Dear Bill, Last week in the Mayor of Friona's letter to the editor we fire calls made aware that $50 \%$ of Volunteer Firemen were outside the city limits of Friona. There wasn't any mention made of the doliars and cents required to department.

## In the City of Friona's budget

 hearing held September 12, 1988, it was revealed that the city was planning on allowing the firedepartment fiscal year 1988/89 (Oct. ' 88 thru Sept. '89). This figure is somewhat low as the city council voted to
include the volunteer firemen with worker's compensation (which they previously did not have). This is to give the firemen some income if a fireman was seriously injured in performing this duty. The cost of this insurance is approximately $\$ 3,470.00$ annually.
Additionally, the city provides firemen with water sewer and trash at an estimated value of $\$ 1,200.00$ per month. This adds an additional $\$ 14,400.00$ a year to maintain the fire department. The
city's monetary obligation now city's monetary stands at $\$ 35,370.00$.

department, we must buy a new fire truck in 1989. The City of Friona doesn't have the funds available to absorb a $\$ 70,000.00$
expenditure. We took expenditure. We took our problem
before the Parmer Commissioner's Court to see if they couldn't assume more of the financial burden of keeping up all the county's fire departments. We were amiably received and
graciously given an extra $\$ 500.00$ per year for each department in the county.

practice can often be dangerous. Vitamin C is needed by the body for collagen formation, healing of wounds and resistance to infection. In addition, the
absorption of iron is enhanced absorption of iron is enhanced
when vitamin C and iron are eaten when vitamin C and iron are eaten
together. However, Shelley Fillipp, outpatient dietitian at Methodist Hospital, warns against the
"megadosing" of vitamin C. "megadosing" of vitamin $C$.
For example, pregnant women For example, pregnant women
who take high doses may give birth who take high doses may give birth
to babies with unusually high vitamin C requirements. Unborn babies often adapt to the mother' high blood levels of vitamin C
causing their own bodies to destroy causing their own bodies to destro
the vitamin. This creates a need for larger amounts of the vitamin after birth.
Ms. Fillipp noted that other possible side effects of megadosing include gastrointestinal problems
such as nausea and diarrhea, high such as nausea and diarrhea, high
uric acid content in the urine and uric acid content in the urine and
interference with the white blood cells' activity in destroying bacteria.
