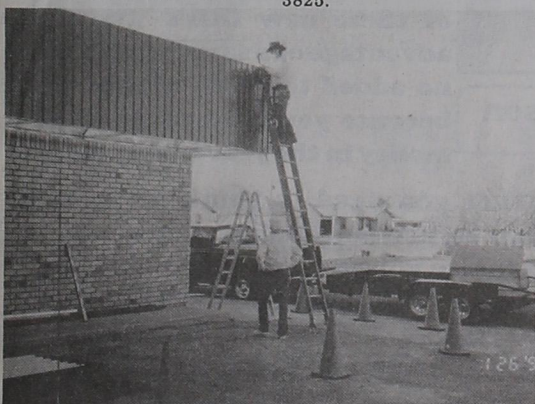

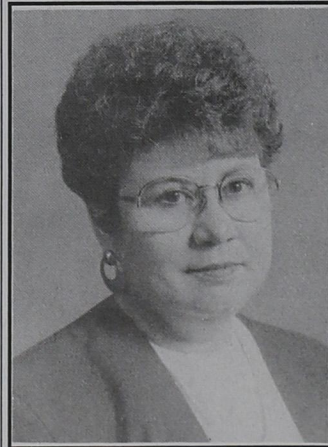

The ladies of the church will assist in the burning of the note on the church's parsonage. The church is now entirely debt free.

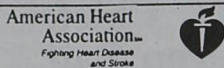

## Ex Friona Resident Is Buried In Iowa

Funeral services for Vera Taylor Irwin, 90, of New Virginia, Iowa, were held Saturday, January 16, 1999, with Pastor Jim Patrick of Indianola, Iowa, and Rev. Dale Reinsner of New Virginia officiating.

Mrs. Irwin passed away Wednesday, January 13, 1999. She was born September 24, 1908, on a farm belonging to her grandfather, George W. Taylor.

Around 1910, her parents, Fern and George Chester Taylor and brother Paul moved to Friona, where they were engaged in cattle raising and farming. Her brother George "C" Taylor and sister Betty Anne were born at Friona.

those 435 rowdy representatives.

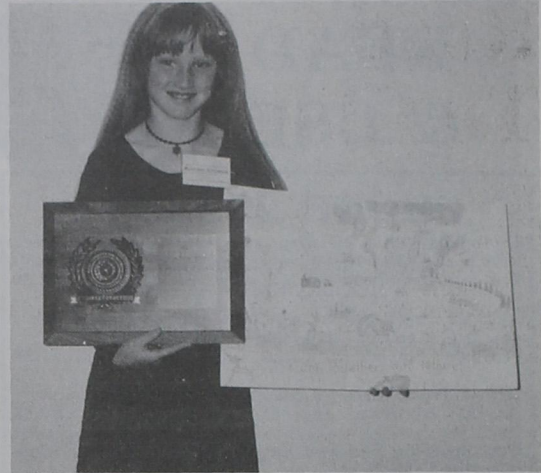
