acres returned to the smiling Texas sun, studded with cities like jewels—Plainview, Lubbock, Tulla, Memphis, Floydada and the others.

And Amarillo herself, with three great railroads, and a million dollar smelter plant about to begin operations, has progressed in a material way perhaps farther than any city in West Texas. They opened a \$300,000 municipal auditorium, dedicated to the soldiers of the Panhandle as a memorial. Tuesday. A magnificent new high school building and a rich library have been recently opened. Foundations for a \$200,000 hospital are being poured. There are miles and miles of paved streets, and more miles of brilliantly lit White Way. Concrete roads lead out in every direction to the country for miles. If these things be any criterion, then is the West Texas spirit most ably exemplified in Amarillo.

TEXAS TECH.

No matter how much noise a town makes, or how much outside endorsement it receives, it will have no chance to land the Texas Technological college unless it can "deliver the goods" when the locating committee comes round. In other words, it must show the committee that its claim for the college is based on merit, and must convince the locators that its proposition is the best of many that will be presented.

To our way of thinking, the principal considerations that will guide the committee in its choice of a location will be accessibility to the state as a whole, population of contiguous territory, water supply, ability of the town to care for a large student body and attractiveness of site. There will be other considerations, of course, including the indefinable but all-important educational atmosphere, but these are the main ones.

It is highly improbable that the college will go above the caprock, for the very good reason that that territory, splendid as it is, is too far away from the balance of the state. Texas Tech, as the governor has declared, must serve the entire state.—Abilene Reporter.

CHINA'S HENRY.

GOLD FOUND IN MISSOURI.

Many Leases Sell Near Exter Result of Discovery.

EXTER, Mo. —A number of leases in southeastern Missouri have been sold in the last few weeks as the result of the discovery of gold, silver, copper and zinc on the farm of G. S. Johnson, near here.

About a year ago, while drilling a well, a golden colored rock about ten feet thick, and said to have been rich in copper, was found by workmen. Beneath this rock, it was stated, another of a greyish hue was found. Mineralogists examined it and found it to contain silver. Johnson pulverized the rock and from sixteen ounces of ore extracted about an ounce of metal.

Gold also has been found in the well, but, according to Johnson, in insufficient quantities to send it away to be smelted. It is planned, however, to construct a large blast furnace and smelter here.

Johnson has leased the property to a company, and a shaft has been lowered to a depth of 70 feet. Assays of the ore are being made by the Government Bureau of Mines.

A Colonial Calendar.

In days when calendars were unknown there was a way known in which the day of any fixed anniversary could be found—not so easily perhaps as turning up the leaves of a calendar, but just as accurate. Here it is as told by a San Angelo woman, whose mother was taught it by her great grandfather who was born in 1804:

"The only fact which had to be known, was the day of the week on which the New Year came. A key sentence of twelve words was used in which one word stood for each of the twelve months. This key sentence was, 'At Dover Dwelt George Brown Esq. Good Christopher Finch and David Friar'.

"Take for instance the Fourth of July—as July is the seventh month, take the first letter of the corresponding seventh word of the key sentence which is G. G is also the seventh letter of the alphabet, so begin with Monday, the known New Year Day and count seven days which will be Sunday, and this will be the first day of July and the Fourth of July will be the following Wednesday.

"Another illustration—To find the day of the week of a birthday falling on the seventh of May. As May is the fifth month, take the first letter of the corresponding fifth word of the key sentence which is B. B is also the second letter of the alphabet, so begin with Monday, the known New Year Day, and count two days which will be Tuesday, and this will be found to be the first day of May and the birthday will be the following Monday."

FOSTER'S WEATHER BUREAU.

WASHINGTON, D. C. April 5.—The important seasonal crop weather changes from winter to summer are not regular; Bigelow gave them as April 20. For this year the principal storms of the month come during the week centering on April 7 and I expect the crop weather change to begin to take effect as those storms clear away. Last 12 days of the month will average more quiet than usual. No such crop season has occurred within twenty years as this just ahead, but a little further back I have records of a number that were similar. Of recent months the Atlantic States have been hogging the moisture. That was because the moisture came from the Caribbean sea south of the Atlantic States. The old belief was that one extreme follows another; but it does not always work that way. I am sure that North America will not produce as much grain in 1923 as it did in 1922 and that one very important crop will fall very far short. Many well informed business men believe Europe is bankrupt. But that will not hurt North America. Some people over there have plenty of money, and millions of them are coming to this continent.

Section 1: North of 47, between 90 and Rockies' crest; normal temperatures near April 8, highest near 11 and 17, lowest 14; average warmer than usual; most severe storms of the month and most moisture of the month during week centering on 8.

Section 2: North of 47, east of 90; normal temperatures near April 10, highest 13 and 19, lowest 16; most severe storms of the month and most rains of the month during week centering on 10.

Section 3: Between 39 and 47 and between 90 and Rockies' crest; highest temperatures near April 4 and 14, lowest 11 and 16; average a little above normal; most severe storms of the month and most rain of the month during the week centering on April 7.

Section 4: East of 90, between latitude 39 and 47; lowest temperatures near April 6 and 12, highest 9 and 14; average near normal; most severe storms of the month and most rain of the month during the week centering on April 7.

Section 5: South of 39, between 90 and Rockies' crest; highest temperatures near April 8 and 13, lowest 10 and 16; average warmer than usual; very warm near 13; most severe storms of the month and most rain of the month during week centering on April 13.

Section 6: South of 39, east of 90; highest temperatures near April
