something radical happens, the nation's population won't be able

from a psychological situation much less physical. mistake in dealing with AIDS as we did with the drug problem in
the 1960 s. With drugs, we tried to the 1960 s. With drugs, we tried to
use 'scare tactics,' and this just didn't work,"' Jarboe said.
However, it was pointed out that at this point, and the U.S. Surgeon General agrees, that the only thing that can be done to fight the AIDS
epidemic is educating the public as to how the virus is spread, and as to its consequences.
Alluding to the fact that today's youth are more active in sex,
Jarboe said that during the past three years, there had been 23 pregnancies in high school and nine in junior high, that the school
knew of.
Although no case of AIDS has shown up locally, Jarboe warns
that it is inevitable that one will, perhaps in the near future, as the disease creeps closer and closer to the rural. areas. Amarillo and
Lubbock were said to have had 12Lubbock were said to have had 12 -
14 confirmed cases of AIDS at the 14 confirmed cases of AIDS at the
present time, so our time is coming.
Locally, a task force has been
established to discuss what established to discuss what the
school's course of action should be in regard to AIDS, and how it should be presented to the school children.
