PETROLEUM HIGHWAY BOOSTERS HERETUES.

SPONSORED BY MARFA ROTARY

C. Of C. To Appoint Director To Represent Marfa In The Organization.

A meeting of Petroleum Highway representatives, headed by Claude C. Wild, president of the Petroleum Highway Association, with headquarters in San Angelo, convened here Tuesday, April 3, sponsored by the Rotary Club of this place. Wild, principal speaker, brought out the important points in the road project. He stated that the oil and mining trend of development in its southwesterly course from Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Presidio, Texas, has made it necessary, for economic reasons, to build a highway between these two points, and that the road when completed, will be known as the Petroleum Highway, each town along the way recognizing its local responsibility and fostering the road's development. Wild spoke of the beauty and splendor of the Davis Mountains, the Wonderful climatic conditions of this section, the necessity for the exploiting of these facts, and the great advantage of the highway in bringing tourists this way, to what he termed, the last frontier in America towards which the course of Empire is rapidly moving. He stated that the highway was first planned to extend from Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Presidio, Texas, but since the meeting at Alpine, Monday, it had been merged into an international highway, to extend from Tulsa to Chihuahua City, Mexico, brought about by request of Mexican officials present, representing the State of Chihuahua, that the extension be made, who also promised that their government would begin building the Mexican end of the road at once, with two-hundred soldiers ordered out by the commanding general of the army.

An economic tie and spirit of good will now existing between the United States and the Mexican Republic, and with the Big Bend as a gateway into Mexico, the Davis Mountain area is intensely interested in the Petroleum

MARFA HI SCHOOL HAS INTERESTING HISTORY

FIRST SCHOOL INSTITUTED IN 1885

School Has Had Steady Growth During Forty-Three Years Of Existence.

All the facts that are needed to make a complete history of the Marfa Public School have not been gathered as yet, but enough have been secured to show a remarkable growth and to prove that the people of Marfa have always been interested in the education of their children.

Those Who Have Headed The School.

The first public school in Marfa was organized and taught by Miss Barnhart in 1885. Miss Barnhart was followed by Mr. B. F. Adams, who later became county judge of Presidio County. Other early teachers in the order of their work were: Mr. J. H. Taft, Mr. Addison Clark, Jr., and Mrs. C. C. Thomas.

The founder of the Marfa High School was Mr. H. B. Griffin, who served as superintendent from 1900 to 1912. During Mr. Griffin's first year there were three teachers in the school, Mr. Griffin, Mrs. Laura Wilcox, and Miss Hyde. The men who have followed Mr. Griffin were: Mr. J. D. Jowers, 1912 to 1914; Mr. W. J. B. Buttrill, 1914 to 1917; Mr. J. E. Gregg, 1917-1918; Mr. J. E. Conner, 1918 to 1923; Mr. J. E. Gregg, 1923 to 1928.

Buildings.

In 1885 Miss Barnhart taught in a single room adobe building which stands today near the present Mexican School building, and is owned by Sam Hensley. The adobes were made and placed in the wall of this building at a cost of \$30.00 per thousand.

The first brick building was erected on the site of the present building in the late eighties, or early nineties. It was a two-story building having four rooms on the first floor and two rooms and the auditorium on the second floor. This building complete with all desks and equipment was \$6,000.00.

The school continued to grow, and in 1910 the north and south wings were added. These additions contained six

CALL MEETING IN REGARDS TO BOLLWORM

MEETING SCHEDULED FOR TODAY

Propose To Organize Farmer's And Business Men's Organization.

A meeting of farmers and business men interested in the cotton industry

in the pink boll worm infested area of the Big Bend and other sections, was called for this place, Saturday, April 7, by J. C. Fuller, president of the Chamber of Commerce. The purpose of the meeting was to organize a permanent farmer's and business men's association in this territory to cope with the pink boll worm and other problems confronting them; whose concerted efforts will be effective, and whose technically equipped representatives, appointed by them from time to time, will efficiently serve them. In view of the recent convention held in Tennessee, and the fact that the Federal Horticultural Board is exerting all its influence to destroy crops and declare a non-cotton zone in practically all the Counties in which live specimens of the pink boll worm are found; in view of the fact that this section won through the decision of the State Pink Boll Worm Commission and now, it appears, is about to lose, it was deemed necessary to call a meeting and organize a permanent association, and if possible, save the cotton situation for this section. According to farmers and other authorities, the cotton leaf worm, and corn ear worm have done much more damage to the cotton industry of Presidio County than the pink boll worm; that the pink boll worm is the least destructive of any pest the Valley has ever had, not comparing with the destructiveness of the boll worm, leaf worm and grasshopper. On land in Presidio County where farmers are not making at least one bale of cotton per acre, the cause is due to uneven land where it cannot be properly watered, or to improper cultivation, and not to the pink boll worm. It is the belief of those in a position to know, that if all farms in Presidio County were abso-

W. M. DAVIS ANNOUNCES FOR THE OFFICE OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY OF THE 83rd JUDICIAL DISTRICT

W. M. Davis attorney of the firm of Davis and Womack of McCamey, Texas and for the past two years county attorney of Upton County announces for the office of District Attorney of the 83rd Judicial District, and in announcing makes it plain that he will if elected, prosecute the offenders against the law with all the vigor that he possesses.

