**THE EDUCATIONAL** process has changed dramatically in the last few years. This was the gist of a report by longtime Friona Superintendent Tom Jarboe to the Friona Lions Club this week.

The school has begun to provide much, much more than just "Reading, Writing and Arithmetic," as was the case years ago.

Today, the school also is asked to provide such things as information on drugs, alcohol, and the newest threat to society, AIDS.

Jarboe said he felt that the breakup of the traditional home situation was the reason that the school is being called on more and more to provide such additional information, which previously might have been given at home.

Although the controversial House Bill 72 has required our schools to do a lot of things which have been costly, and some things which were deemed unnecessary to schools in our size community, it has produced some positive results, the longtime school administrator says.

He points out that instruction has improved tremendously in the past few years, and that many things are being done in the classrooms which have improved the teaching-learning situation. All you have to do is visit your school to find this out, Jarboe says.

He said that prior to House Bill 72, extra-curricular activities, such as athletics, were being over-emphasized, to the detriment of classwork. This is one instance in which HB 72 has produced positive results.

Jarboe said that the AIDS situation is the scariest thing that school districts in our area have ever faced. And with the number of cases of AIDS reported in the U.S. doubling with each passing year, Jarboe quoted Dr. Arnold Isaacson as saying that unless something radical happens, the nation's population won't be able to cope with the AIDS problem from a psychological situation, much less physical.

"We can't make the same mistake in dealing with AIDS as we did with the drug problem in the 1960s. With drugs, we tried to use 'scare tactics,' and this just didn't work," Jarboe said.

However, it was pointed out that at this point, and the U.S. Surgeon General agrees, that the only thing that can be done to fight the AIDS epidemic is educating the public as to how the virus is spread, and as to its consequences.

Alluding to the fact that today's youth are more active in sex, Jarboe said that during the past three years, there had been 23 pregnancies in high school and nine in junior high, that the school knew of.

Although no case of AIDS has shown up locally, Jarboe warns that it is inevitable that one will, perhaps in the near future, as the disease creeps closer and closer to the rural areas. Amarillo and Lubbock were said to have had 12-14 confirmed cases of AIDS at the present time, so our time is coming.

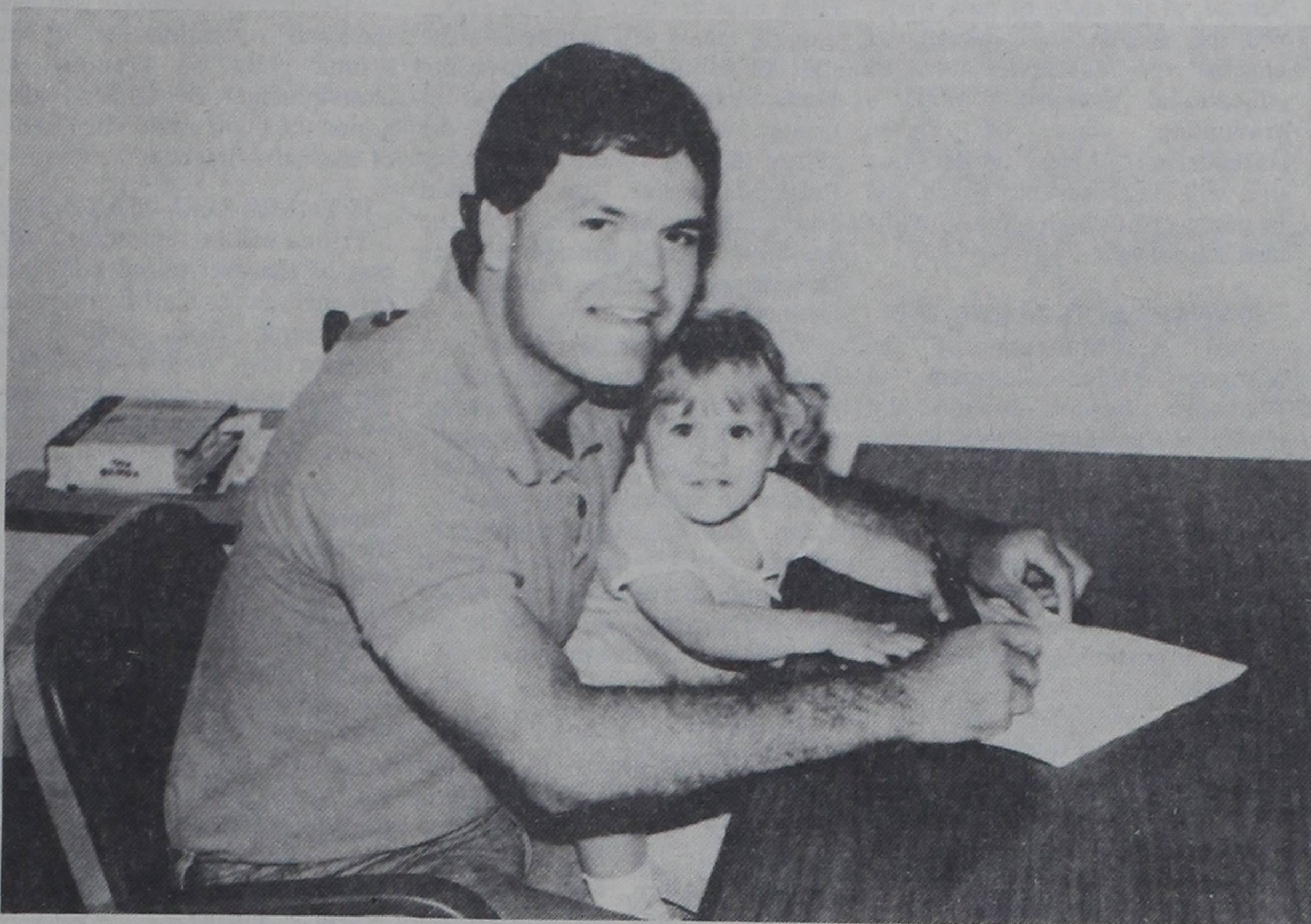
Locally, a task force has been established to discuss what the school's course of action should be in regard to AIDS, and how it should be presented to the school children.

