blood cholesterol level over 268 .
The CDC researchers suggest that even less-than-rigorous
exercise, as long as it is performed regularly, may also be somewhat

Another health myth which has been around for a long time is that
low blood pressure can be just as bad for you as high blood pressure. Wrong! Hypotension, as
low bood pressure is known, is not considered a disease and cannot be the cause of weakness, headaches or fatigue. Some people maintain a lood pressure of $90 / 60$ for all of their life without showing any ill
effects. In fact, such a blood pressure level appears to go along with good health and long life.