Mr. Davis lives in a typical oil field town and county with all the attendant violations of the law commonly known in oil field towns such as the running of gambling houses, bootlegging joints, houses of ill repute, and since being in Upton County for a period of better than two years, he states that there has been but one individual sent to the penitentiary for bootlegging, or violation of the prohibition law; one for the offense of robbery; none for the running and operating of gambling houses; none for the offense of murder, of which there has been a great number, and in that connection says that some five or six weeks ago, W. F. Brake shot and killed Roger F. McKay, at night, and through the window of McKay's place of business, and that McKay died without ever knowing who his assassin was; this man Brake who is charged and wanted in Indiana on various felony charges plead guilty to the offense of having killed McKay, and the writer is really informed before he entered his plea of guilty, that he had an agreement and understanding with the prosecution, that if he would plead guilty that he was not to receive more than an eight year sentence; the evidence was sufficient to warrant the death penalty in this case and yet, he was given a term of only six years; this in itself is an outrage to the public and is only an invitation to others who might see fit to commit a like crime, believing and knowing that they would escape the pains and penalties imposed by the law, which is the only safe guard our citizens have; and in fact to make a short story of this matter Mr. Davis says that the outcome of the thing is and was a travesty on justice; that he knows of no law whereby there is an open season for the purpose of taking life of human beings, and when summed up renders the life of human beings the cheapest commodity in this country.

In making his announcement Mr. Davis says that he is withdrawing from the race of county attorney and that if elected, when the time is necessary, and the facts warrant it, he will ask for the current to be turned on; believing that he is serving the best interest of his constituency in making the race for District Attorney he is willing to make the sacrifice. 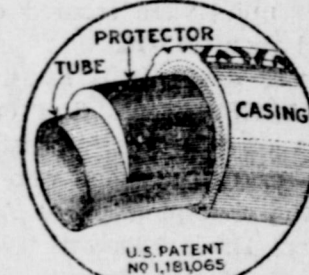

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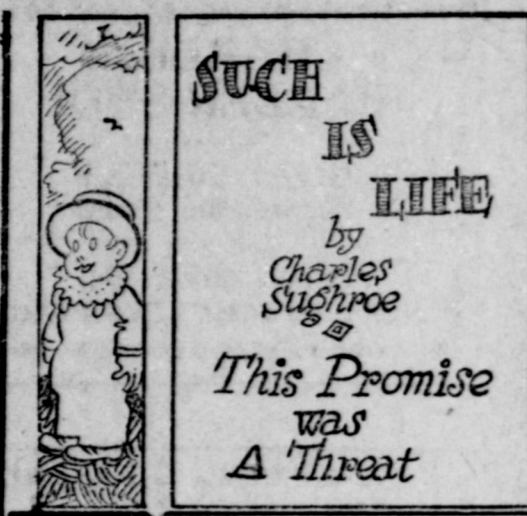

lately level, and given proper cultivation, that more than a bale per acre would be the average throughout the entire county. That a non-cotton zone in Presidio County will not be effective, has been shown by the fact that in 1918-19, a non-cotton zone was placed on this area, and in 1920, when the ban was removed, the pink boll worms returned. A non-cotton zone will mean bankruptcy to many as it will destroy land values, make worthless cotton gins and oil mills, throw thousands out of employment, offer no other crops as a substitute for cotton as railroads are too far removed from this section for other crops to prove remunerative while compensation to growers will be doubtful and to the allied interest, nothing.

KLEINMAN TRACT IS TO BE SOLD

W. H. Colquitt of Marfa and W. G. Hellier of San Angelo were in Presidio this week caring for some business matters in regard to the opening of the new Kleinman townsite addition to Presidio. W. L. Rider of Marfa has just recently completed the survey of the tract and reports that this site will be one of the most ideally situated that he has yet seen.

Three hundred lots are included in the new addition and the main street fronts on Bridge street. It is expected that these lots will be put on the market immediately.—Border Times.

MARFA HIGH SCHOOL HAS INTERESTING HISTORY

class rooms, and were erected at a cost of \$15,000.00 which was paid by voting bonds for the purpose. Another addition to the original building was made in 1917 at a cost of \$9,000.00, and was built without voting any bonds as the school fund at the time was sufficient to take care of the cost. Mr. T. C. Mitchell, Mr. Roberts, and Mrs. J. F. Tigner were the trustees when the north and south wings were added to the building. Mr. T. C. Mitchell, Mr. J. F. Tigner, and Mr. J. C. Bean were trustees when the second addition was made.