Jarboe said that while he could not speak for the task force, he felt that the local school's approach would be a conservative one. "You won't see condom machines in the hallways of Friona High School," he remarked.

## FHS Students Qualify For State UIL Meet

Friona High School will be represented at the UIL state literary meet in Austin May 5-6 by five students in three events.

FHS qualified both of its debate teams, plus an individual in headline writing, at the Region I meet April 23 in Odessa.

In team debate, Friona High School's first team of Lon Outland and Jeff Procter, and second team,

sophomores Kelley Cash and Krista Renner, claimed first and second in regional, after both battled to the final round.

After three preliminary rounds of debate, both of the FHS teams were 3-0 in the regional competition. They then went head-to-head with teams from Dalhart, representing District 1-AAA, and both scored wins.

This will be a "first" for Friona High School, to send two groups of debaters to the state meet.

In headline writing, Jana Renner captured second place, to also qualify for the Austin competition. Miss Renner also placed fifth in news writing.

At the state meet, each region has three entrants in each event, or a total of 12 competing on the state level.

Other participants from FHS in the regional meet were Keith Hancock in Lincoln-Douglas debate; Mark Madrid and Nancy Parson in poetry interpretation; J'mai Cash in literary criticism; and Bena Bronniman in editorial writing.

Joy Morton is faculty coach for the speech events.

## School, City Election Is May 7

The city and school election will be held on Saturday, May 7 at the Friona Fire Station, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Absentee voting for the election goes through Tuesday, May 3 at both the City Hall and Superintendent's office.

Four names will be on the City Ballot, seeking two of the city council seats. In addition to incumbents June Rhodes and Bobby Jordan, names of Ralph Shirley and Joe Mejia will be on the ballot. Clarence Monroe is unopposed in his bid for re-election as mayor.

In the school race, just the three incumbents are running. They are Jerry Cass, Becky Riethmayer and Butch Preston.

## Mejia Is Candidate For City Council

Jose M. (Joe) Mejia has announced his candidacy for the City Council, subject to the action of voters on Saturday, May 7.

A resident of Friona since November of 1972, Mejia graduated from Friona High School in 1973, and attended Amarillo College four and one-half years taking night classes while working for Friona State Bank.

He is presently completing a three-year program at Madison University, Madison, Wisconsin and will graduate this year with his degree in banking.

He is a vice president of Friona State Bank, for whom he has worked since 1974.

In community work, Mejia is president of the Friona Noon Lions Club, and is financial administrator for St. Teresa's Catholic Church.

He is a member of the library board, having served three years, is a chamber director and served as zone chairman for Lions' District 2T-1.

"I feel that I am qualified, capable and I am willing to serve the residents of Friona if elected," Mejia said.

He operates a personal accounting business from his home-Joe's Bookkeeping & Tax Service, so feels he is familiar with taxes and statements.