In 1924 the people of Marfa voted to erect a new school building, and a bond issue of \$75,000.00 was voted for the purpose. The building was constructed during 1925, and is modern in every particular. The structure is of concrete reinforced with steel, and the walls are supported with reinforced beams, and are filled with hollow tile and brick. The lighting, heating, ventilation, and arrangement of the rooms and corridors meet all standards set by the leading school architects of the country. At the time of the erection of the new building the school board was composed of Mr. J. W. Howell, Mr. C. T. Mitchell, and H. O. Metcalfe.

Building Up The High School.

As already related, Mr. H. B. Griffin organized the first high school in Marfa. During this early time nothing was known of affiliation, but a few years later the University of Texas undertook to inspect the work of various high schools and if their work met a certain standard the graduates of such schools, were admitted to the University without examinations. This fact soon became known over the state and school patrons began to demand that their schools be affiliated in order that their children might enjoy this privilege.

At the time this was being advocated in Marfa, Mr. T. C. Mitchell, Mr. W. G. Young, and Mr. J. F. Tigner composed the school board. In the spring of 1914 Mr. Mitchell went to Fort Worth to get a man who would be able to secure affiliation for the Marfa High School. This man is well remembered in Marfa today, Mr. W. J. B. Buttrill. Mr. Buttrill was a member of the faculty of Polytechnic College, Fort Worth, before coming to Marfa as superintendent of schools.

On the way to Marfa Mr. Buttrill stopped at Austin and talked with Mr. Tom Fletcher and Dr. J. L. Henderson who were in charge of affiliation and came to Marfa with his plans made. After school had been in session for four months Mr. Buttrill remarked one day, "If I should be asked if the work we are doing was up to the standard required for affiliation I would have to say that it is not." Mr. Buttrill then

PATROLEUM HIGHWAY BOOSTERS HERE TUESDAY

Highway transportation project; then too, the people of this section realize that without good highways the Big Bend Davis Mountain country will remain, to a great extent, isolated, and its great opportunities will remain practically unknown. The people of Marfa and Presidio County are eager to pull together in true community spirit in securing an ideal highway, such as the Petroleum Highway will be. The San Angelo delegation attending the meeting were: Claude C. Wild, president of the Petroleum Highway Association and Board of City Development; J. E. Young, of the J. E. Young Bonded Warehouse Company; H. G. Wendland of Wendland Sheet Metal Wares; Millard Cope, staff correspondent of San Angelo Evening Standard and San Angelo Morning Times. The Mexican delegation were: Capt. Gustave Bass Parra, Lieutenants Manuel Salgado and Alfonso Asunsolo, Jose Rodriguez La Vaca, Band Director. Alpine and Presidio were well represented. The highway delegation left Tuesday afternoon, for Presidio where they will present the road proposition. At a meeting of the C. of C. directors to be held soon a Petroleum highway director from Marfa will be appointed.

wrote Dr. Henderson that Marfa would not apply for affiliation until the work had been brought to a higher standard.

During the school year 1915-16 Mr. Buttrill decided that the work was worthy of affiliation and materials were sent to the University of Texas. Dr. Shurter, the organizer of the University Interscholastic League, visited the school as the supervisor. Before the close of the school year a letter came from the University saying that all the credits had been granted. These credits were three units in English, taught by Miss Watson; two and one half units in mathematics, taught by Mr. Buttrill; two units in Spanish, taught by Miss Josephine Broadbent; three and one half units in history, taught by J. E. Gregg; and one unit in physics, taught by J. E. Gregg. Thus a total of twelve units were secured during the school year 1915-16.

It was during this same year that the Marfa students first entered the events of the Interscholastic League. Some of the athletes who helped to win the championship at Alpine were Clement Davis, Ellsworth Share, Lloyd Mitchell, Morton Barnett, and George Morgan.

This same year of 1916-17 saw the first high school publication printed in Marfa. It was a monthly magazine called "The High School Buzz."

Mr. Buttrill's last year here saw two more units of affiliation secured. This was during 1916-17, and a half unit was secured in solid geometry, taught by Mr. Buttrill; another unit in Spanish, taught by Elizabeth Thrasher; and a half unit in civics, taught by Mr. Gregg. This brought the total number of units to fourteen.

During the next year, 1917-18, Mr. Gregg was in charge of the school and two more units were secured. One unit was secured in general science, taught by Jesse Jones; and additional half unit in algebra, taught by Vernon Hightower; and an additional half unit in American history, taught by Jesse Jones.

Mr. J. E. Conner was the superintendent from 1918 to 1923, and Mr. C. T. Mitchell, J. W. Howell, and H. O. Metcalfe were the board members. During this time two new departments were added to the school. The commercial department added in 1919, and the domestic science department which was begun in 1922. Mr. Conner also reorganized the high school library and placed it in a separate room in charge of a librarian, Miss Katherin Mitchell. The Shorthorn, a semi-monthly school paper was started 1918-19 in the place of the monthly magazine, the High School Buzz. The school was also placed on the Southern list of affiliated school during 1921-22.

During 1918-19 no new units were asked, but in 1919-20 the new commercial department received one unit in bookkeeping, taught by Mrs. Clay Mitchell. During 1920-21 one and one-half credits were received: one in stenography and typewriting, taught by Miss McKie; and a half in economics, taught by J. E. Gregg. The unit in English History was dropped, however, and the total number of units in 1921 was 17½.

In 1921-22 the commercial department added 1½ units to the school's affiliation. One unit in stenography and typewriting, taught by Miss Elbertine Williams; and a half unit in commercial arithmetic, taught by Miss Williams. This brought the total to 19, and in 1922-23 four additional units were received. The home economics department received two, taught by Miss Selby Moore; one in public speaking, taught by Miss McElroy; and one in biology, taught by Mr. Hudson. Thus Mr. Conner and his teachers had added eight units, but had dropped one and

the total was 23 at the close of his term. The other improvements during his term have already been related. In 1923-24 J. E. Gregg became superintendent and during the year two additional units were added; one in chemistry, taught by Mr. McKenzie; and one in home economics, taught by Miss Moore. Also Mr. Conner submitted all the Spanish work to the state department and secured three units in affiliation for three years of work, instead of three units for four years of work as had been the case previously to this. This brought the total to 25

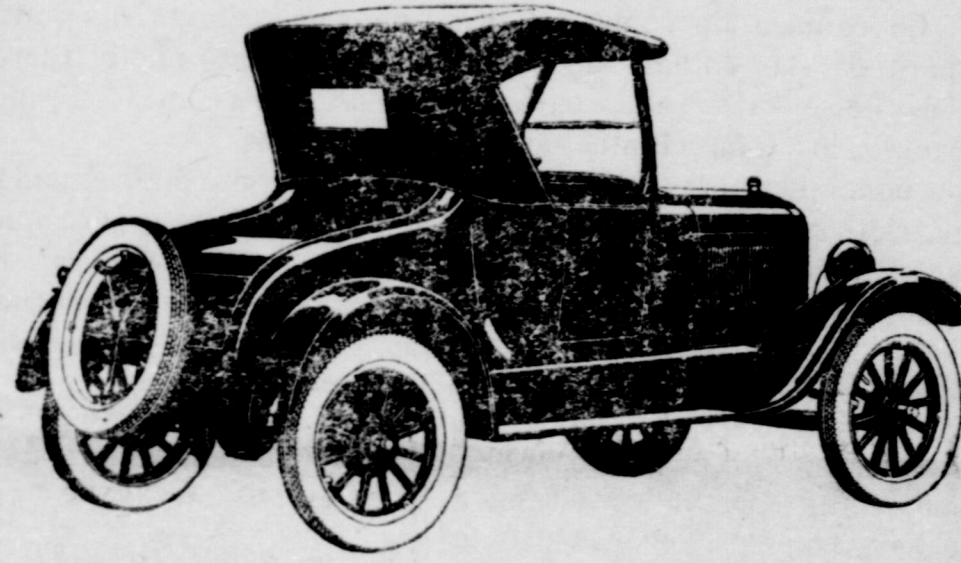

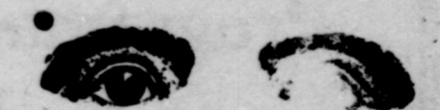

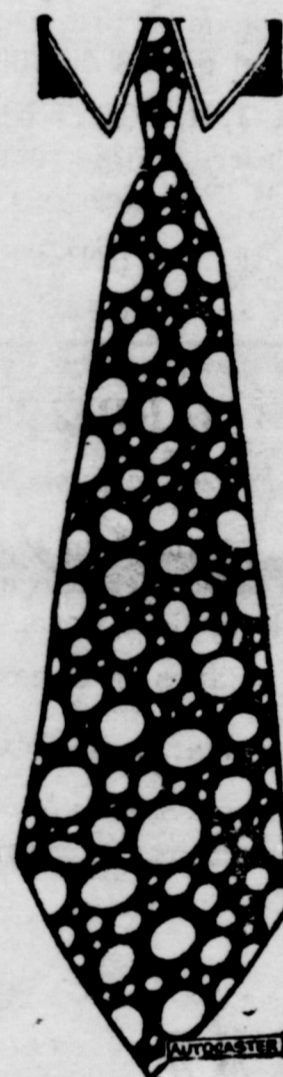