He is married (wife Sonia) and is the father of two children.

Mejia says he enjoys people. "Friona has been good to me, and this would be a way of saying 'Thank You' to the community. If elected, I will respond to everyone. My main concern is that people turn out to vote, and I just want them to know that I am there if they want me to serve," Mejia says. (Pd. Pol. Adv.)

Montoya was named All-Lone Star Conference punter three years while playing for the Eastern New Mexico Greyhounds. He averaged 39 yards per kick as a sophomore; 41.5 yards per kick as a junior and 44.1 yards as a senior.

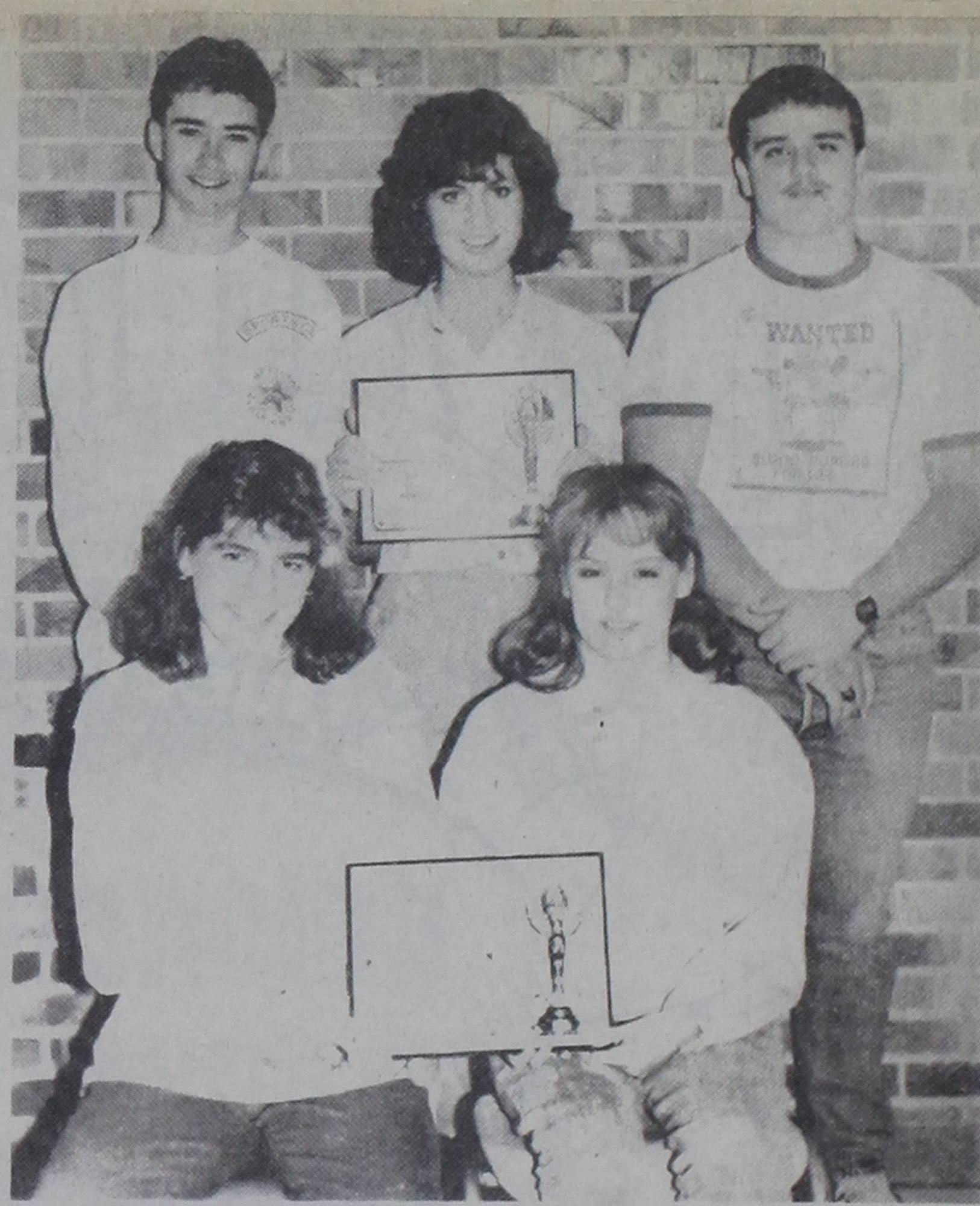
He began his college career at the University of Texas at El Paso, recruited by UTEP assistant coach Donny Carthel, Friona native, as a placekicker. When Carthel took

the head coaching job at ENMU, Montoya was again recruited, this time as a punter.

"Now I have the chance to be a Chief once again," said Montoya Thursday, after he signed the contract sent to him by Kansas City.

On Thursday night in Portales, the Friona native was presented the "Greatest Greyhound" award at a student life awards banquet at ENMU. Montoya is married to the former Melanie Blackwell of Friona.

# FHS Track Team Busy In Regional Competition

The Friona High School Chieftains will be entered in the Region 1-AAA track and field meet this weekend in Odessa in seven events.

Coach Steve Williams said he was optimistic about the team's chances of qualifying for the state meet.

"Our marks are right in there with the leaders. Of course you have to have a little luck, which is something that didn't happen a year ago. Plus, most of our performers are seniors, and they have competed against many of the kids at regional before. They know they have a shot at going to state, and I think they'll be all right," Williams said.

Among those with good chances are Daniel Echols in the 400-meter dash, Stephen Thornton in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles, the mile relay team, Cody Burney in the high jump and Daniel Padilla in the discus. Based on the marks of those entering the regional event, these are the five events that give Friona its best chance of coming away with a state qualifier.

Echols was third in the 400-meter dash with a time of 50.1, his best time of the season, and Burney cleared 6-4 in the high jump, good for third place.

Thornton ran a 39.5 in the hurdles race and placed fourth, and the mile relay team clocked a 3:28 in their race, good for fourth.

Padilla threw the discus 137-0, placing fifth, after spraining his ankle while warming up, and Albert Trevino cleared 12-0 in the pole vault, also good for fifth

place.

Michelle Echols was second in the 400-meter dash in the girls' division.

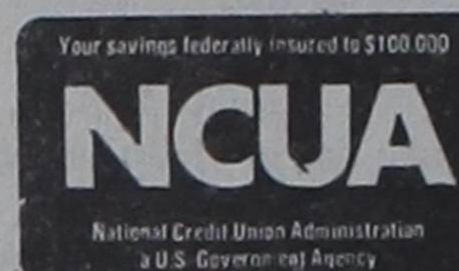
After the team, the Homemakers held their business meeting. Future projects discussed included the Book Fair, the grade school track meet and election of officers.

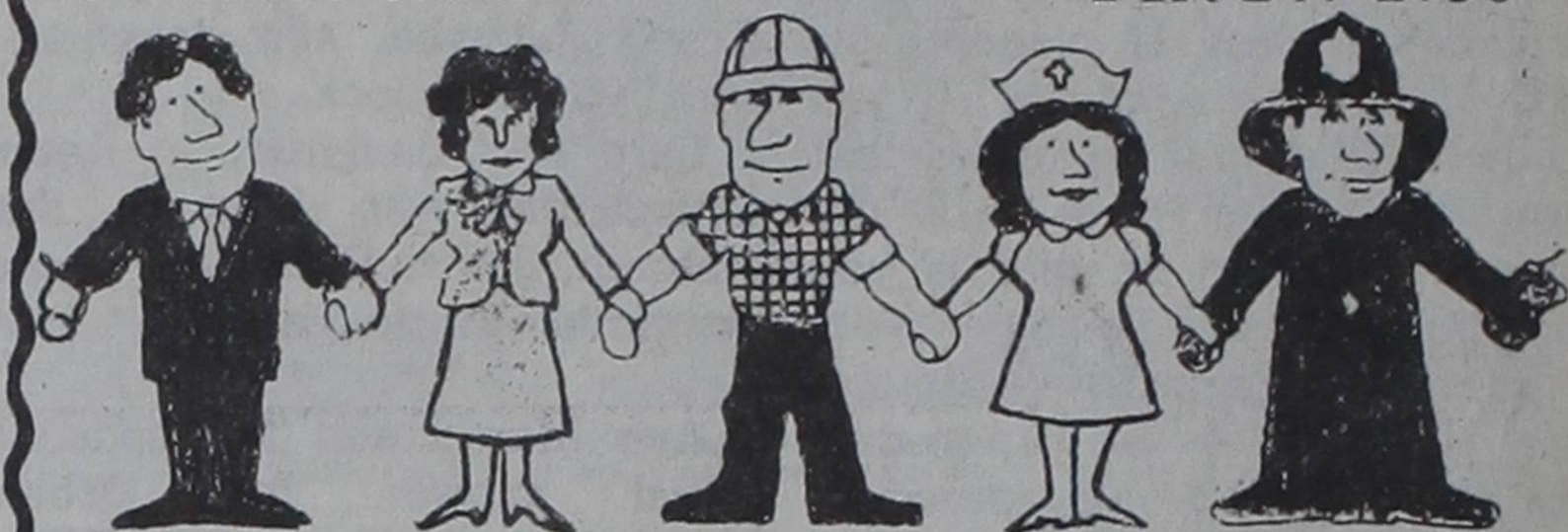

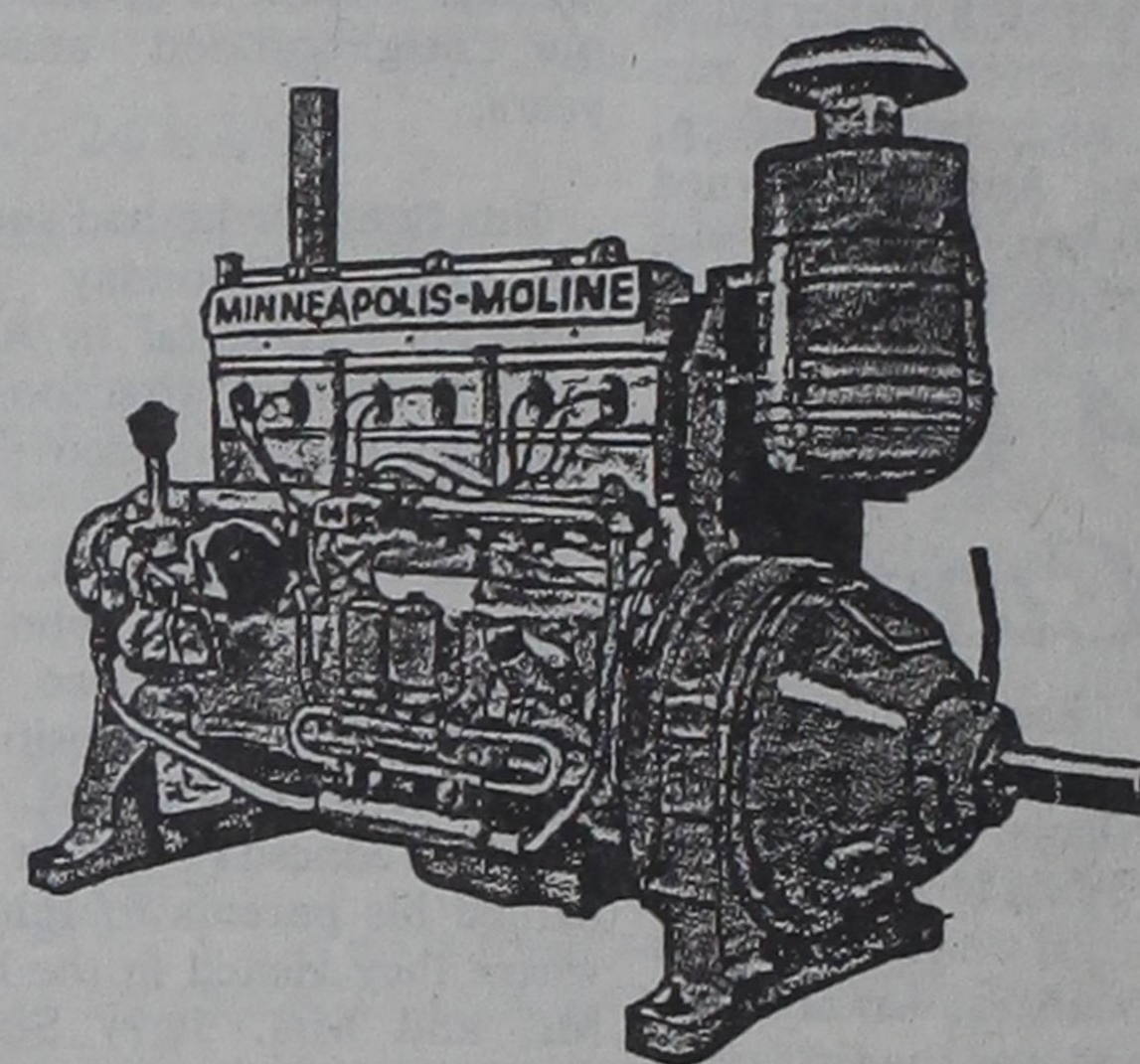
